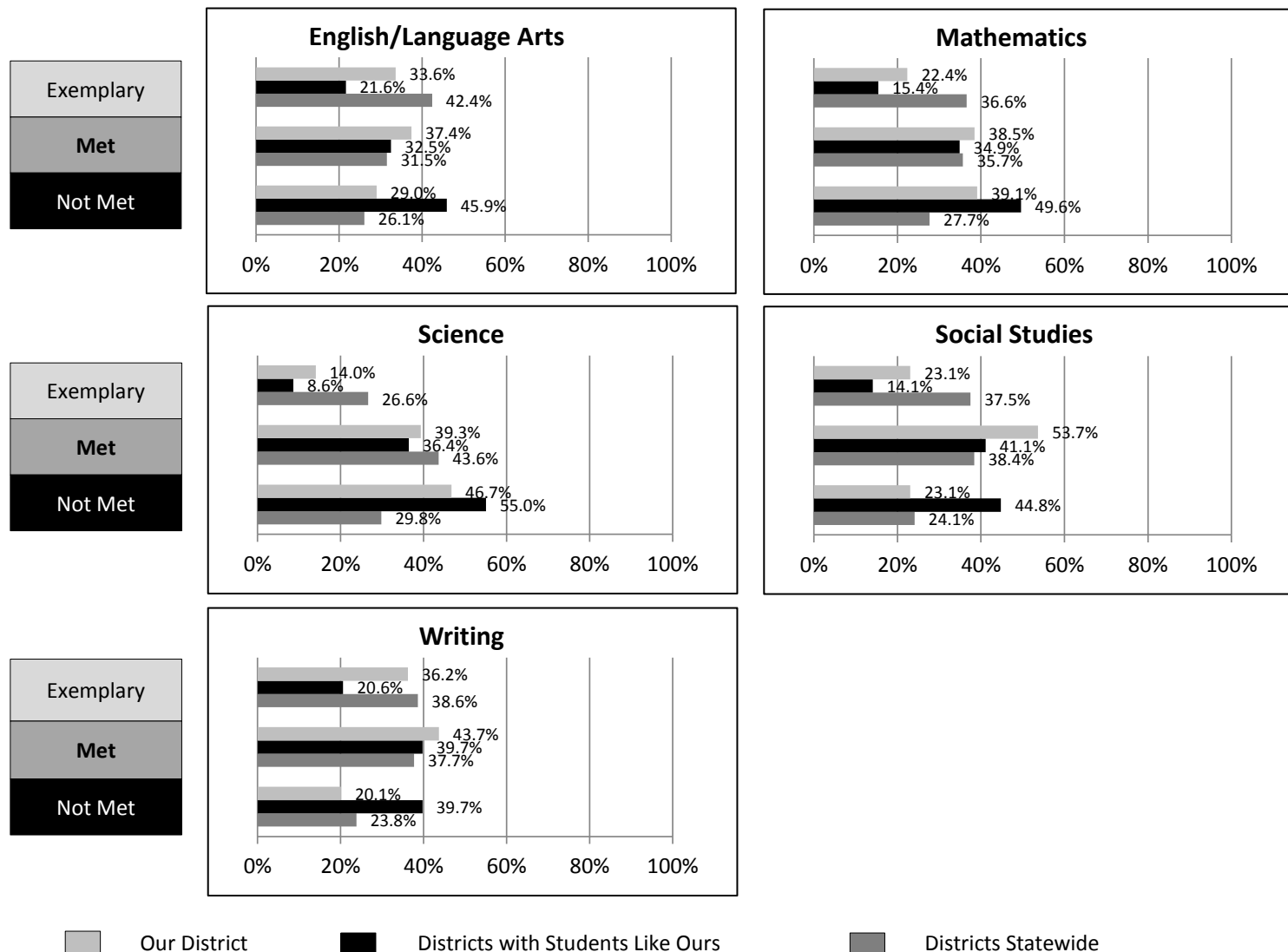

District Superintendent's Report

The 2013-2014 school year was an exciting time for Clarendon School District One. We established a New Tech Program at Scott's Branch High School. This program was made possible through a partnership with the Riley Institute at Furman University. We are one of two districts in the State with a New Tech Program. The students and teachers are enjoying Project Based Learning as an integral part of New Tech. We also celebrated our academic accomplishments from the 2012-2013 school year. Three schools: Scott's Branch High School, St. Paul Elementary School and Summerton Early Childhood Center earned a federal grade of "A." Scott's Branch Middle School and the district earned a federal grade of "B." Our graduation rate has exceeded the State's average for the past several years. We are continuing our quest to build capacity at all levels throughout the district. Our teachers have participated in various ongoing quality professional development to continue strengthening the teaching and learning process. Our JROTC program continues to earn awards throughout the State. Middle and high school students are strongly encouraged to participate in Service Learning Projects. Our students continue to excel academically and in the arts. St. Paul Elementary School was one of eight Title I Schools out of 540 in the State that made the required federal academic gains. Scott's Branch Middle School earned a Silver Award for student achievement. Our End of Course passage rates are above the state's average in some areas and higher than all of the schools like ours. This is the second time that the art work of one of our students was selected by an outside committee to be on display for a year in the Rayburn House Office Building in Washington, DC. The student and her parents will be honored at a reception in Washington, DC. They will receive complementary round trip tickets to attend the reception. Additionally, several of our students' art work was featured in an extensive art exhibit at one of the universities in our State. The PTA and SIC at Summerton Early Childhood Center have embraced the school throughout the year. The two groups helped refurbish the school's playground. This was a monetary saving for the district. Our focus is to continue providing a quality education and support services to all students in Clarendon One. We continue to invest in creating a literate community. The district purchased 8 books for all students in pre-kdg -11th grade. This measure is part of the district's goal to create a literate community and to encourage the students to develop their personal library at home. The third through fifth grade students received 8 additional books from the SDE as part of our literacy partnership. In summary, we are continuing our quest for excellence.

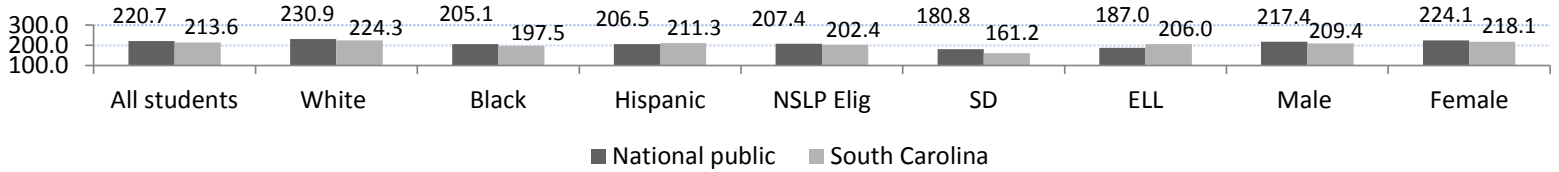

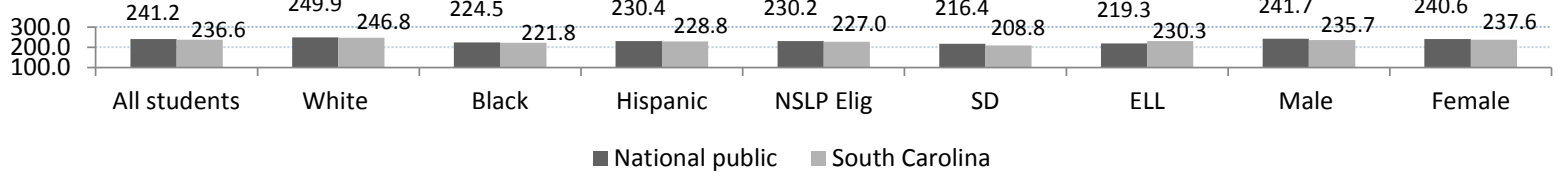

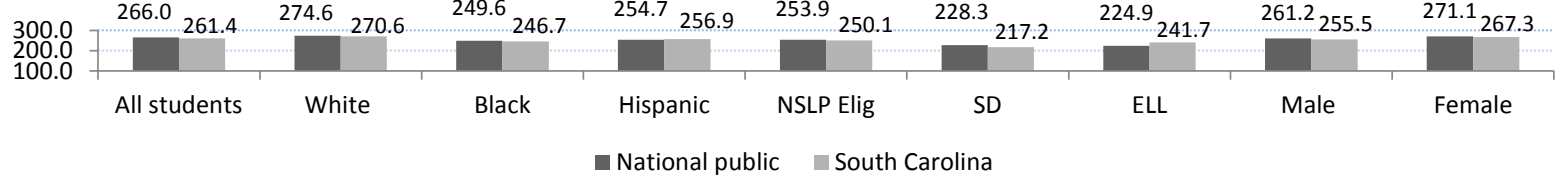
Reading - Grade 4 (2013)



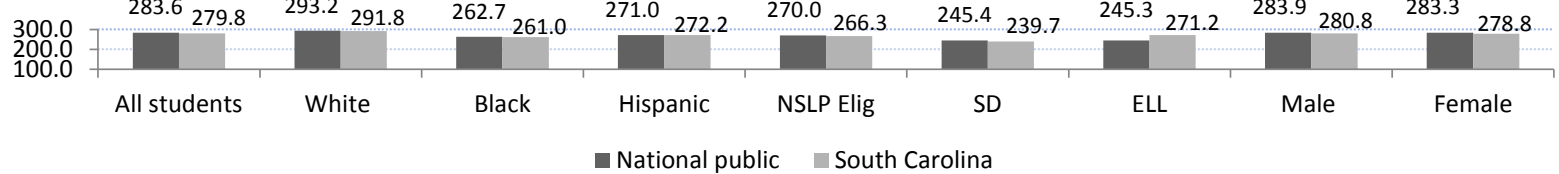
Mathematics - Grade 4 (2013)
