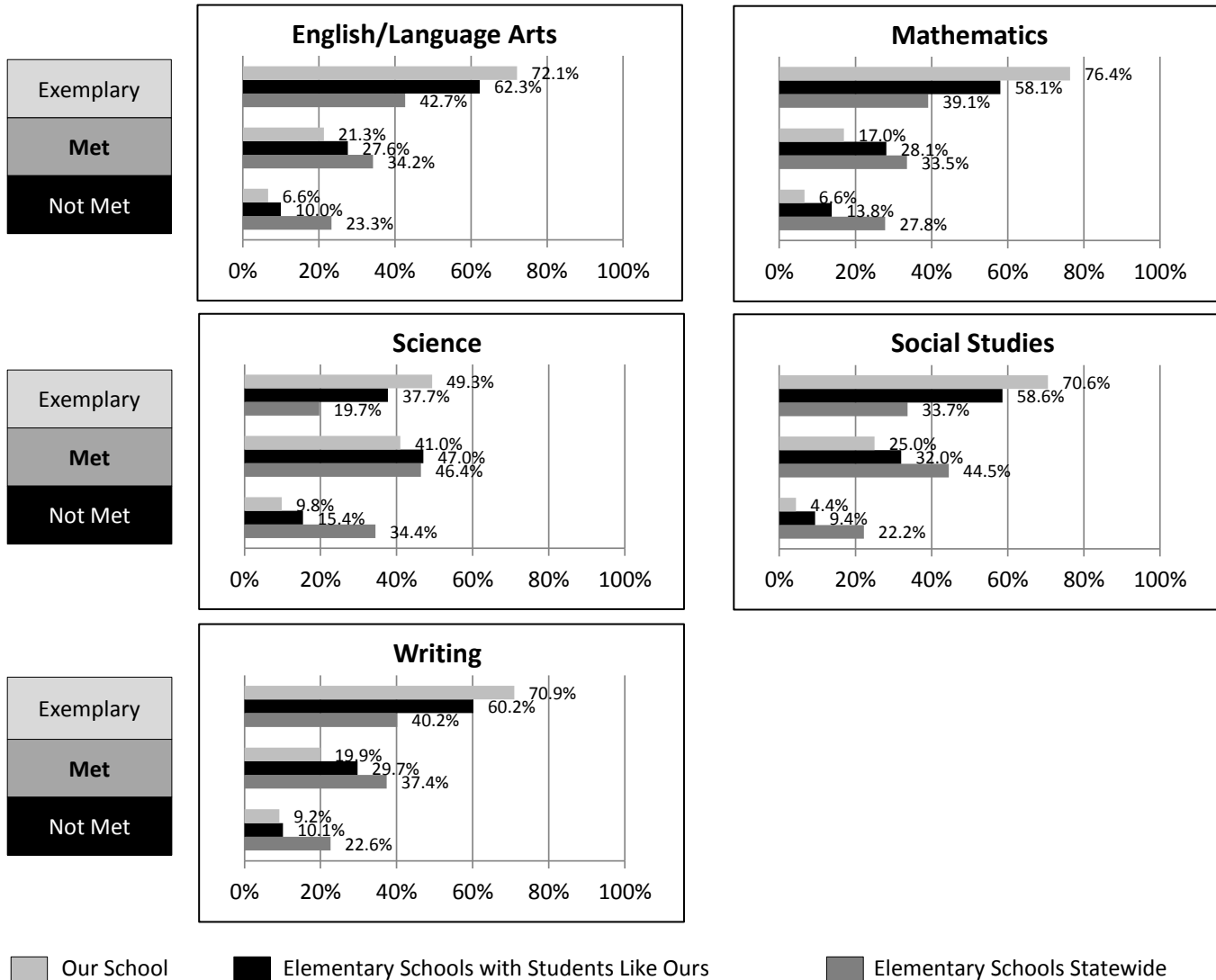

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Dear Parent or Guardian(s):

At Ocean Bay Elementary School, we strive to create an environment that is conducive to learning while focusing on service to students. The School Improvement Council for our school has prepared this School Summary Report for you and for the members of our community who are interested in our school. The Ocean Bay Elementary School family has experienced many successes during the 2013-2014 school year. The State Department of Education named Ocean Bay Elementary a Palmetto Gold School again this year. This is a prestigious award that we are proud of and it reflects our commitment to meet the needs of each child academically, socially, and emotionally. To ensure we continue to meet the needs of each child, we incorporate a cadre of instructional strategies and assessment tools. We utilize our grade level planning times to plan, review assessment data, and monitor our pacing. Types of data used to guide our instruction are MAP, DIBELS, PASS, Benchmark, formal and informal assessments. Our administrative team monitors instruction by using a schedule for classroom walkthrough visits, and we work with our teachers to debrief and use the data to improve instruction.

Our school has continued to improve upon our facilities as well. We have added new signs around the property that make it easier for parents and visitors to move safely throughout our school grounds. We have added benches and tables to our recently renovated playground as well which offers additional space for our children to sit and hold classes outside. We will continue to improve and upgrade our facilities as needs arise.

Our School Improvement Council (SIC) has led an effort to support our school in the area of academics. In an effort to assist the school with preparation for MAP testing, our SIC continued this year providing stickers to be worn home each night before a child takes his/her test. The sticker gives information to parents on how they could assist their child in making sure he/she was ready and well prepared the following day. Our SIC has also worked to start a program that will partner with a local retirement center. This is an effort to allow for additional community service opportunities for our students.

The Parent Teacher Organization (PTO) at our school has done a wonderful job supporting the students and staff members this year. The PTO has sponsored many activities and appreciations this year including OBE nights at local restaurants. Our PTO works to support our faculty and the academic, social, and emotional needs of our children.

Our Ocean Bay Elementary faculty and staff continue to celebrate the academic success of all children, and we look forward to building on our instructional excellence for years to come.
