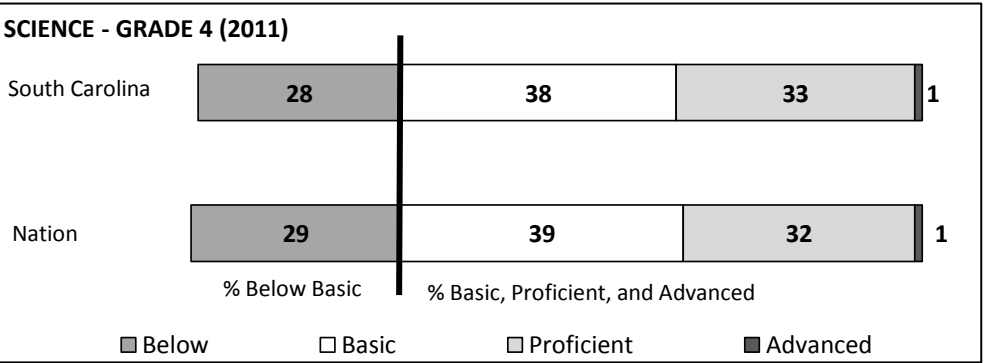

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

"Calhoun Academy of the Arts “saddled up for success” this year with a western theme and our 40-year anniversary as an elementary school. Our “40-Year Round-Up” in October was a four-hour celebration attended not only by hundreds of students, parents, and community member but also by past principals, teachers, and students who came back to their Calhoun family from many miles away. Calhoun students showcased their dance, drama, strings, visual art, and singing talents, with bluegrass music and barbecue provided by our Anderson community. We are particularly thankful to our phenomenal P.T.O., without whom this huge event could not have taken place. ☺

We continue to embrace the integration of the arts and academics through artistic expression in our classrooms and student performances. Calhoun again was the recipient of South Carolina’s ABC (Arts in Basic Curriculum) grant of \$7500. This provided funding for comic artist Dave McDonald, who taught our fifth graders the elements of story-writing through comic strip drawing. We were also able to continue our relationship with storyteller Tim Lowry, who helped coordinate Colonial Day for our fourth graders. The grant also helped fund our mammoth school-wide student performance in March, Books to Broadway, which featured the singing, dancing, and acting talents of our students and staff. Other school performances this year include Christmas at the O.K. Corral by second grade; strings and chorus concerts; and collaborative performances with dance and art in which students showcased original dance moves while their own artwork was displayed on the stage backdrop. Our music and drama (MAD) departments also collaborated to perform class-written scripts and songs that integrated academic standards, MAD about Learning. All students showcased their artwork at a school-wide art show in October. The artworks of many Calhoun students were featured at the countywide art show, and first place winner of the elementary division was from Calhoun. Additionally, for the third consecutive year, Calhoun was a winner at the AnMed art show. We are also proud of our fifth grade advanced strings students, who brought home awards from the S.C. Solo and Ensemble Festival, and our honors chorus, who participated in a district choral clinic. ☺

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Calhoun received an excellent rating on our school report card this year, as well as AYP status and the Palmetto Silver Award. We continued our status as an Exemplary Writing School, as our students practiced journaling in every subject and student, parent, and staff writings were displayed throughout our school. ☺

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Calhoun fourth and fifth grade girls who are part of our ENGAGE club participated in community service and other activities this year that enhanced positive character traits and self-esteem. Fifth grade students ran our daily morning news show as they assumed roles of writers, news anchors, weather reporters, camera operators, and other technical support. ☺

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We wish to thank our PTO, who did so much for Calhoun this year, including purchasing each child a school T-shirt and providing funds for every grade level attend a performance at the Brooks Center. We are also thankful for our mentors of our Legacy Mentor Program for giving of their time to mentor our children and for our Anderson University student tutors of the America Reads, America Counts program. We join with our stakeholders as we continue to educate our children and inspire them to create, aspire, and achieve.
