Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating

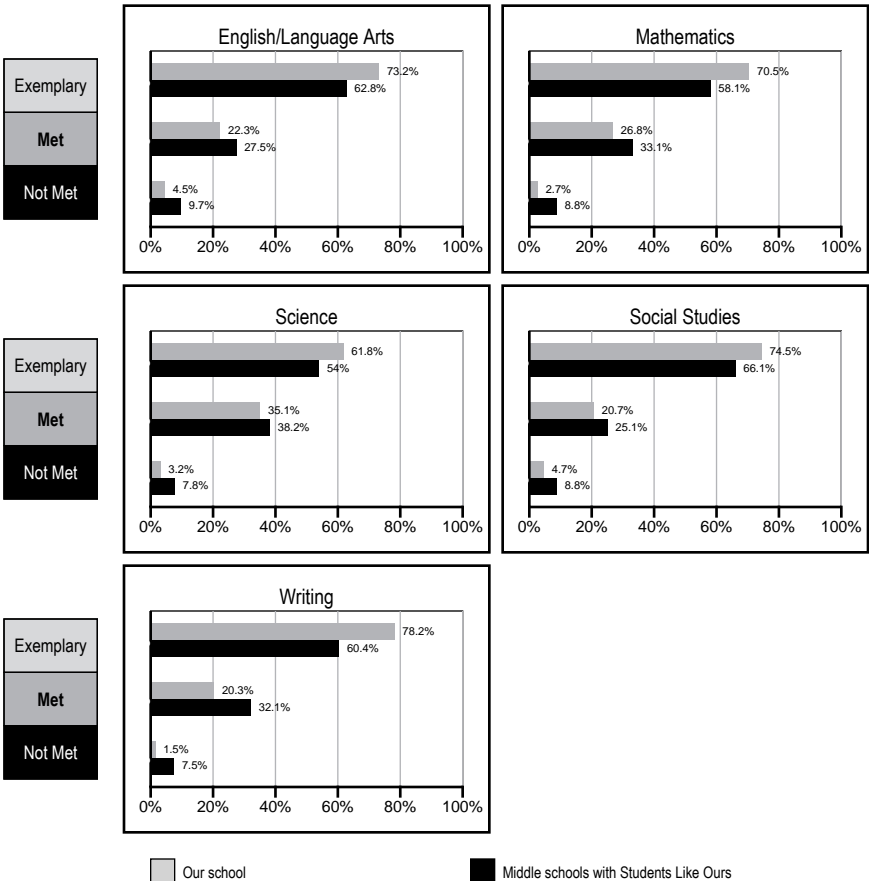

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND
SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Rollings Middle School of the Arts served 663 artistically gifted sixth through eighth grade students from Dorchester School District Two during 2012-2013. The staff consists of 38 certified faculty and 18 classified employees. Students spend equal amounts of time each day in four core academic courses and a core art course (band, dance, piano, strings, theatre arts, visual arts, or vocal music). Because a high proportion of students are also academically gifted, all of the teachers at RMSA are GATE-endorsed or in the process of completing GATE courses. Core academic teachers create innovative lessons which infuse the various art disciplines. These practices make learning relevant to our students and allow teachers to meet students' specific needs.

Our students continue to excel with the help of faculty members who focus on rigor, relevance, and relationships. RMSA received the Palmetto Gold Award because of overall student performance based upon the state report card absolute and improvement ratings of "Excellent." Additionally, receiving the Palmetto Gold Award for "Closing the Achievement Gap" recognizes our commitment to teaching each child to their fullest ability. The RMSA federal accountability score was a perfect 100.

Our students excelled in many academic competitions including QUEST, Math is Cool, Spelling Bee, Reflections, and Math Counts. Our sports teams also were highly competitive with the softball team winning the district championship. We have completed our first year implementation of "The Seven Habits of Highly Effective People" initiative. All students are paired with a staff member for leadership instruction and community improvement projects. The acquisition of these skills will serve our students in high school, college, the workplace, and beyond.

Rollings PTSA reached 100% membership again this school year and recorded more than 2200 volunteer hours. Parents, teachers, and students work together to make RMSA an excellent, family-friendly school with high expectations and quality results.

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ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
