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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Barnwell High School stands on the premise that hard work, dedication, and consistency promotes excellence. We are pleased to report the annual report card as we continue to make progress toward state and national educational goals.

The 2012-2013 academic school year was a reflection of Barnwell High School's mission of preparing all students to become independent lifelong learners and productive members of society. We are certainly proud that Barnwell High was awarded the prestigious Palmetto Gold Award for Improvement in General Performance.

We are proud to announce that the graduating class of 2013 received a total of \$2,965,472.00 in scholarship offers. Eight students were named Palmetto Fellows, thirty-six students received four-year life scholarships, thirty-six students received two-year life scholarships, fifty-one students were awarded South Carolina Lottery Tuition money, and ten students were awarded the HOPE scholarship. Fifty-one graduates earned enhanced diplomas.

Barnwell High School continues the tradition in extracurricular and co-curricular activities, which are integral parts of a well-rounded experience. The following teams were named Region Champions: girls' soccer and girls' softball. Four boys' soccer players were named all Region players, one tennis player was named all Region, one volleyball player was named All State, one baseball player was named All State, four baseball players were named All Region, and two cross country players were named All Region. Two students were selected to participate in the Edisto Conference Honor Band. The Scarlet Knights Marching Band placed first in Class AA at Garden Class in Orangeburg, South Carolina.

Our parent and student organizations continue to be a strength. The School Improvement Council continues to be a committed group of parents, students, teachers, and community members that work hard to assist in the improvement of our school. All of our booster organizations worked diligently to produce an environment where students are connected to the community and dedicated to academic excellence. The Warhorse Club and Band Booster Club continue to provide avenues for parental involvement and support for our programs.

It is our belief that we will continue to improve as long as we work together with our students as our focus. We are continuing to yield the type of program results that will position us closer to state and national benchmarks. We look forward to the upcoming school year and meeting the challenges the new school year will bring. It is with confidence that we commit to serving our students and community in providing the best educational opportunities possible.

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
