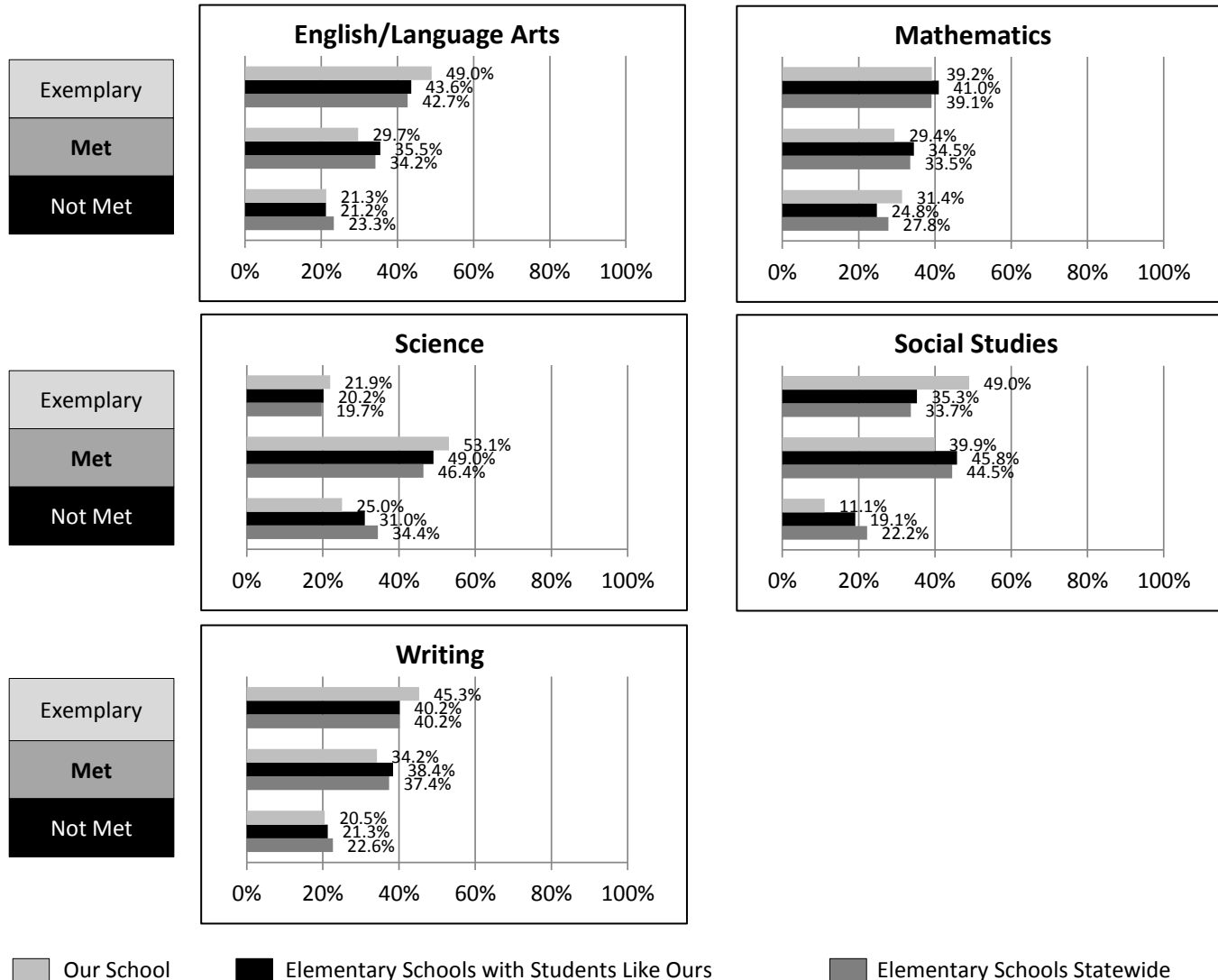

This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. Reading - Grade 4 (2013)



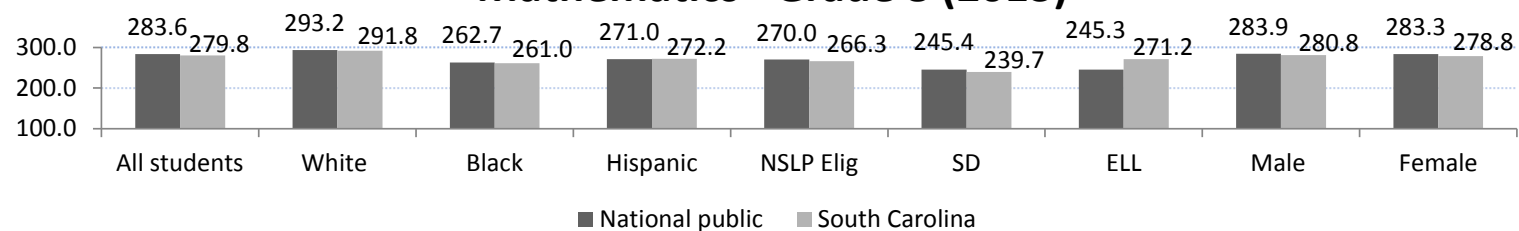
Mathematics - Grade 4 (2013)
