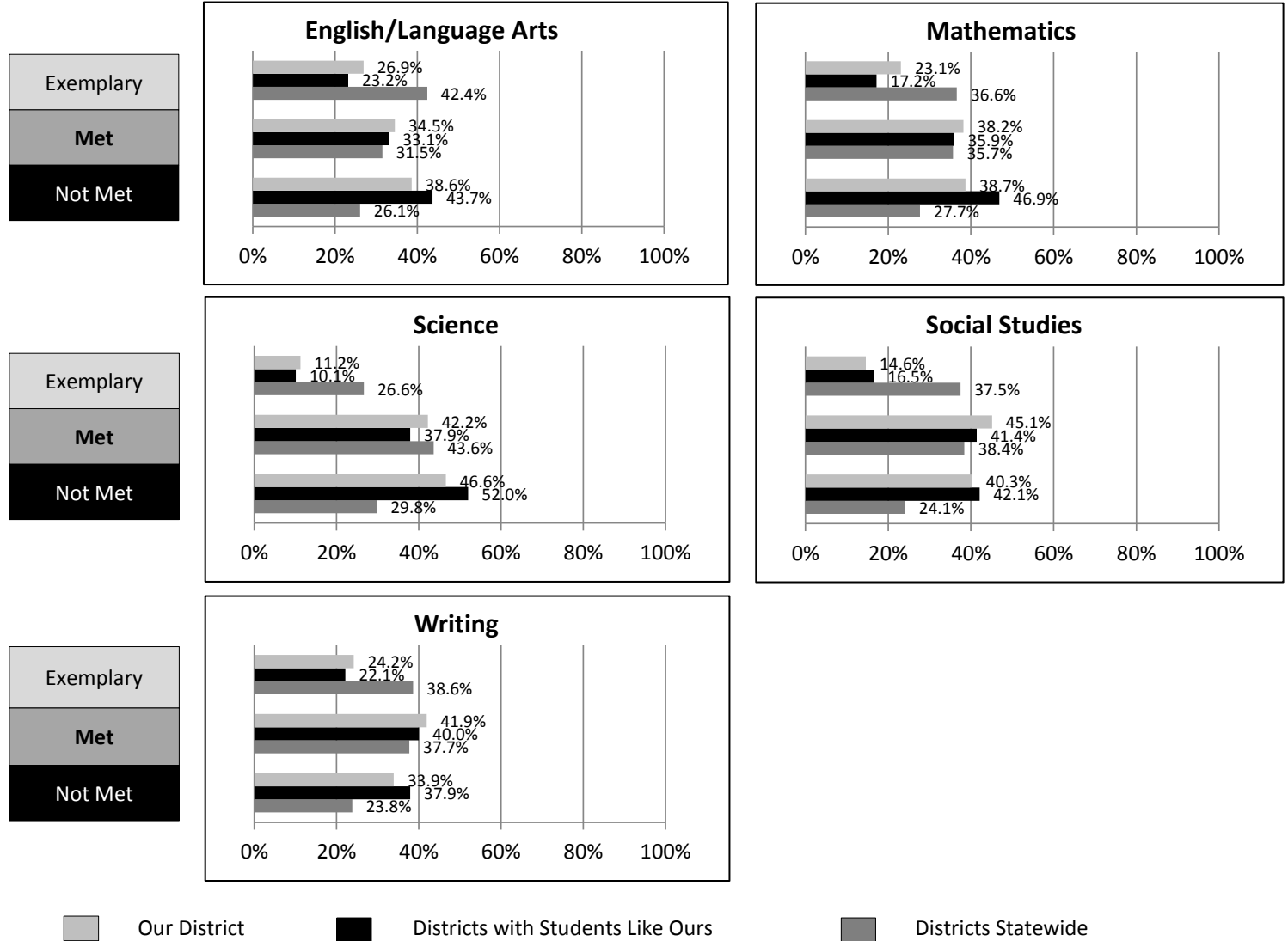

In Dillon School District Four, our highest priority is to ensure a quality education for all students by providing opportunities that promote student success and life-long learning. There will be opportunities for improvement as we implement Year Two Update of the five-year District Strategic Plan and prepare for the new college and career readiness assessment, WorkKeys, and end-of-course exams.

Some of our accomplishments are:

- Technology improvements included: promethean boards in many classrooms, wireless access at all schools, technology coach to provide training for teachers, the utilization of the ePortfolio System for teachers, podcasting, e-books, and IP based television delivery.
- Twenty-one teachers have achieved National Board Certification (NBPTS).
- Professional development in implementing the Common Core State Standards.
- New Dillon Middle School (grades 6-8) opened August 2012.
- Renovations for Lake View High School (grades 6-12).
- Renovations for Lake View Elementary School (grades 4K-5).
- New auditorium on the campus of Dillon High School.
- New district office on the campus of Dillon High School.
- New athletic facility with three new sport fields to accommodate the students at Dillon High School and Dillon Middle School.
- Construction completed for new girls' softball and tennis courts.

Below are barriers that prevent ongoing student progress:

- 90 percent of our students are eligible for free or reduced price lunch.
- Dillon School District Four is a rural community with a limited industrial base.
- New construction and renovations are needed for elementary schools.
- Implementing the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) federal requirements is to better serve all students.

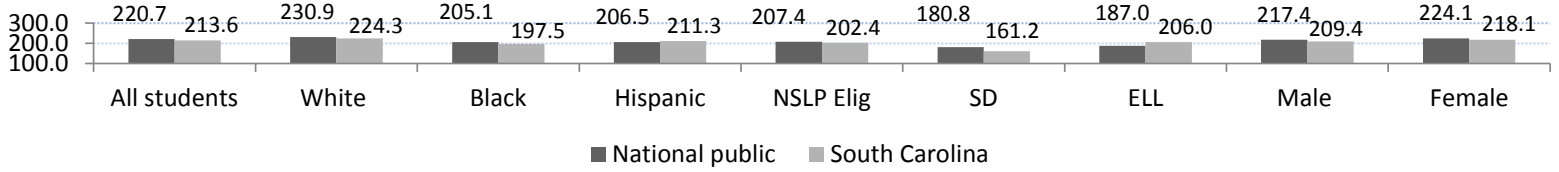

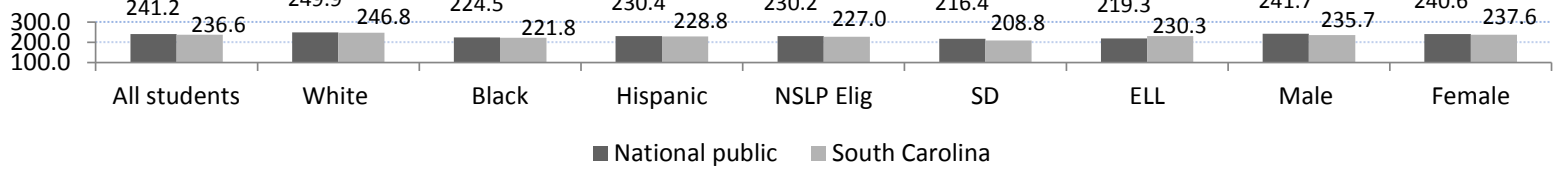

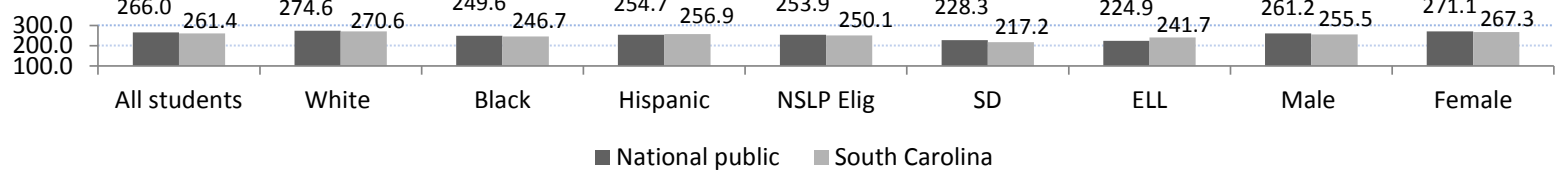
## Reading - Grade 4 (2013)



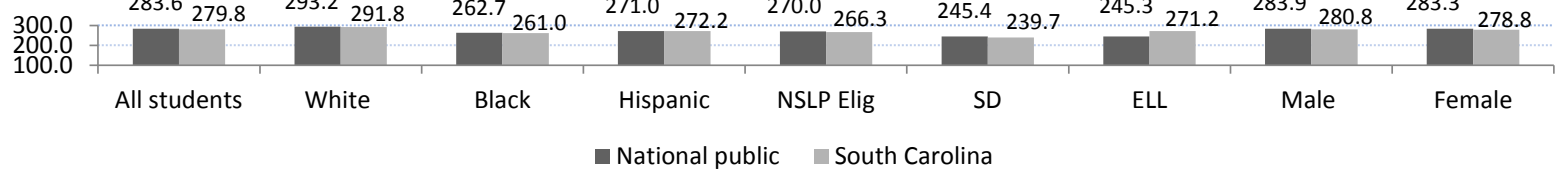
## Mathematics - Grade 4 (2013)
