REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Growth has been the key word for both our school and our community during the 2012-13 school year. Powersville High School added 228 students and became a 9th through 11th grade school. The growth in our school has been accompanied by a growth in our community with the addition of new businesses and new housing. The campus of Powersville High School is fast becoming a focal point for the continuing success of this community.

Although only in our second year, we have had some early success. The Powersville Patriot Marching Band won the 1A State Championship, and many of our varsity athletic teams qualified for post-season playoffs. Our students have taken advantage of leadership opportunities in our community through Junior Leadership Anderson, and one of our students was elected Governor at Palmetto Girls State. Overall, our students and teachers have continued to take advantage of the increased opportunities to be involved at our new school in a variety of classes, clubs, athletic teams, and artistic performances.

Our main goal throughout the past two years has been to uphold the expectation of academic excellence which is synonymous with Anderson School District One, and our test scores for this report card reveal that we have been able to achieve that goal. Our students perform as well as, and in some cases better than, students in Anderson One and across South Carolina.

With the help of our School Improvement Council (SIC), Powersville High School completed our Mission Statement last year. Input from students, parents, businesses and community members helped our faculty and administration create a clear vision for the future of our school. Powersville High School provides a safe, academically challenging environment where each student can learn from the past and prepare for the future. Safety has also taken center stage this year. Much of our time and many of our resources were dedicated to reviewing and improving our safety procedures. This process led us to install secure entry doors, a more secure visitor entry process, additional cameras, and more detailed policies and procedures for intruder circumstances. Overall, we have made a tremendous amount of improvement in our efforts to keep our students safe on campus.

We look forward to the 2013-14 school year as we will reach a student body of 730. We will add an additional 12 teachers and will continue to prepare for our first group of graduates. The challenges of the upcoming school year will be many, but we expect to face them with the same dedication and determination that has led to the success of Powersville High School's first two years.
