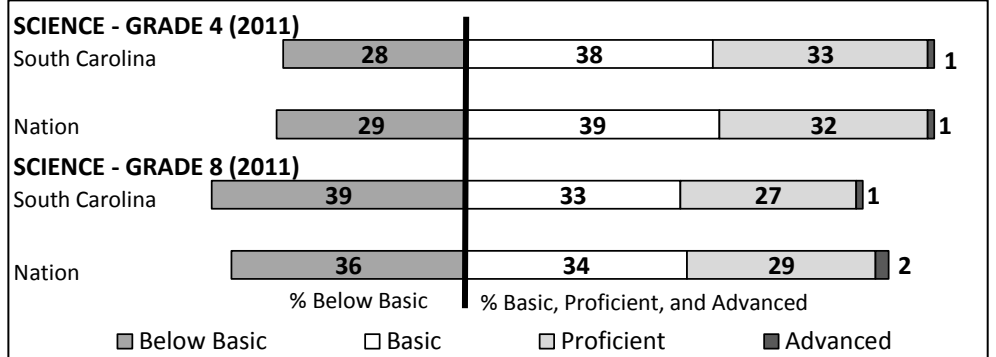
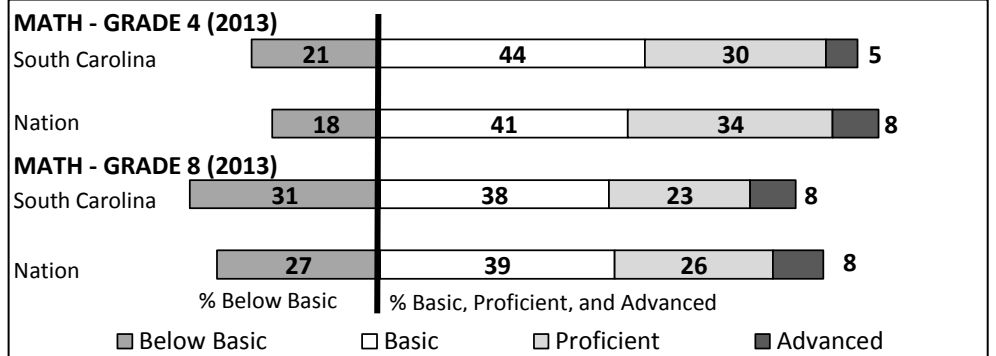
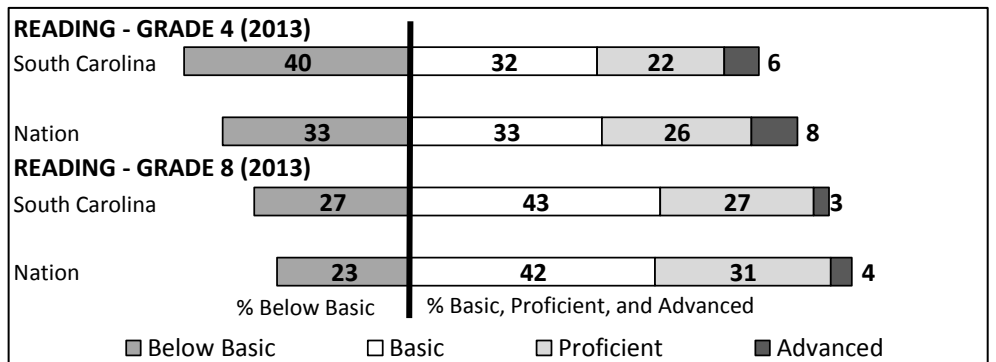

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**REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT**

The Williamsburg County School District celebrates the achievements and improvements being made by its schools, and attributes those positive advancements to our dedicated and skilled administrators, competent and caring teachers, all hard working support personnel, our intellectually capable students, supportive parents, an involved community, and a committed Board of Trustees.

During the 2014 school term, the district's State Report Card maintained its "Average Absolute" rating, and moved from "Below Average" to "Good" in its Improvement category. These identifiers are clear evidence of the progress being made by the district's schools and students.

The District also won a total of ten (10) Palmetto Gold and Silver Award recognitions from the Department of Education, through the Education Oversight Committee's process. This was a significant increase over the previous year, and again spoke to the district's continuous progress in the area of student performance.

In addition to our academic performance indicators, innovations were further noted with the implementation of a Ninth Grade Academy; the reception of a Race to-the-Top Innovation Grant, as a consortium member; the enhancement of the district's Positive on site Development Programs at the Elementary Level that focused on Foreign Language and Student Leadership; STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) implementation programs; Robotics; the Arts and a focus on all core instructional areas. Reading and Writing components were also strengthened and enhanced, as the district also focused on data driven instructional programming.

The district's middle and high schools focused on Career Development and College Readiness; Apprenticeships; Internships; Oratory; Mock Trials, and Comprehensive Academic Preparedness in all core areas.

Additionally, institutes were also conducted for Teachers, Parents and Staff in all areas that would enable them to better support our students, as we focused on our District's Mission and commitment to educational excellence for our students and those intimately involved in preparing them for positivist and productive futures.
