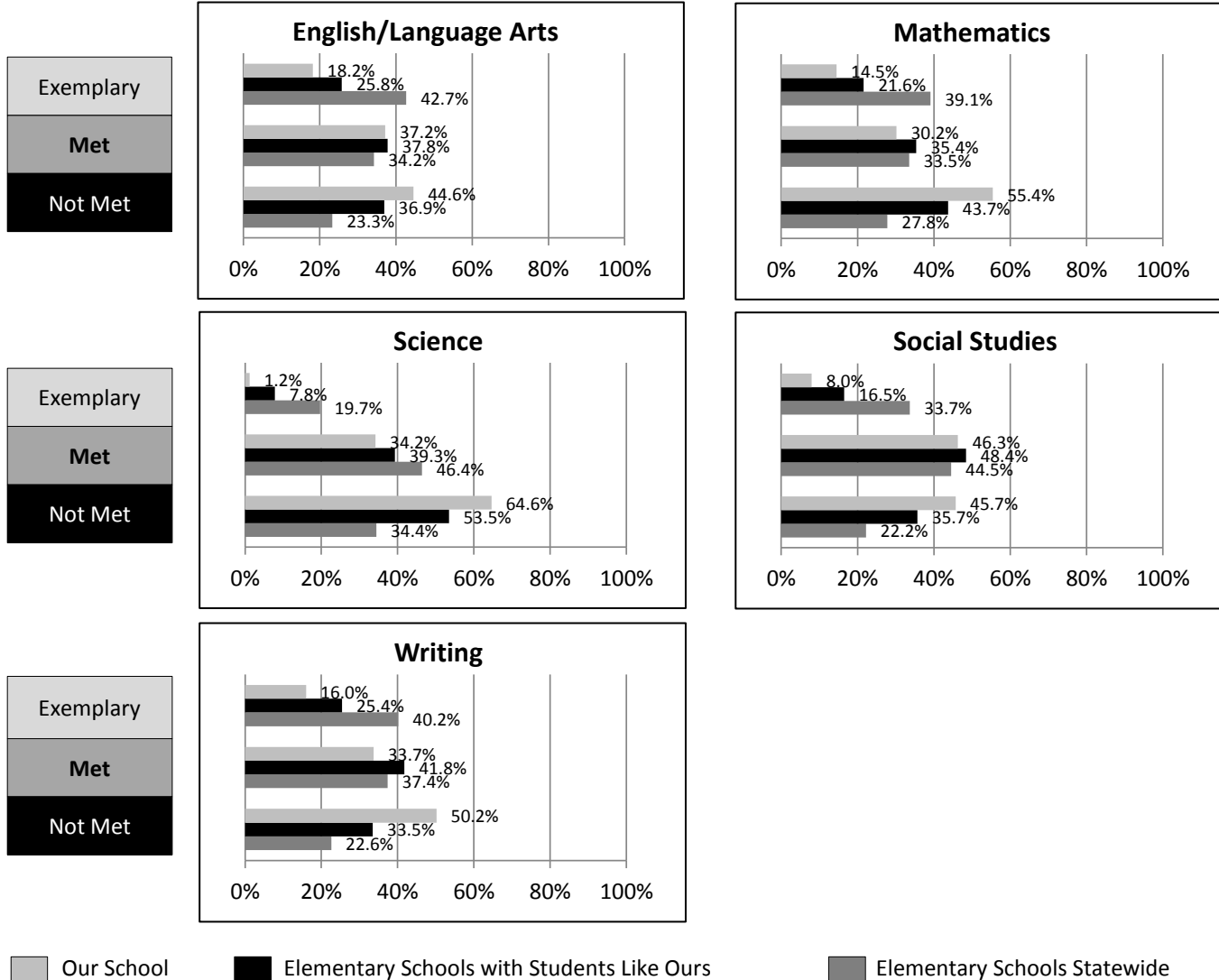

LCE’s community of staff, students, and parents worked together to accomplish our goals. We continued being an award winning school. Our recognitions included remaining a Value-added 5 TAP (Teacher Advancement Program) school, three years in a row. The continuation of TAP ensured our staff had site-based staff development weekly on strategies that focused on ELA and Math. LCE received the Palmetto Gold for Excellence in the Improvement Rating and now we include the Palmetto Silver for decreasing the student achievement gap for 2012-2013 school year. ☐

LCE utilizes an integrated standard-based curriculum that emphasizes technology. Technology professional development is provided once a month for all certified staff. Technology resources used to engage students include laptops and Nooks in the classroom, various software programs, internet resources, Moby Max, Promethean Boards, and Streamline videos. LCE has a balanced language arts program which includes the use of Reading Renaissance. ☐

Other accomplishments included the 21st Century “Save the Children” grant and an “ABC Arts” grant. This year, the 21st Century Save the Children program performed extremely well on the State Department Evaluation. Our Save the Children grant continues to help us maintain our focus on literacy and fitness. This grant expanded our in-school program to include small group emergent literacy instruction which builds a stronger foundation for our young readers. Our grant enabled us to provide a full after school program and summer boost camp. We continued the ZUMBA exercise program. The ABC grant also enabled us to bring in two artists-in residences to work with our students.☐

Our school raised over \$1500 for the March of Dimes. LCE also participated in Jump Rope for Heart, Box Tops for Education, and United Way service learning projects. This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
