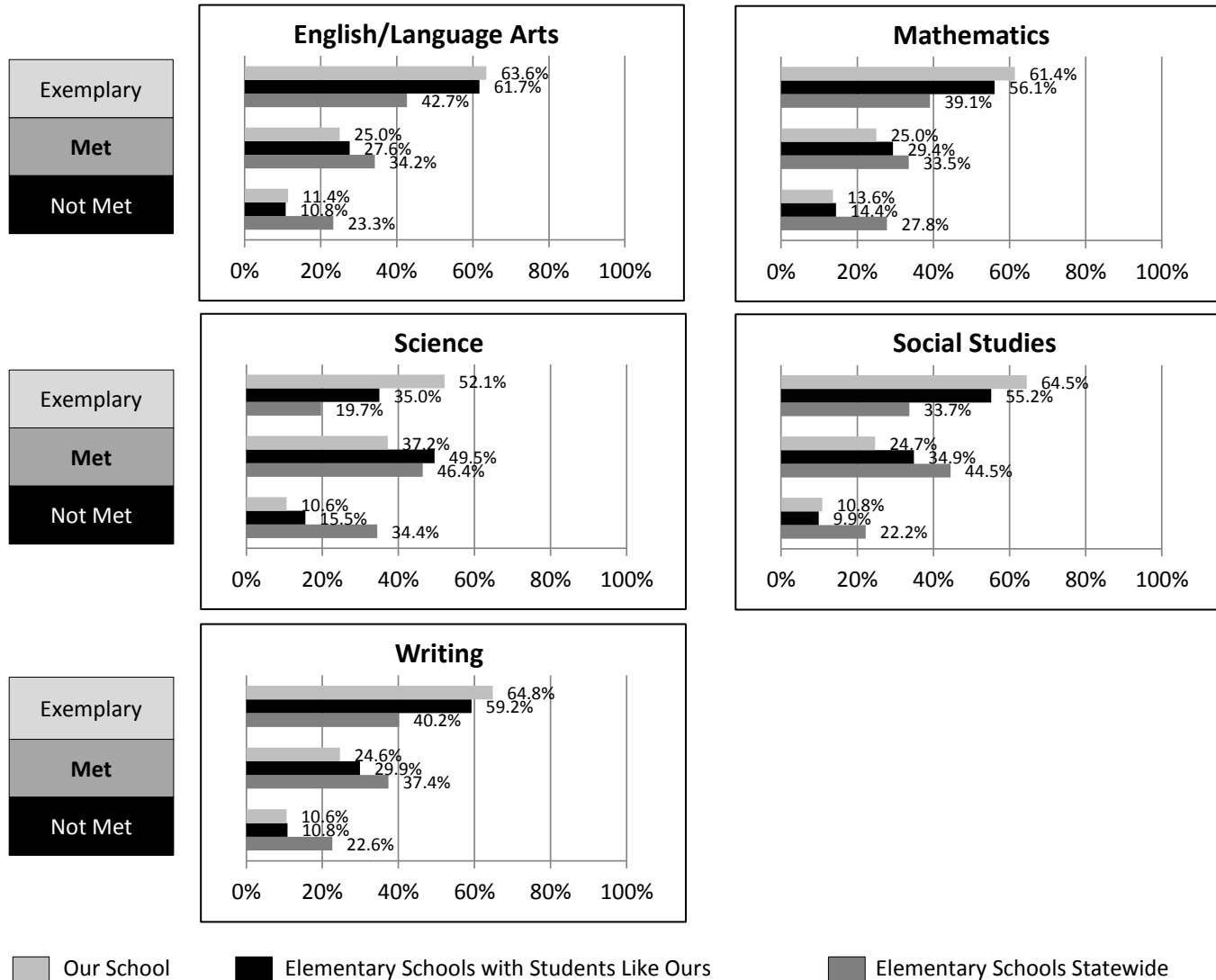

PASS Goals: We are delighted to announce that Carolina Elementary met all the student achievement goals based on Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (PASS) results. Our state report score was: Excellent (Absolute) and Good (Improvement). Our ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating was an A. Honors: Thirty eight fifth graders were inducted into the National Junior Beta Club this year. These students have an academic average of 90 or above and will be able to join the Beta Club at Hartsville Middle School next year. [2]

Activities: In October, we enjoyed two family activities: the Coker 5K run for any student and parent who wanted to participate and our annual Parent Picnic where all parents are invited to eat a picnic lunch outside with their child. We won the trophy for the most participants in the Coker 5K run. Our "MATH" Parent Night was held in the fall to introduce our parents to our new math curriculum and to give them a chance to work with new interactive activities. We partnered with the South Carolina Governor's School of Math and Science to offer after school robotics program for interested fifth graders. Twelve students participated and loved the excitement of making robots and working with the students from the Governor's School. Additionally, we were visited by South Carolina archaeologists, who shared with each class, ways that these scientists gathered data and explored South Carolina for artifacts of the past. In February, grades 1 and 4 were able to participate in the Star Lab from Clemson Extension in our own cafeteria. They studied stars and experienced how weather works. [2]

School Climate: Each year, we start with an Open House for parents and students to visit their classrooms and learn all about the upcoming year. In March, we hosted the Harlem Rockets for a visit to discuss team work and sportsmanship. We also hosted the ALL PRO- DAD breakfast for dads and students in grades one and two which highlighted ways that Dads can be more proactive in their child's life. Carolina was named Clean School of the Year for 2013-2014.

Technology: Teachers are using IPAD's as instructional tools. Grades 4 and 5 have IPADS in their classrooms for instructional purposes. Students are able to use them in math and science. Teachers are using multi-media resources for large and small group instruction. Collaborative efforts between our art teacher, Mrs. Matthews, and our technology administrator, Dale Johnson, led to offering computer graphic classes to fifth grade and effectively integrated the technology into the art curriculum. Mrs. Chamberlin, our media specialists continues to add more eBooks to our library collection for students and staff. [2]

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the Federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years. 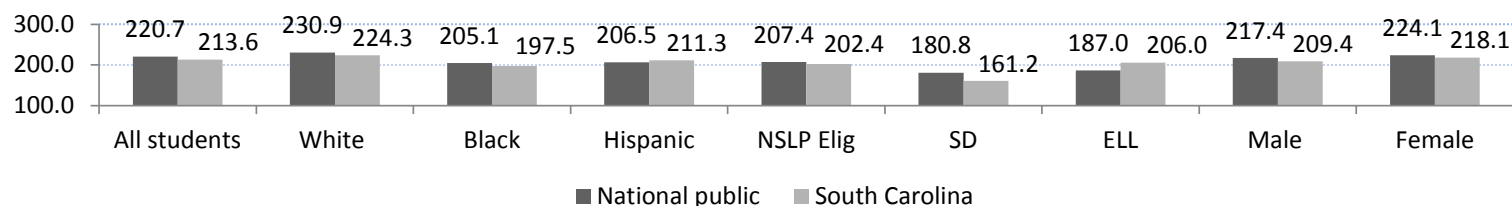
