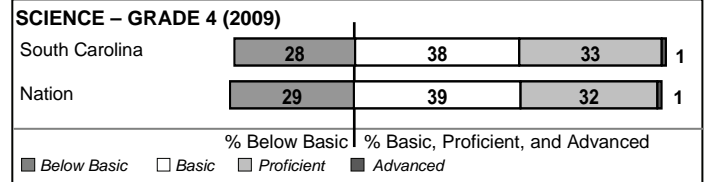
PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

We begin each school day by stating our school motto, "Live Well, Lead Responsibly, and Learn by Always Doing Our Best," as a reminder that we are committed to providing a safe, positive and challenging learning environment in which children can reach their highest potential. Our dedicated staff, supportive parents, active Parent Teacher Association, School Improvement Council and many business partners work closely together to make learning enjoyable for each of our approximately 600 students.

Rocky Creek received the state's Palmetto Gold and Silver awards in recognition of our students' academic success. We achieved an "Excellent" on both the Absolute and Growth ratings on the state-generated 2012 annual school report.

Rocky Creek received a HealthierUS School Challenge Bronze Level Incentive Award, an Honorable Mention Award from Kroger Earning Plus Learning Program, and a Recognized ASCA Model Program (RAMP) designation from the American School Counselor Association.

Our staff attained noteworthy accomplishments. Kim Denney was named the school's Teacher of the Year and Susie Poindexter was named Support Staff of the Year. Lisa Fisher received a district Learning Commons grant. Heather Coker was selected to attend the Science P.L.U.S. Institute at Roper Mountain Science Center, and D.D. Manning received a Mid-Carolina Electric Cooperative Bright Ideas Grant.

Our students received many awards and honors; they participated in the Tri-District Arts Consortium and had artwork featured at the S.C. State Fair. One of our students was a state finalist in a poetry contest sponsored by the National Career Development Association.

Students and staff participated in many exemplary service-learning projects. They raised money for Relay For Life and Jump Rope For Heart. They donated items to children's shelters and family support organizations. We hosted two recycling opportunities for the Lexington community, collected six tons of electronic items and shredded almost 2,000 pounds of paper.

A challenge continues to be to improve our students' knowledge of the South Carolina Science Standards as measured by the Palmetto Assessment of State Standards. This year, teachers concentrated on their science instruction and incorporated common assessments to measure the standards. They taught STEM units to enhance students' understanding of science, technology, engineering and mathematics.

At Rocky Creek Elementary, we look forward to the 2013-2014 school year with an anticipation of greater student achievement and community involvement.
