

Through intentional planning of writing lessons combined with authentic writing practice and assessment, our students have improved in writing in all content areas. Our students have practiced writing in many forms this year, and we are excited to see how their growth in writing continues to flourish in the years to come. ☐

☐ This year also brought the third year of our PTO’s focus on health and wellness for our students. In the past three years, our PTO has donated in excess of \$100,000 to improve our playground facilities and has started a school running club. Both of these have made a tremendous impact on our students, and we look forward to seeing the impact this will have on our students in the future. Next year, we look forward to our PTO’s continued support in the area of technology. ☐






### Reading - Grade 4 (2013)




### Mathematics - Grade 4 (2013)
