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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

The 2012-2013 school year proved to be another highly successful one at Mauldin High School thanks to the dedication and collaboration of our students, staff, parents and community. Academics continued to be an area of excellence as Mauldin High was once again recognized by Newsweek magazine as one of the top public high schools in the nation. The class of 2013 earned scholarships totaling over \$17 million, twenty-seven students graduated with South Carolina Academic Honors, thirty-four students were named Palmetto Fellows and over eight hundred AP exams were taken by Mauldin High students. All four of these categories either equaled or surpassed our previous year's performance demonstrating the stellar work ethic of all involved. Our strong academic program is supported by an outstanding guidance and career development staff that meets with each student multiple times each year to evaluate graduation progress, academic standing, course requests and social issues. Extensions of our academic programs were successful this year as well as the Robotics team was once again recognized for its outstanding abilities and attention to safety. Our Teacher Cadets explored educational career opportunities and devoted many hours in assisting teachers throughout the district. Service Learning students provided thousands of hours to the betterment of our community as did students in academic clubs and JROTC that have service hour requirements. Furthermore, our student body raised over \$70,000 for Safe Harbor during our annual spirit week activities making it obvious that the charitable spirit is alive and well at Mauldin High. In athletics, the Girls Tennis Team brought home another state championship and our athletes won several individual state awards. Mauldin High was tenth out of forty-eight schools overall in the South Carolina Athletic Directors Cup and thirteen student athletes will go on to compete at the college level earning scholarships totaling more than \$765,000. Performing arts completed an extraordinary year placing three times the number of any other high school to region band selections. The Mauldin High School PTSA volunteers donated close to 60,000 hours of their personal time in a variety of tasks including Challenge Day, school store duties, testing, and faculty treats to name just a few. A new slogan, Motivation-Achievement-Values-Success, was developed this year by the staff to drive the vision and mission of Mauldin High School. Though challenges exist and there are still areas to improve, Mauldin High School remains dedicated to continued success and continuous improvement in all that we do.

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ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
