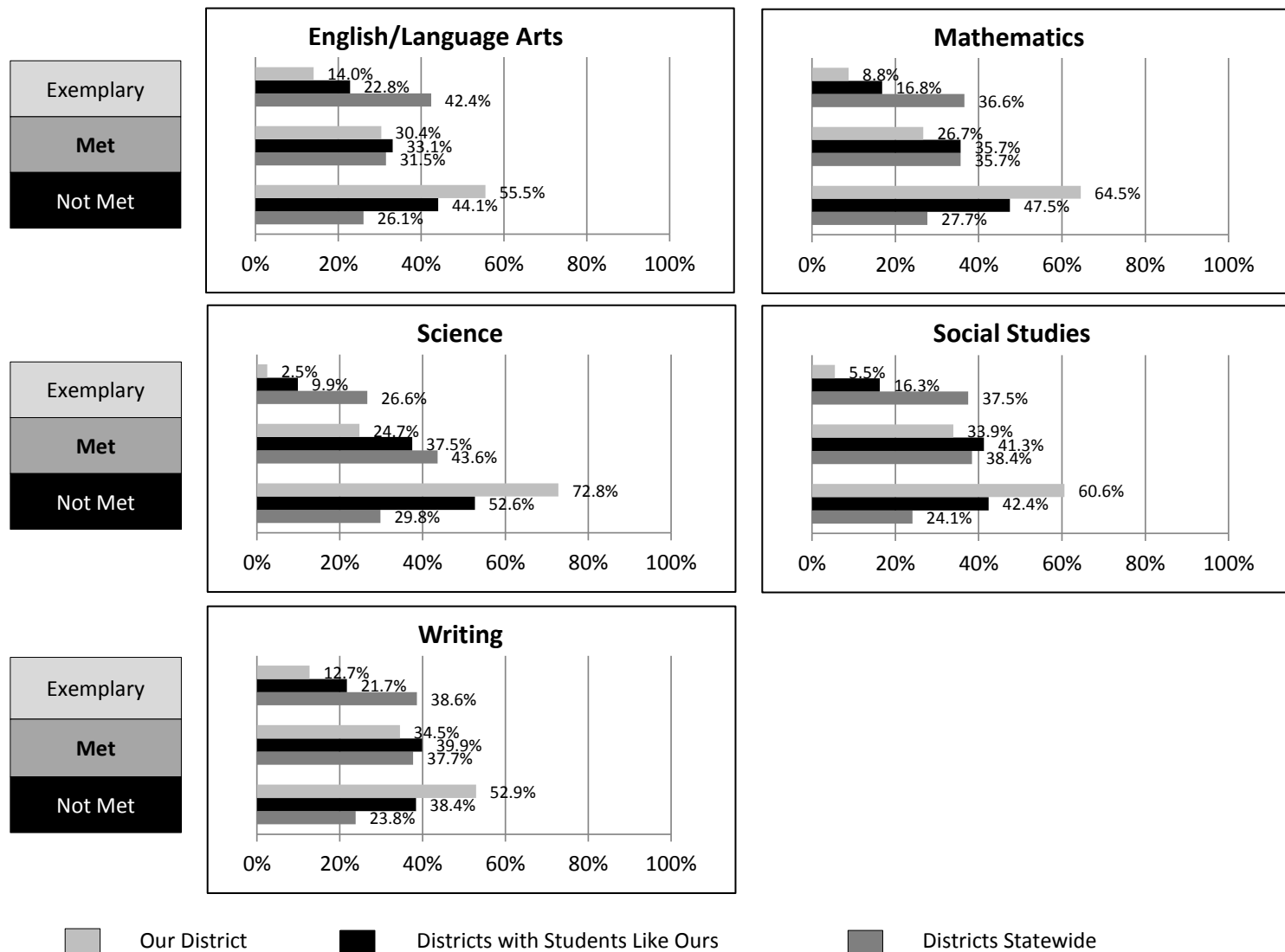

**District Superintendent's Report**

During the 2013-2014 school year, the District prepared for full implementation of the Common Core State Standards. District teams worked collaboratively to prepare and design the curriculum to meet the needs of our students. Our elementary focus this year continues to be to improve student achievement. Hardeeville Elementary and Ridgeland Elementary staff met monthly to collectively plan and share successful teaching strategies in an effort to improve student achievement. Our middle and high school also focused on student achievement in core content areas. The Hardeeville Ridgeland Middle School partnered with Palmetto Electric and Santee Cooper to dedicate a solar panel and become a Green Power Solar School. Ridgeland Hardeeville High School was awarded with the prestigious Palmetto Gold Award for improving student achievement.

In addition to core subject focus, arts education became a focus to extend and enhance learning. Many students demonstrated increased interest in learning due to the excellent opportunities in the arts through chorus, band, and art opportunities at all schools. Achievement in the arts was showcased in Evening of Excellence programs held at both campuses during the year. Additionally, students from the Hardeeville Ridgeland Middle School choral program performed at the South Carolina School Board Association and students from Hardeeville Elementary were selected to participate in the State Elementary Honor Choir.

The District continued emphasis student achievement by offering accelerated courses in partnership with the University of South Carolina/Beaufort and the Technical College of the Low Country through dual credit courses. The District's AVID program worked to create a college-going culture. AVID students learn organizational and study skills, develop critical thinking, learn to ask probing questions, and receive academic support and tutoring.

During our second year of consolidation of our middle and high schools we continued to combine our resources to serve all the students in Jasper County. Ridgeland Hardeeville High School graduated 154 students on June 4, 2014 with current graduates earning 1.9 million dollars in scholarship money. We continue to strive for additional success in student achievement, with continued dedication and determination, the Jasper County School District will achieve the goal that all students will succeed!

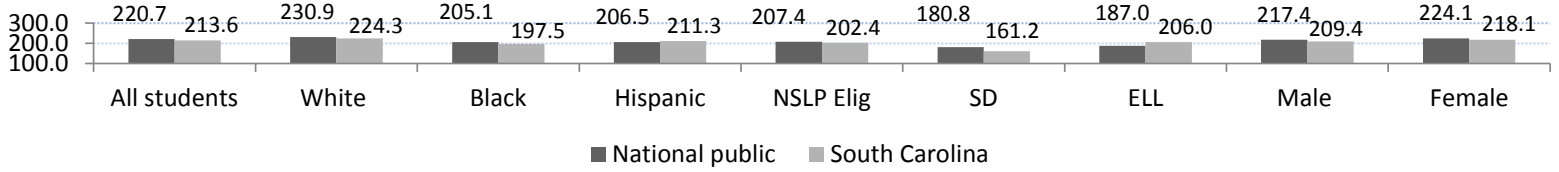

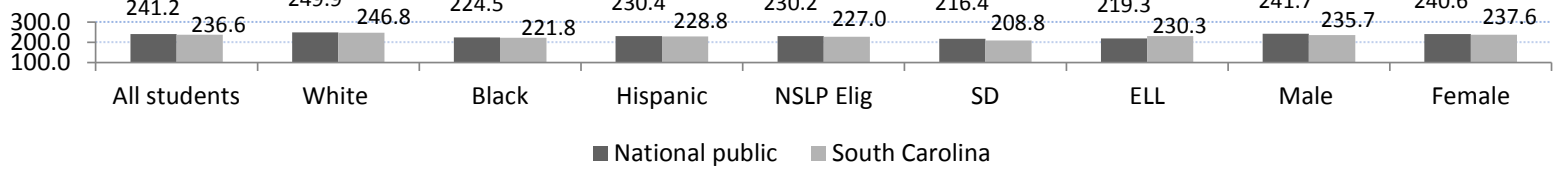

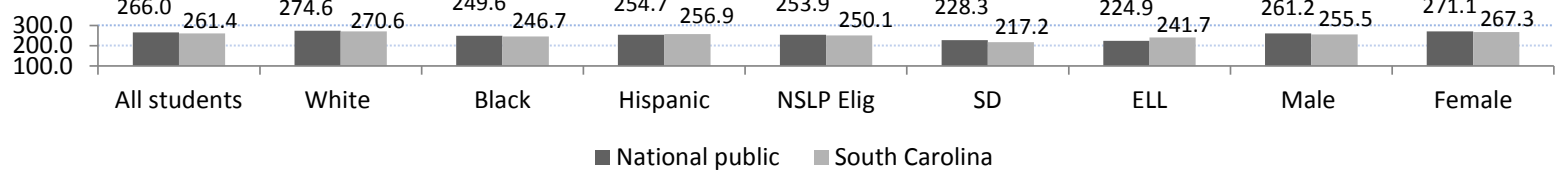
## Reading - Grade 4 (2013)



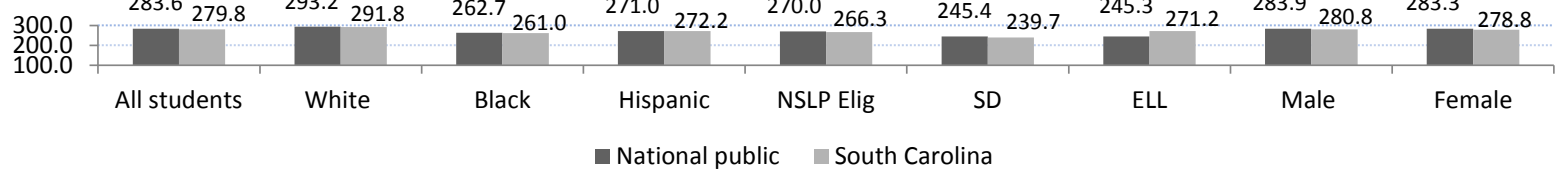
## Mathematics - Grade 4 (2013)
