Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating

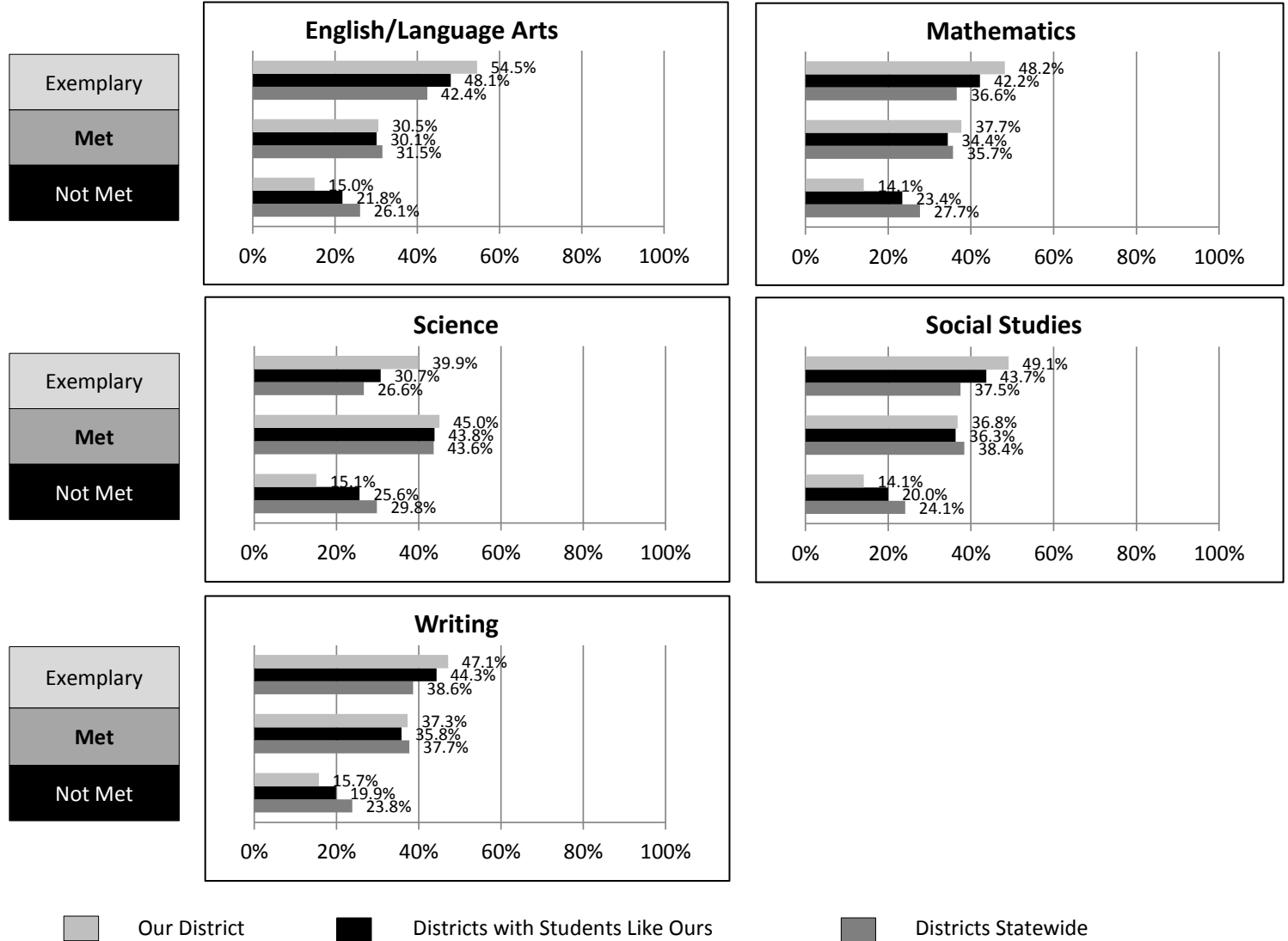

District Superintendent's Report

Anderson School District One has continued to maintain the district motto of "A Tradition of Excellence". 2013 – 2014 was another outstanding year for students, teachers, staff, and administrators. Anderson One once again received an Excellent report card rating from the state based on achievement gains. Twelve schools earned Excellent report cards and two earned Good. Anderson One schools received 10 Gold awards for general performance, one Gold for Closing the Achievement Gap, and three Silver awards for Closing the Achievement Gap from the SC Department of Education. Two schools are ineligible for awards. Program improvement is a critical part of our success. Professional Learning Communities at our schools have created a culture of collaboration, more data analysis, reflection and action. Changes taking place in curriculum and instruction have resulted in a balanced literacy program for K – 5, interventions for K – 12 that are having a positive impact on student achievement and additional professional development for teachers. Anderson School District One is embarking on a digital innovation program with the themes of transform, discover, and excel where all students in grades three through twelve will be provided iPads as a critical part of the learning process as we prepare students for the future. All ELA and Math teachers continue to be trained on State Standards with implementation taking place for grade K – 2 in the 2013 – 2014 school year. The district continues to focus on school safety and security with a state of the art camera system, access doors at all schools, additional resource officers, and training for all teachers and staff in the ALICE program. The district is very fortunate to have many competent, caring, and capable professional and support staff members that enthusiastically promote instructional services that continually improve the learning environment and culture of the district. The School Board of Trustees, Superintendent, and District Administration along with all school employees and students worked closely together to strive for continuous improvement in academics, fine arts, athletics, and in all other extra-curricular programs. The mission statement for Anderson School District One states our commitment to providing an academically challenging, community-driven, and diverse educational experience based on the individual needs of each student.
