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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

The students, faculty, and staff of Chapman High School continue to reap great successes of hard work. Our school theme is "Whatever It Takes" and we are proud of our students as they continue to achieve accomplishments with excitement and pride.

During the 2012-2013 school year, the faculty and administration continued to focus on literacy, and transitioning to the Common Core State Standards. The Guidance Department continued its focus on academic advisement by developing Individual Graduation Plans to assist students with researching and organizing future college and career opportunities.

Through a concentrated effort to raise awareness and expectations for all areas of assessment, students and teachers worked hard in preparation for these tests and received a gold award for academic achievement. Our HSAP and EOC scores continue to rank as some of the best in the state. The Class of 2013 earned approximately \$4.3 million in scholarships to help further their education. The class had 56 seniors who were eligible for the 4-year Life scholarship and five Palmetto Fellow award winners.

Being a Red Carpet school, we pride ourselves on being family friendly and customer oriented. The faculty, staff, administration, and students participated in many community service projects, raised over \$10,000 for various charities, and collected over 7,000 cans of food for our community. Our website won the South Carolina Chapter of the National School Public Relation Excellence Award for the fourth consecutive year. Five students won awards at the FCCLA state meeting.

The Fine Arts Program and Athletic Programs at CHS continued its trend upward with increases in participation and success. This year the marching band, chorus, and orchestra received superior ratings. Our theater program performed five productions during their initial year. Five students were chosen to represent Chapman as members of the all state band and chorus. Our school won six region championships in athletics and five students were named region players of the year. Most notable is the fact that approximately sixty percent of our student body participated in extra-curricular activities.

The AFJROTC won the Distinguished Unit with Honor Award for the fifth consecutive year and continued its participation in community service oriented projects.

The 2012-2013 school year was unique in many ways. Our strong tradition of excellence remains intact. Moving forward in pursuit of even higher expectations is a top priority and we are confident in the future of the students who attend Chapman High School.

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
