Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating

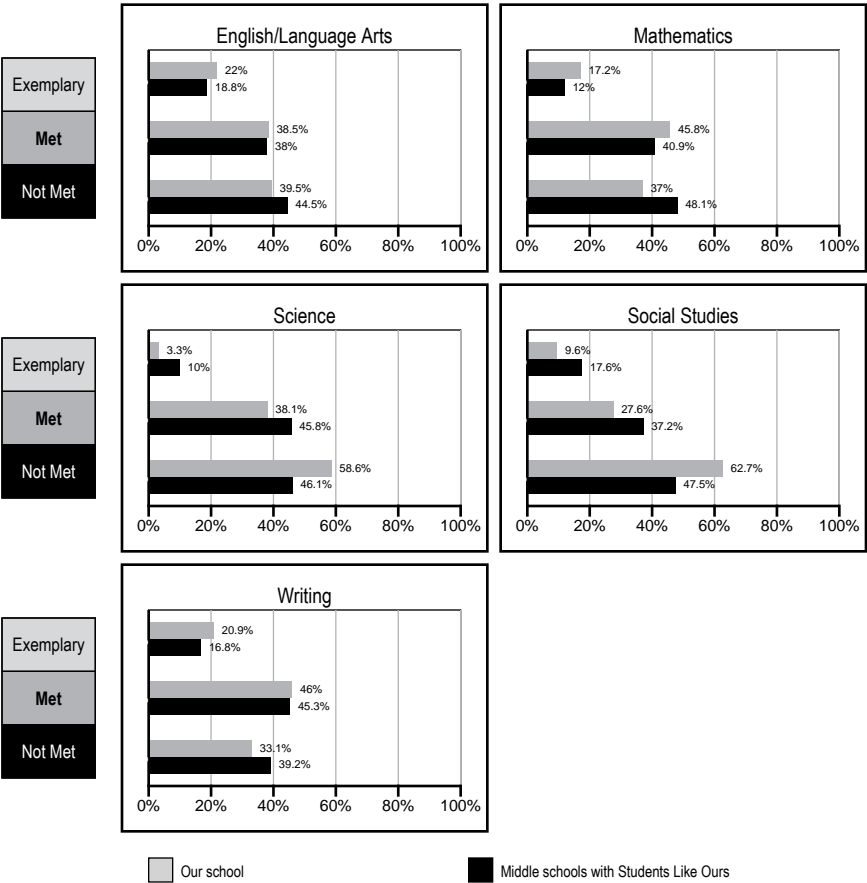

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Dillon Middle School was awarded a Federal School Improvement Grant over a three year period beginning in the 2010-2011 school year. Components of this grant included implementing a research-proven academic program in reading, providing parent involvement, offering student and teacher incentive programs for academic achievement and an emphasis on technology. Promethean boards, desktop computers and laptops were purchased for students and teachers to use with academic programs to increase student learning and improve academic achievement.

Dillon Middle School students are taught in the Success For All and Scholastic Expert 21 reading programs as part of the School Improvement Grant. Each student receives reading instruction at their appropriate reading level according to the Scholastic Reading Inventory (SRI) measure. Students were tested quarterly using SRI to monitor progress and to adjust reading instruction appropriately.

Dillon Middle School students taking Algebra 1 for high school credit had a 100% passing rate on the end of course exam with 17 of those students making a perfect score.

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ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
