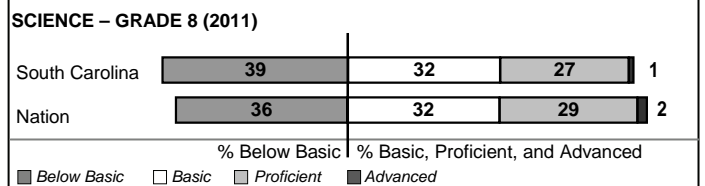
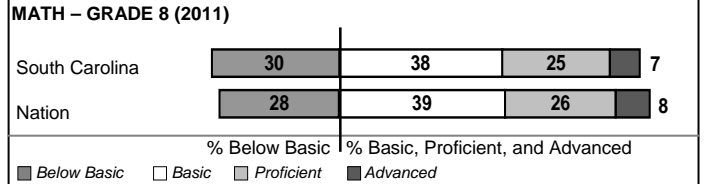

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Landrum High School continues to exemplify excellence in all areas of student life. This year, Landrum High School graduated one hundred and twenty students. These students earned over \$4,000,000.00 in college scholarships. Sixty percent of the senior class qualified for the competitive Life Scholarship. This class also had four students receive the Palmetto Fellow award and three seniors received the Palmetto Fellow award and three seniors qualified as a Teaching Fellow. Finally, two seniors received ROTC scholarships and one senior received an appointment to West Point United States Military Academy. Landrum's success on the athletic field continued this year. We had several teams that were region champions (girls cross country, boys basketball, and boys and girls track). Our girls cross country team were also state champions and their coach was named Coach of the Year. We had numerous students that were recognized as All-Region and/or All-state. Many of our senior athletes will go on to play at the collegiate level next year.

Landrum High School is proud of its tradition with the arts. Two band students and one orchestra student made All-State band. The orchestra had seven students receive a superior rating at the Solo and Ensemble Festival. We also added a drama class to our arts curriculum that presented four theatrical productions throughout the year for District One students and for the community. Our visual arts department received many awards as well such as the Milliken Art Award and the National Art Honor Society Award. Many works of art created by our students decorate the walls of Landrum High School as well as the walls of businesses in the Landrum community.

Our mission at Landrum High School is "Learning today...Leading Tomorrow." Our goal is to develop not only productive citizens that become lifelong learners but also to develop students into leaders of the community. We are proud of the fact our students contributed over 8,000 hours to our community through volunteer services. Our students also collected 7,800 cans during our districts' canned food drive.

Landrum has a distinguished faculty and staff. This year three of our teachers presented at a national conference and many others presented at state level conferences. This year we continued our focus on literacy initiatives, writing across the curriculum, and research. We will continue these initiatives and also focus on implementation of the Common Core State Standards during the upcoming school year.

We look forward to continuing our pursuit of excellence for the 2013-2014 school year.
