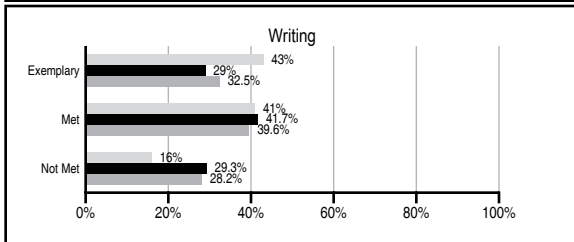

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Fairforest Elementary School's mission is to prepare our students for lifelong learning through a challenging curriculum in a safe, respectful environment. In the 2012 – 2013 school year we had much to celebrate. We were exceptionally proud of the efforts of our students on last year's PASS examinations. Our 5th graders posted the highest scores in Math, Social Studies, and Writing within our district. Additionally, we had a number of students who were recognized for their artistic abilities in state and local contests.

Fairforest Elementary School serves a diverse student body. It is the diversity of our population shapes the instructional practices in our classrooms. Our teachers utilize an integrated approach while teaching science and social studies. With such an approach, each subject is equally important in providing students the information necessary to see the interconnectedness of subjects while allowing students to more easily grasp complex concepts. To better meet the needs of students in their classrooms, our staff earned \$14,950 in grants over the course of the year in order to implement creative new approaches within their classrooms. . During this coming year, our teachers will continue to receive professional development on how to implement additional Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics (STEAM) concepts within the curriculum.

Our faculty and staff realize that the high levels of achievement can only be achieved with the help and support of our community. In 2012 – 2013 our school benefited from a number of community organizations. In particular, the presence of volunteers and support from Michelin North America and Mt. Zion Baptist Church has allowed our students to receive additional support which benefited them both personally as well as academically which would not have been possible without the support of these two entities.

Our school staff is thankful for the continued support and encouragement provided by the Spartanburg School District Six Board of Trustees, the District Administration, and the community at large. We know that by working together fantastic things can and do happen for our students! We are excited about the opportunities that await our students during the 2013 – 2014 school year!
