**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**

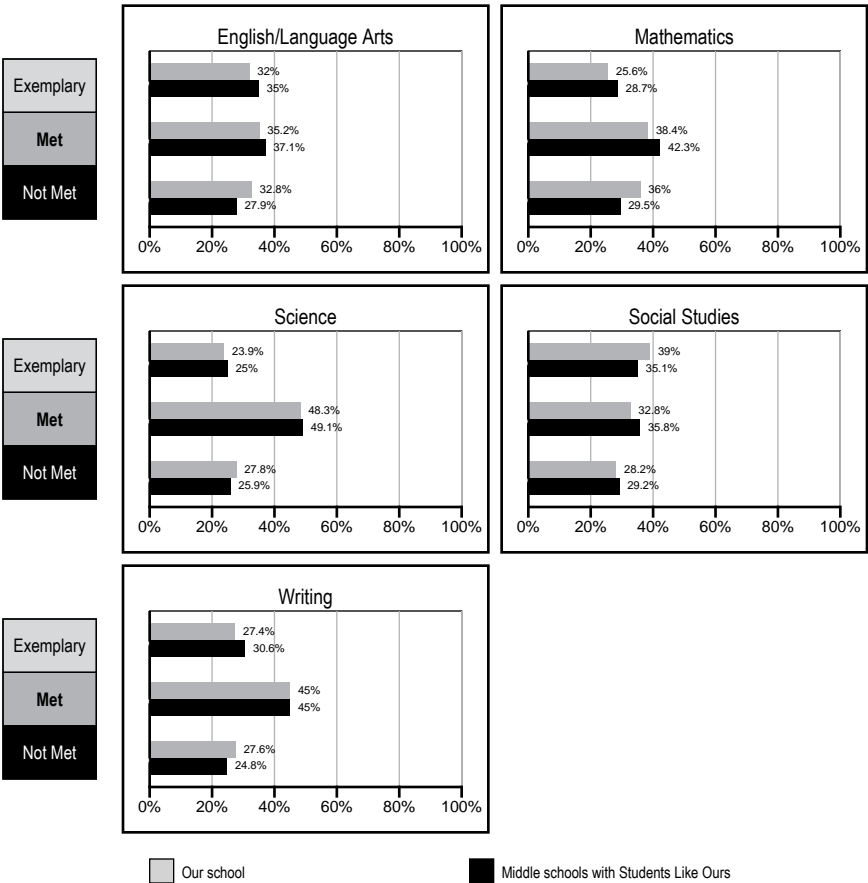

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## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Hillcrest Middle School is located at the intersection of Old Camden Highway and Highway 441 in Dalzell, South Carolina. The school serves a population of approximately 415 sixth, seventh and eighth grade students from Dalzell, Shaw Air Force Base, and surrounding communities. Our mission is believing, achieving, and succeeding through academics, citizenship, and service. In order to achieve our mission, our primary goal is to increase student achievement as measured by PASS, by maintaining a highly qualified workforce, increasing parental involvement, and creating a safe, secure, and healthy school environment.

With a rich tradition of excellence in academics, athletics, and arts, we want to help all students reach their full potential in the classroom and on the playing field. As we hold high expectations for student achievement and discipline, we also nurture our students and ensure they enjoy school. This is evident through quarterly incentives and awards day programs.

Continuing with the tradition of excellence, five students were named junior scholars, two students received perfect scores on PASS, twelve students were honored as Golden Apple Recipients, and ninety-two students received honor roll citations from the House of Representatives, and forty-seven students were enrolled in Algebra I and English I.

Teachers were provided opportunities to participate in departmental meetings, workshops, conferences, curriculum focus meetings, and district-level professional development to keep abreast of current trends. Teachers also participated in monthly Common Core Sessions.

In addition to academics, our students are constantly involved in service projects and giving back to the community. Students supported causes such as American Cancer Society, Pennies for Patients, local canned food drives, Breast Cancer Awareness, Catchall Senior Citizens Christmas Luncheon, and the American Heart Association.

We thank the PTA, parents, volunteers, Shaw Air Force Base, and the community for playing an integral part in the success of our school as we continue to exemplify excellence and educate students at the highest levels.

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
