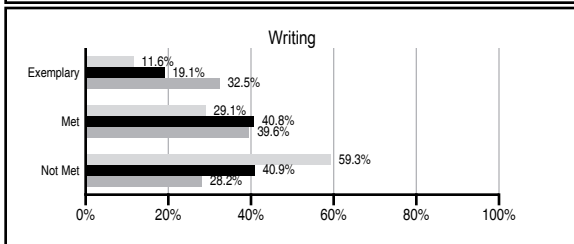

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

During the 2012-2013 school year, Bishopville Primary was recognized by Lee County's Department of Curriculum and Instruction with the 4-A Continuous Improvement Award. Data was compiled, monitored and utilized to determine next steps. Data walls were used to chart student growth. Data notebooks were maintained on every student and data sheets were submitted weekly to the administration to show weekly student mastery, attendance and discipline updates.

Classroom environments were synergized by research-based best practices designed to yield high student mastery. SMART Boards were purchased and mounted in all classrooms to support technology infusion across content areas.

The four year old and five year old kindergartens used the Success for All's full-day curriculum. Seventy-five percent of the 4-year old and 5-year old kindergarten students assessed had mastered the curriculum standards for their grade level. In 2012-2013, students participating in Success for All school-wide grew from 68% reading on grade level to 72%. Read 180 and System 44 were other RTI initiatives offered at Bishopville Primary School. During the year, we continued to utilize the NWEA's Measure of Academic Progress as a pre and post test to measure growth from fall to spring. We also administered TE 21 Case Benchmarks each quarter. The benchmark results aided in developing the curriculum for the Saturday School offered in preparation for PASS. The results were promising and guided quarterly instructional review. The Save the Children program continued for a third year. In the 2012-2013 school year, the Healthy Choices component was recognized as a model program and our school earned a monetary award as an Honorable Mention Healthy School.

Our teachers were trained in Success for All, Teacher Advancement Program components, CPI-Effective Teacher Commands, Mandatory Reporting, Technology Infusion, Teacher University, Common Core Implementation, Student-Led Conferencing, Professionalism and Data Use that Differentiates and Drives Practice. Bishopville Primary expanded our Parent University by starting a Grandparents University. Students were very active in the arts in 2012-2013. In December, the second grade presented a full holiday musical with a bully prevention theme. Bishopville Primary's Relay for Life Team remained a forerunner in the district's initiative to raise funds to support Cancer Research.
