REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Blue Ridge High School serves a tightly knit community in the Northern part of Greenville County. Parents and businesses are highly supportive of the school's varied academic, athletic, fine arts, and extra-curricular offerings. The students, faculty, staff, parents, and community are proud of achieving Palmetto Gold again, as a result of significant increase in student achievement. Through more teacher collaboration, a focus on data analysis, involvement of community stakeholders, working with other high achieving schools, and creating opportunities for remediation and mastery, Blue Ridge High continues to increase student achievement.

Our Advanced Placement program has grown to include sixteen courses. Blue Ridge High is the only school in the district to offer four levels of four different foreign languages, and our school has extensive agricultural and technology courses. The graduating class was awarded over \$5 million in scholarship money and 73% of the graduates will attend college or enlist in the military this fall.

The Academic Team, FFA, FBLA, and JCL were successful in competitions at various levels this year. The National Thespian Society was newly formed at Blue Ridge. AFJROTC students participated in community service, charity events, and Cadet Leadership School. The band and chorus continued their award winning traditions at competitions on the local, regional, and state level. Student Council organized many student events and hosted an exceedingly successful Senior Day. SIC organized Ridge Fest, which highlights the school's organizations and clubs to the community. Several teachers received grants to enhance the school and facilitate learning in the classroom.

In the athletic realm, Blue Ridge High is proud of the students and coaches for the high levels of success in various programs. Several athletes from football, swim, girls' golf, boys' tennis, wrestling, baseball, and softball received state recognition for their excellence on and off the field. The boys' cross country team placed in the state competition. The football, cheerleading, volleyball, girls' golf, girls' basketball, baseball, softball, and boys' tennis teams qualified for state playoffs. Football, cheerleading, and boys' tennis won the region and several athletes received local recognition.

Blue Ridge High School will continue to make strides for student improvement through academics, athletics, and the arts. The students are the focal point of every decision. Our goal is that each student in the school will leave with a high school diploma and is prepared to successfully meet the challenges of the world.
