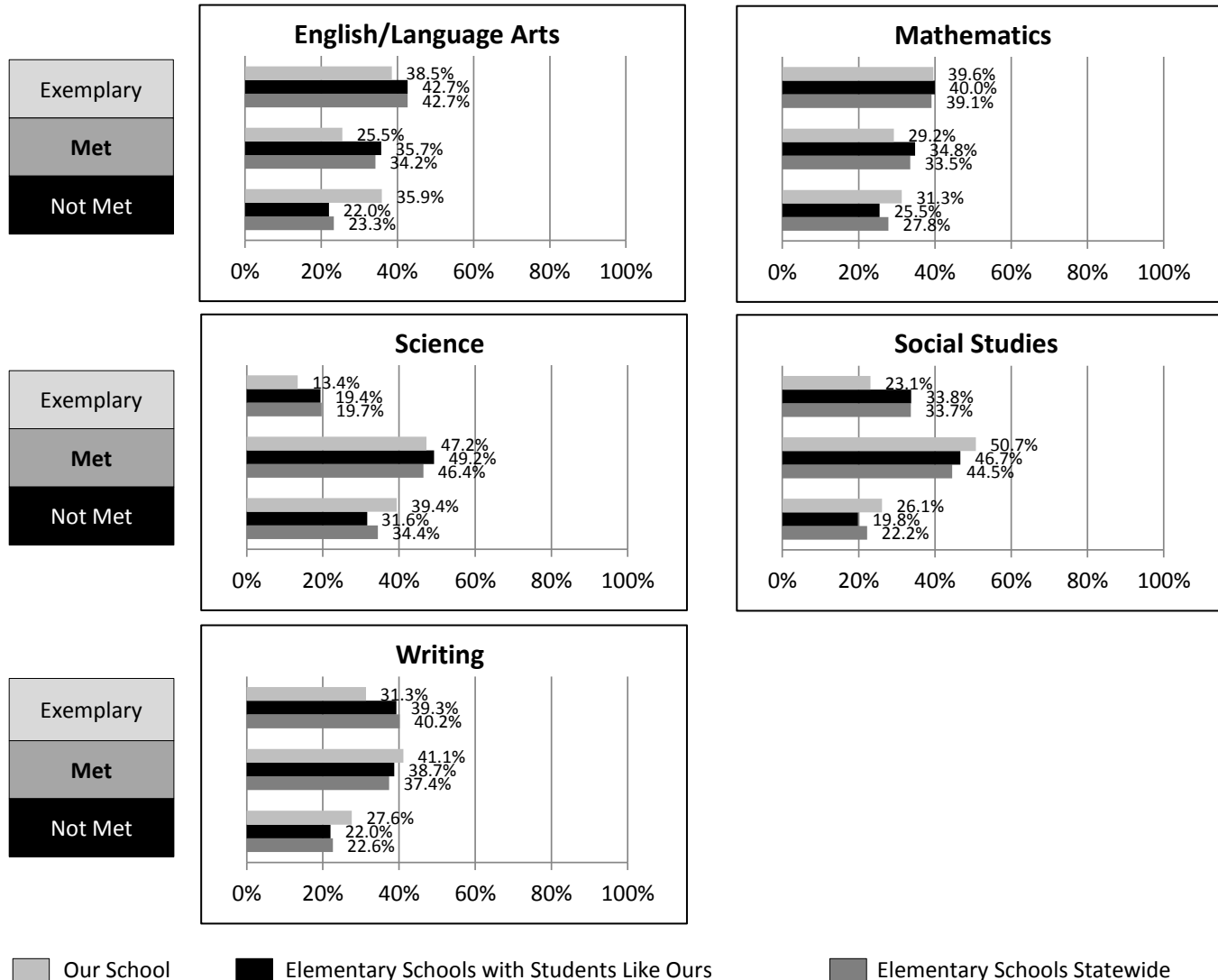

Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

This year, Oakdale has established some key partnerships. First, we began working with Stem Centers SC and reconnected with the Urban Leadership Learning Center to build on our faculty's instructional expertise to challenge and meet the needs of all our students. Specifically, we have learned more about the characteristics of highly effective STEM classrooms, with an emphasis on quality, rigorous questioning practices and creating a student-centered classroom. Another key partnership was established with Science on the Move, a 4-H Initiative. The Science on the Move team helped support our Nutty Professors STEM Club, co-sponsored our Stupendous Saturday STEM Day Camps, and helped connect our school with community resources. We have created further awareness of and enthusiasm for STEM among students, parents, and our community through our Hands on Family Fun Nights, Rockin' Robotics Club, and reinstituting DNN - the Dragon Network News. To financially support many of our initiatives, we have secured over \$5,000 in grants. These funds have been used to purchase a weather station, a NASCAR car project, grade-level gardening projects, as well as materials for our other clubs and organizations. The Rock Hill Schools iRock Initiative, which provides iPads for all 4th and 5th grade students, has helped support our implementation of STEM practices, as well. [2]

Our students have had some notable accomplishments. Several of our 5th grade students were featured on an episode of SCETV's Palmetto Scene in collaboration with Brick for Kidz to highlight the importance of STEM education. Our gifted and talented students participated in the South Carolina Economic Concepts Poster/Calendar Competition. A 5th grade student's illustration was selected to appear in the 2013-2014 calendar, and a 4th grade student's illustration will appear in the 2014-2015 calendar. The 2014 Oakdale Science Bowl team, comprised of 5th grade students and coached by 5th grade teachers, placed third overall in the district out of seventeen elementary schools. We also had four 5th grade students compete in the "You Be the Chemist Challenge," a national competition to encourage interest in science, and one advanced to the state finals in held in Columbia, where he competed against middle school students. Oakdale has also received some school-wide recognition this year. In the fall, we were identified as a 2013-2014 Title I Reward School for Performance. Oakdale was also named as one of the 2013-2014 Rock Hill Schools Recycling Champions. [2]

Finally, Oakdale launched the Watch DOGS (Dads of Great Students) Program and Days of Excellence to create more opportunities for parents to be involved during school day. Our first annual STEM Showcase was held and featured student-designed experiments that they shared with parents and community members. In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the Federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target.
