Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating

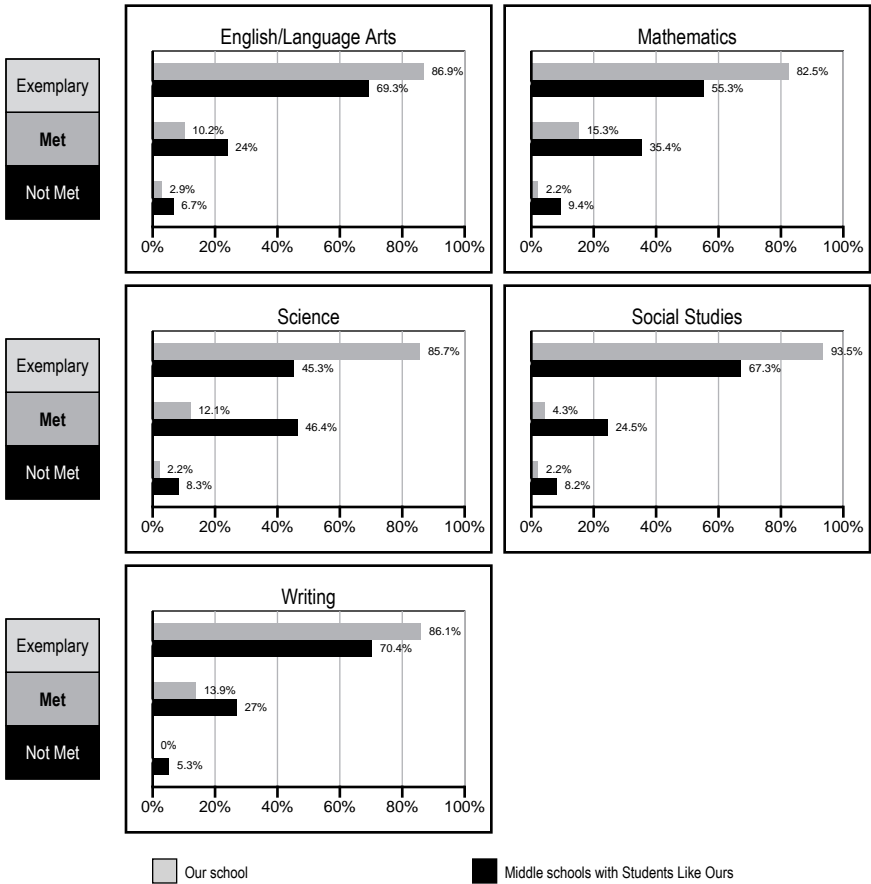

Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Buist Academy for Advanced Studies is a kindergarten through eighth grade academic magnet, International Baccalaureate World School. The mission of Buist Academy is to educate students in a challenging environment that emphasizes academic excellence and promotes respect for individual differences. Students acquire knowledge, skills and attributes necessary to take action in their local and global community. Buist Academy students become caring, internationally-minded, life-long learners.

The theme for last school year was "On the Move". With the final year complete in our temporary location, we are literally on the move as we move back to 103 Calhoun Street in beautiful downtown Charleston. Three years in a temporary location has been a challenge; however, faculty, students and parents have made the best of the situation to continue to provide challenging, engaging educational opportunities for students.

Students will begin the 2013-14 academic year in a beautiful state-of-the-art facility. The International Baccalaureate Programme is moving forward. The faculty includes three trainers who are called upon to conduct workshops. Teachers in the Primary Years Programme revised and created new Units of Inquiry. All parents from kindergarten through fifth grade were invited to their children's summative assessments throughout the year. All Buist students participated in an art walk to raise funds to build a kindergarten class in Honduras. In March, Buist celebrated its first successful family literacy night, including a used book sale to support victims of Super Storm Sandy.

The faculty, staff and administration used data to develop strategic plans for continued growth and improvement. Buist received an Excellent Absolute rating on the 2012 state report card for the elementary and middle grades. The Improvement rating for both was also rated Excellent. The Palmetto Gold Award was earned for continuing to make progress toward the state standards set for 2016. In addition, the school was recognized for the eleventh consecutive year by the South Carolina Education Oversight Committee for continuing to close the achievement gap in historically underachieving groups of students. Buist received overall weighted points of 100 in both elementary and middle grades and a grade conversion of an A for the 2012 - ESEA / Federal Accountability system.

Parent support and involvement remained high during the year, with hundreds of volunteer hours given to activities inside and outside classrooms. Parents had reading circles across the campus. They dove into the mud pit at Barrier Island. Parent mentors met with 5th grade Exhibition groups weekly and chaperoned field trips from Columbia, SC, to Washington, DC. The Parent Guild had a successful Fall Festival. The Foundation-Parent Guild held its first successful dinner dance in April at Memminger Auditorium. The proceeds help to support Buist Academy and the IB Programme.

Buist Academy is an amazing school. With the support of faculty, staff, parents and the community we will continue to excel academically and socially. We look forward to another great year of success and growth.

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
