**Percent of Student SC PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**

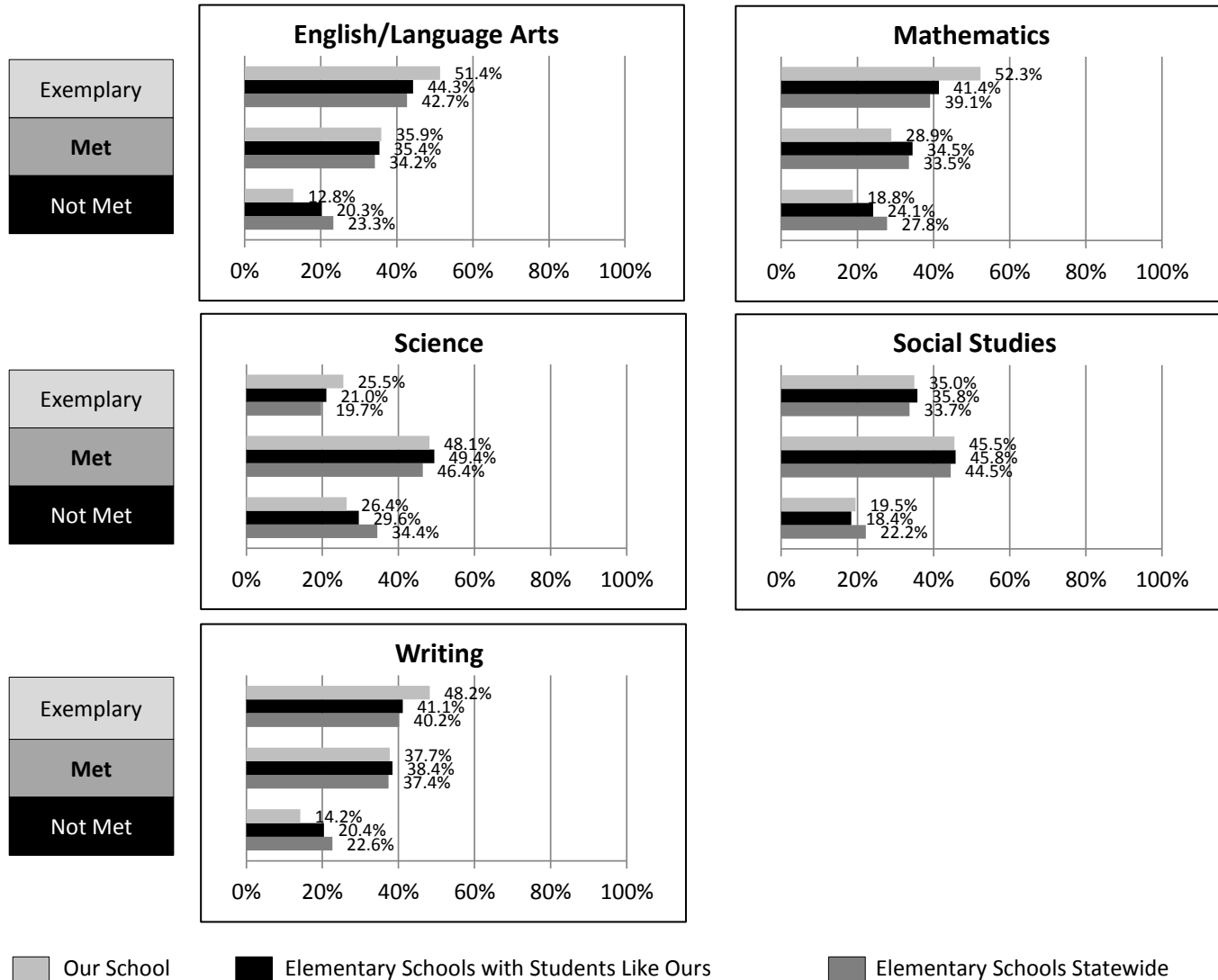

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**Report of Principal and School Improvement Council**

The 2013-2014 school year was a stellar year for student achievement at Aynor Elementary School. The MAP assessment, Imagine It! Benchmark assessments, DIBELS, Circles, DORF, and on-going progress monitoring in ELA and math provided us with the data we needed to differentiate instruction in order to meet the needs of all students. To accommodate our continued needs in the area of English/Language Arts and mathematics, we provided staff development in Compass Odyssey, Standards of Mathematical Practices, Common Core State Standards, Imagine It!, Webb’s Depth of Knowledge, and EveryDay Mathematics. Our students in grades 3, 4 and 5 also utilized Achieve 3000 in order to increase their Lexile levels. Students in grades K-5 utilized Compass Odyssey to increase their reading and math levels. Select students in 5th grade scoring in the higher categories participated in an online pre-algebra course. ☒

Certified teachers and non-certified personnel were hired to provide interventions to small groups of students in ELA and mathematics. A reading specialist was employed to provide intensive small group tutoring for identified students in Kindergarten through grade 5. Students in grades 3-5 participated in the Battle of the Books. This program promoted better reading skills and got our students excited about reading. We had several students participate in HCS Technology Fair and many of these students placed in the competition. Our School Counselor sponsored the AES Student Council which served our school community well. Our music program continued to expand, offering students steel drums, African drums, recorder, and regular music education. Our students performed at many different events throughout the school year. Our very own Blue Pan Jam steel drum band performed at Waves of the Future at the Carolina Opry, HCS Teacher of the Year ceremony, South Carolina Teacher of the Year Conference, as well as several other schools and parades in Horry County. We are very proud of the wonderful opportunities offered to our community through our music program. We are extremely proud of our students here at AES, and we appreciate the hard work of our staff members that serve our students. We will continue to strive to make Aynor Elementary School a premier educational setting the Aynor community can be proud of. ☒

This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target.
