Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

2012-2013 was a year of much success in academics, athletics, and activities at Lewisville High School. The South Carolina State Department of Education recognized Lewisville High School and United States History Teacher, Daniel Taylor, for exemplary performance on the End of Course Examination (EOCEP) in United States History by having him present to teachers across the state. Also, Senator Tim Scott visited Lewisville High School in recognition of the school's outstanding performance.

The school was one of only four high schools in the state to have made a grade of 100/A on the ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System and the South Carolina Department of Education designated Lewisville High School as a Palmetto Gold Recipient for 2012-2013 in General Performance. During 2012-2013, 91.1% of our students passed the End of Course Examination (EOCEP). The school continues to focus on preparing each student to graduate and to be able to continue post-secondary or career and technical education.

We continue to be proud of what our graduating seniors have accomplished. The 92 graduates of the class of 2013 receive \$2.9 million in scholarship opportunities. Six graduates met the requirements for Palmetto Fellows Scholarships and 22 received LIFE scholarships to attend a four-year college/university. 77% of our graduates completed career majors while attending Lewisville High School or the Chester County Career Center.

Approximately three-fourths of our students participated in programs such as Band, Colorguard, Chorus, Art, Athletics, Academic Challenge, Sporting Clays, and JROTC. We are very proud of the Lewisville High School Boys' Basketball Team who won the 1A State Championship title. Lewisville High School also competed in the South Carolina Sporting Clays program where our team again won first place in the 2013 public schools division. The Lewisville High School Lady Lions Softball team was also District Champions. 2012-2013 was a great year for student athletes at Lewisville High School.

We wish to recognize not only our student successes, but the hard work and commitment of all of our teachers and staff along with our parents and community members who work with us to make Lewisville High School the best small high school in the state of South Carolina.

ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
