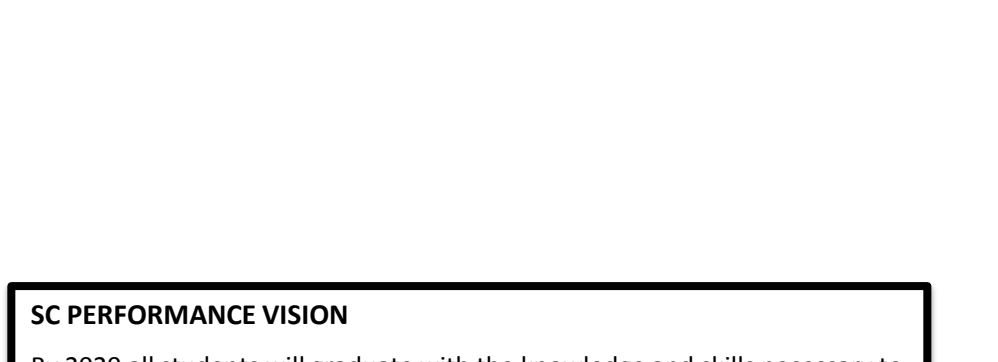

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REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

Dear Beaufort County School District Family:

Our schools have made dramatic progress, with across-the-board improvements in student achievement and significant savings from more efficient operations.

The 2013-14 school year saw continued improvements. For the first time, 100 percent of the district's schools were rated Excellent, Good or Average on state 2013 School Report Cards, up from 59 percent five years ago. Eight schools were rated Excellent.

Two-thirds of our schools rated an A or B on 2013 federal accountability reports released by the South Carolina Department of Education. The district's overall grade was B.

Our high school students improved their exit exam performances to all-time highs, with 84.2 percent passing both sections of the exam on their first attempt. That's 9 percentage points better than five years ago.

The graduating Class of 2014 earned \$27.8 million in college scholarships, a dramatic increase from \$11.1 million only five years ago.

Ninety-four percent of our middle and high school student athletes maintained their academic eligibility to participate in interscholastic sports under a new district academic requirement that athletes meet a 2.0 minimum grade point average. The average GPA district-wide for middle school athletes was 3.47. For high school athletes, it was 3.46.

Numerous staff positions have been cut district-wide over the past four years, with the largest reductions coming in district office staff. Innovative conservation practices saved more than a 15 million kilowatt-hours of electricity in 2013 over 2006 levels, and water use decreased from 58 million gallons in 2006 to 51 million gallons in 2013.

Our "Connect2Learn" 1-to-1 computer technology initiative is putting personal mobile devices in the hands of all students in grades 3-12. In addition, we have begun construction on two new schools to serve students in the fast-growing Bluffton community.

We are determined to accelerate our academic progress, and we thank you for supporting our school district, our students and our educators.
