Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating

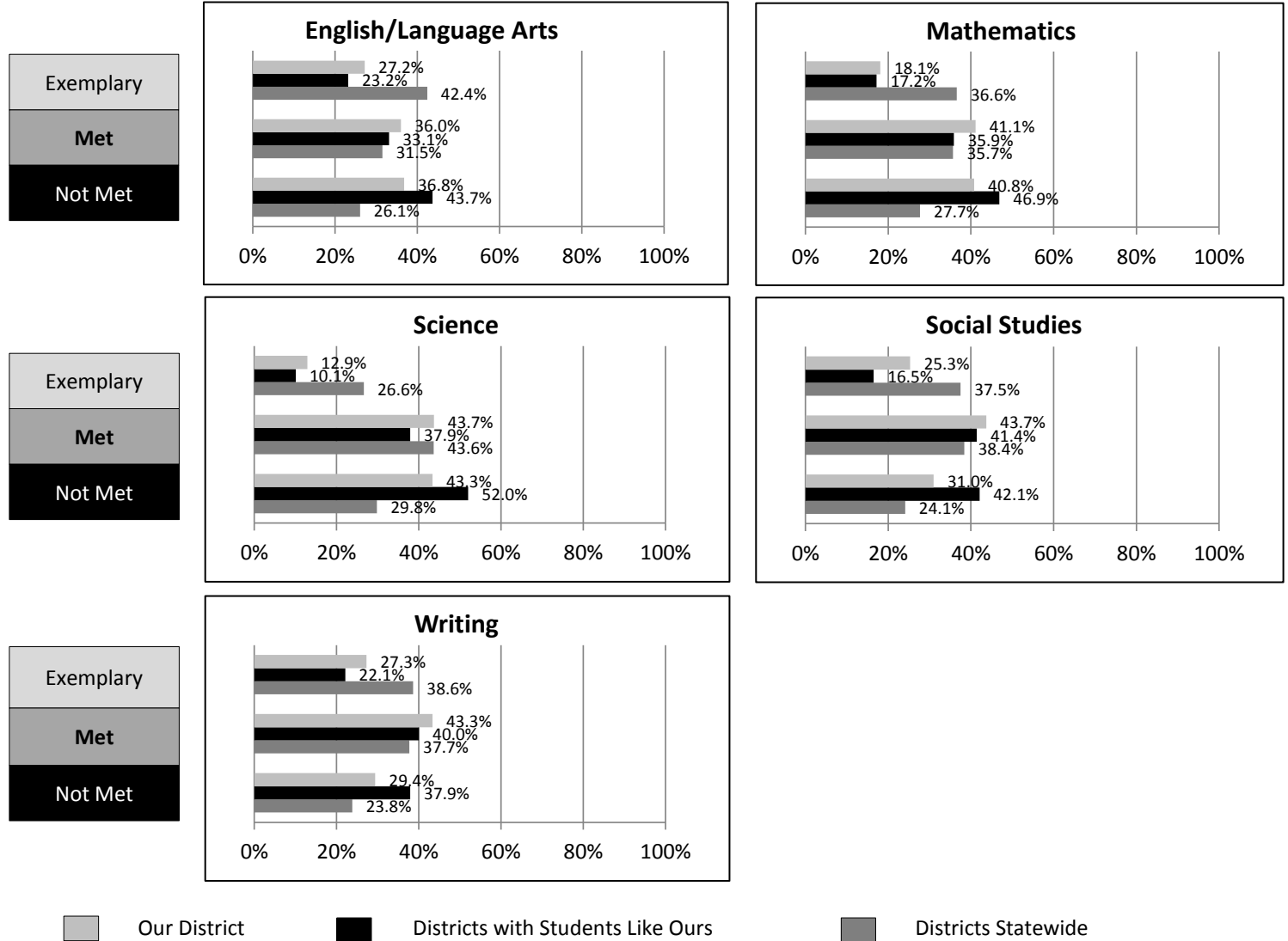

District Superintendent's Report

Fairfield County School District serves approximately 3000 students and is located in a rural, close knit community comprised of 9 schools. We are proud of the many accomplishments and new initiatives in Fairfield County. This year, we welcomed the addition of a second cohort to our STEM Early College Academy where students had the opportunity to be engaged in a project-based, 1:1 technology rich learning environment. In grades 7-12, students were allowed to bring their own devices to enhance their learning in the classroom.

Fairfield County School District celebrated many successes this year. Fairfield Magnet School for Math and Science was the recipient of the Palmetto’s Finest Award given annually by the South Carolina Association of School Administrators (SCASA). This is the first time that a school in Fairfield County has received this distinguished award. Fairfield Magnet School of Math and Science, Geiger Elementary, and Kelly Miller Elementary received the Palmetto Gold Award for performance, while McCrorey Liston School of Technology received the Palmetto Silver Award. Geiger Elementary and Kelly Miller Elementary also received the Silver award for Closing the Achievement Gap. The percentages of students passing the End of Course Exam increased during the 2013-2014 school year for Fairfield Central High School. Additionally, US History saw approximately a 28% increase in the number of students successfully passing.

Through the collaborative efforts of our principals, teachers, staff, students, parents, and community stakeholders, we have made great strides in achieving our academic goals. Many students had the opportunity to extend their classroom experiences through field studies to Puerto Rico, Nashville, Florida, Myrtle Beach, Greenville, Charleston, Georgia and other various locations. Fairfield County School District also received the Arts in the Basic Curriculum grant for the third consecutive year. Our school district was the only South Carolina district recently selected to be featured in a special Google video spotlight. This video highlighted some of the innovative practices taking place in our classrooms every day utilizing the Google Chromebooks and Nexus tablets. Additionally, we recently broke ground on the new Fairfield Career and Technology Center with anticipated completion by 2015.

Our district is committed to excellence for all students. We strive to provide academically rigorous, safe learning environments that support the diverse needs, interest and skills of our students. High expectations and strong home/school and community partnerships ensure our students are college or career ready.

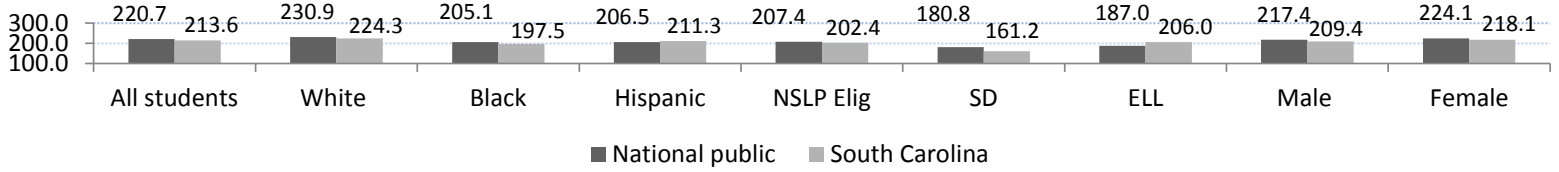

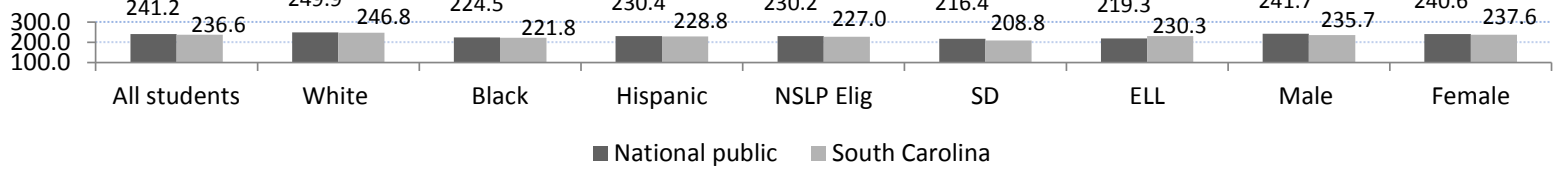

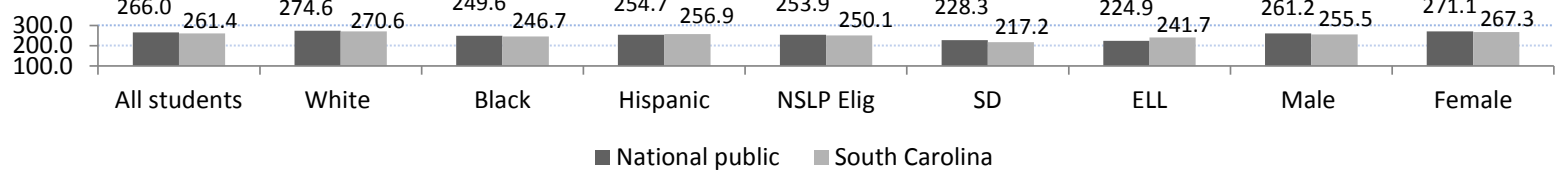
Reading - Grade 4 (2013)



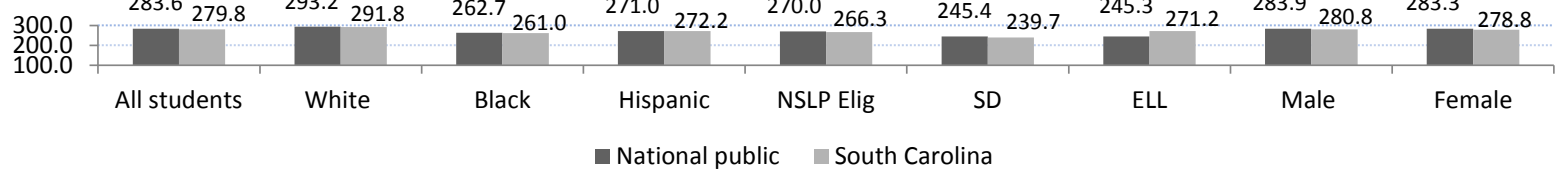
Mathematics - Grade 4 (2013)
