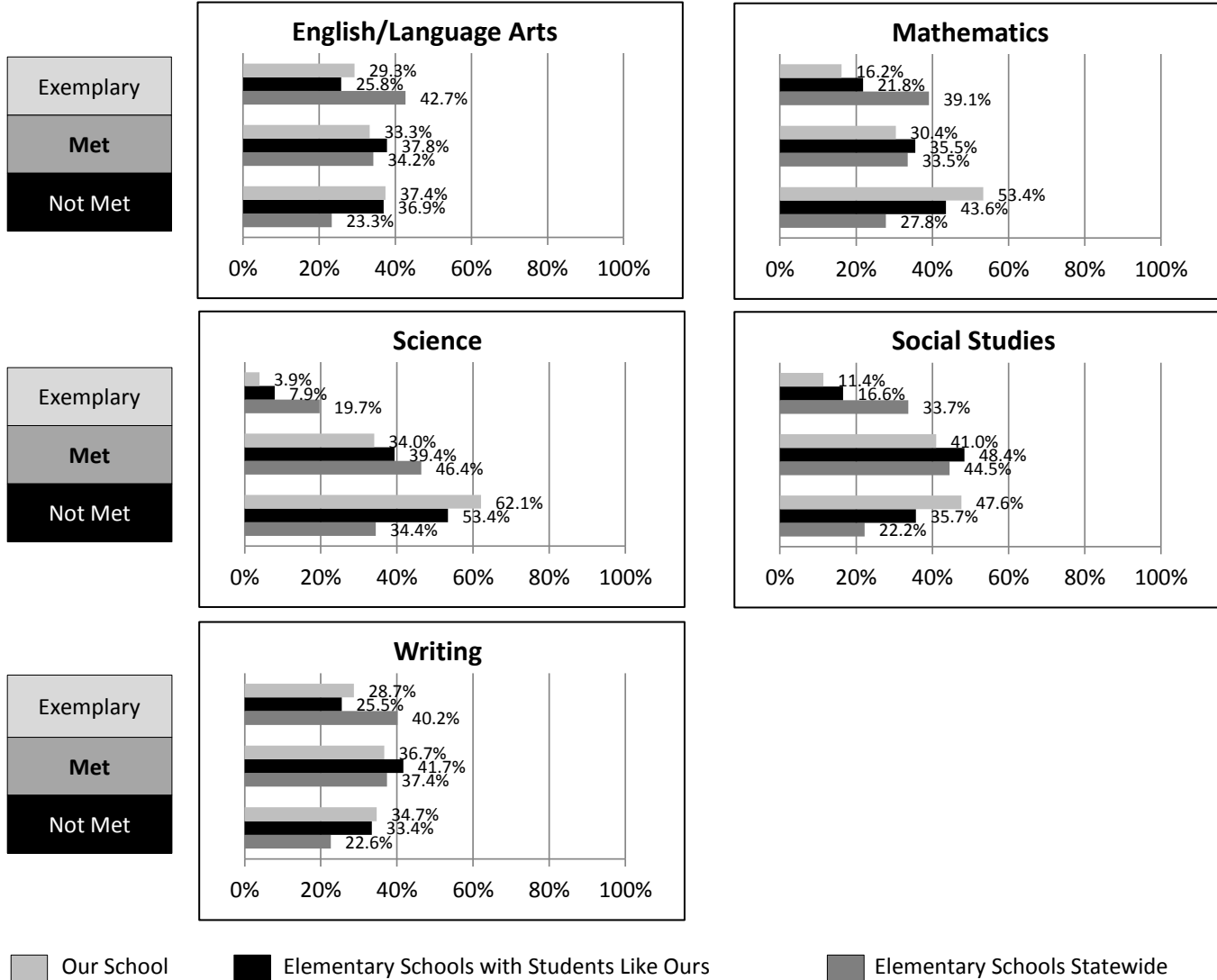

Additionally, as a Title One school, our students ranked #13 in student progress in the state and as a South Carolina Teacher Advancement Program School we scored a Value Added Five for the fourth consecutive year. A five is the highest score in reaching expected student growth, which is set by the National Institute for Excellence in Teaching (NIET). Our motto and school-wide theme, "MSE Panther PRIDE...Promoting Respect, Intelligence, Discipline, and Excellence motivates us to meet and/or go beyond state requirements."

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Academically, our focus is on providing the educational framework that our students need to fulfill their personal potential and to thrive in the world. This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years. 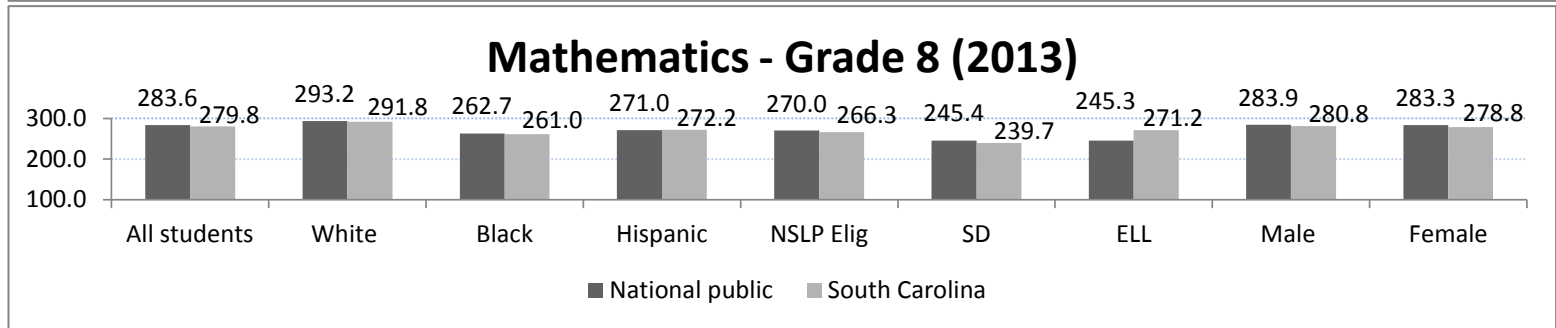
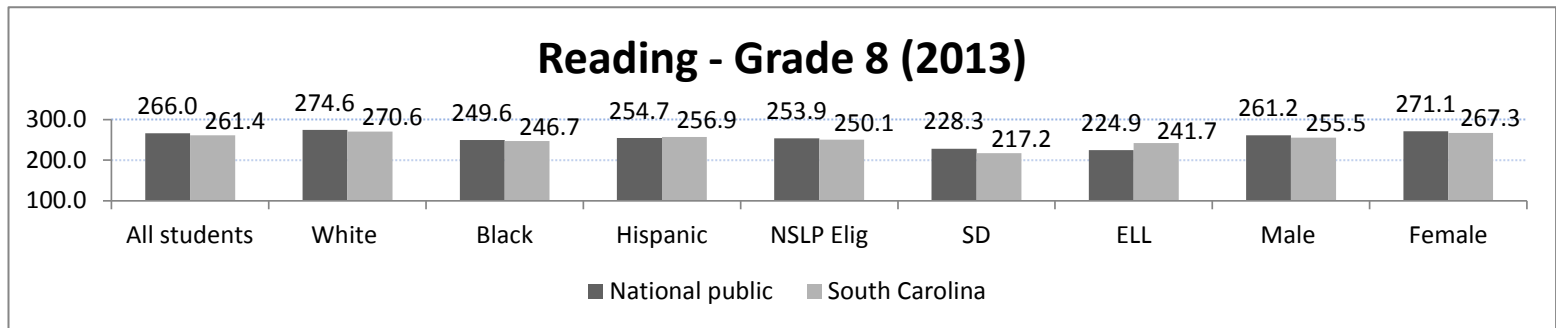
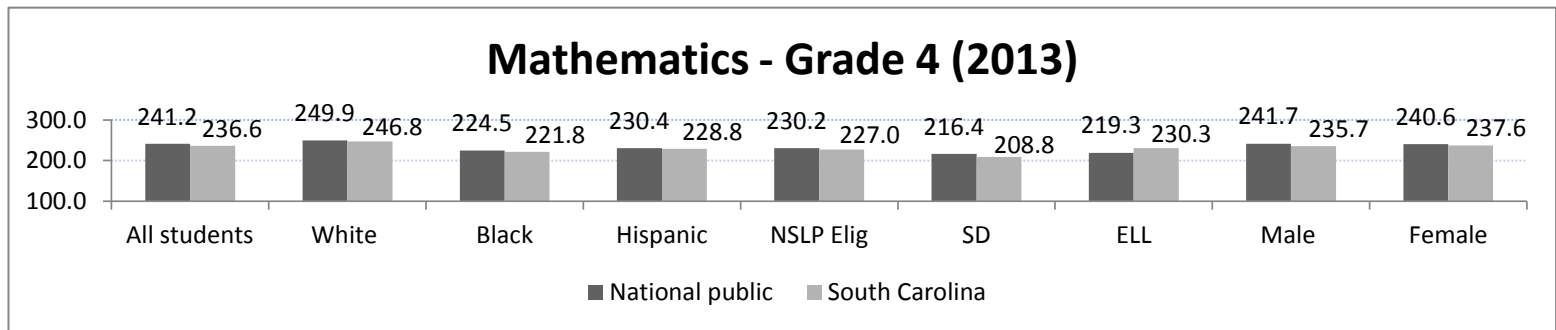
