

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## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

The mission of Nursery Road Elementary School is to motivate, empower and support students to accomplish individual goals within challenging curricula and to develop successful citizens in a diverse community. In 2013 – 2014, we celebrated an absolute rating of “Excellent” on our state report card for the fifth consecutive year and were awarded Palmetto Gold for the fifth consecutive year for student achievement. We celebrate our students’ success on MAP and PASS through our WNRE morning show, data rallies and other recognition opportunities. Our Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports (PBIS) initiative continues to help our students thrive to do their personal best each day. Students who earned their goal in tickets enjoyed PBIS celebrations each nine weeks. Our staff focused on writing through our Data Teams. Collaboration of instructional strategies and best practices in all content areas was also the focus in school-wide conversations and the individual reflections of our teachers.②

Our students continue to learn and serve by leading in community outreach and other service projects. Those efforts included Special Olympics, Student Government Association, Safety Patrol, Flag Patrol, WNRE daily morning show, Champion Buddies who assist students with special needs, food drives, and collection drives for our veterans and soldiers.②

Our Pre-Games continue to provide students with opportunities for extracurricular activities before the school day begins including: Goal Oriented Leadership Development (GOLD), math lab, book club, ballroom dancing, fitness, nutrition and learning to play the dulcimer. WIN WIN (What I need, When I need) was added this year to assist students with homework.②

We began the Watch D.O.G.S. (Dads of Great Students) Program this year, led by our School Improvement Council (SIC). Nearly 30 fathers and father figures volunteered to spend a day lending a hand to our Champions. More than 50 of our Champions have mentors who are actively involved in our students’ school life and well-being. Our PTO continues to sponsor our quarterly Pinning Ceremony, recognizing students for academic achievement. Our monthly “Heart Act to Follow” character ceremony sponsored by partners at Fellowship Bible Church continues to help students instill life skills that build good character. Our grounds/facilities improvements include 15 new River Birch trees on our playground; a mural of Arts Integration in our Activity Arena; additional security cameras; and painting in the front office, kitchen, gym and all main hallways.②

This year, we added two portable Chromebook computer labs and iPads as instructional tools. In addition, students continue to grow in math through our Reflex Math and Compass Odyssey Labs during the school year and summer. Through professional development, continued data analysis, and collaboration we will continue to grow our students to greatness as we motivate, empower and support them to achieve their best!②

This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years. 
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


### Reading - Grade 4 (2013)




### Mathematics - Grade 4 (2013)
