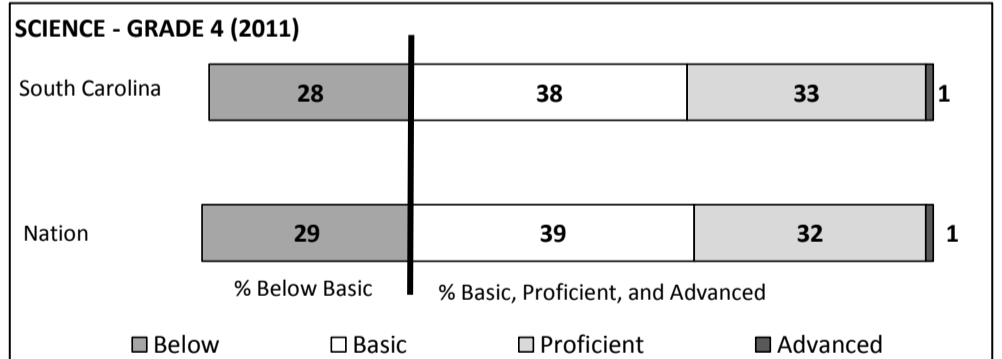
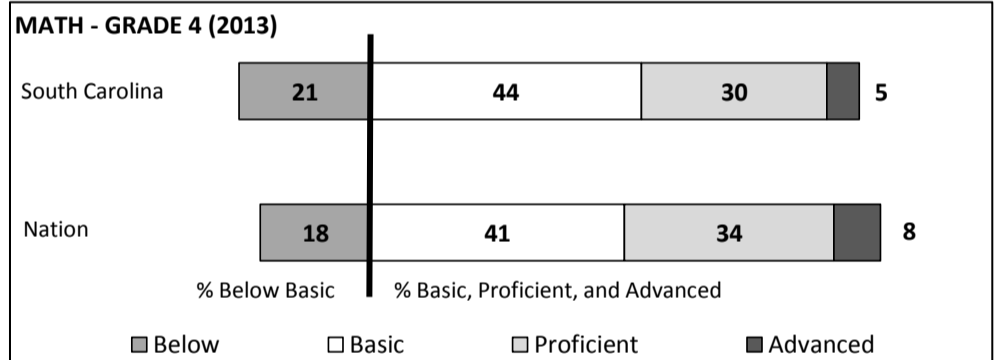
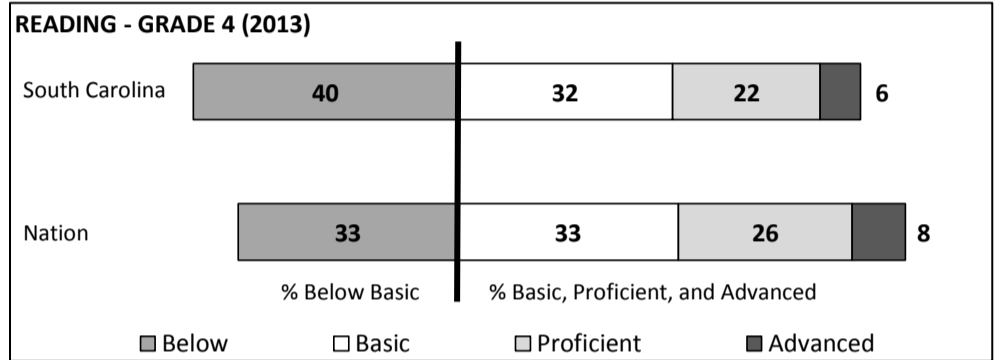
SC PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Johnston Elementary is creating a positive school culture where students and teachers believe "anything is possible" as long as we are focused in every aspect of the school setting while striving for academic excellence. We will continue to assess our strengths and weaknesses for school improvement. Johnston Elementary believes school improvement extends beyond doors of the classroom and affects the custodial staff, cafeteria staff, bus drivers, community, etc...We will continue to assess our goals and set new goals that will continue to help foster a positive school environment while focusing on student achievement, teacher quality, and parent involvement. In an effort to meet the needs of our students and teachers, we continue to review formative and summative data. MAP, PASS, AIMS Web, and teacher made assessments are used to help identify students that will benefit from specific small groups, reteaching, and after school tutoring. Every student at Johnston Elementary is scheduled to receive extra academic assistance in math and reading through our computer lab which uses the programs Study Island and Reading Eggs. Our students have access to a second computer lab to work on research projects. Through state funds we were able to purchase chrome books which allow our students to create power points for classroom projects. Our teachers are improving in the delivery of their instruction through The System for Teacher and Student Advancement which requires teachers to have 4 formal evaluations during the school year. Teachers receive feedback from the observations and work towards personal classroom goals based on data from observations. Teachers meet weekly with the school's Master Teacher during Tap Cluster for professional development. The district office also provide professional development opportunities for teachers throughout the year. Johnston Elementary hosted professional development for all elementary teachers in the district for the 2013-2014 school year. Teachers from Johnston presented the information for the professional development. Due to student achievement and teacher quality in the classroom, evidence of success at Johnston Elementary for the 2013-2014 school year was made public knowledge through our state report card. Our growth rating increased from average to excellent, our letter grade increased, and we were also recipients of the Palmetto Gold and Silver Awards. Our students are actively involved in the community by participating in Relay for Life, Can Food Drives, the Johnston Peach Blossom Festival, and the District Fine Arts Festival. Parental and community involvement is essential for the well-being of our school. Parents are invited to attend parent conferences, special events, PTO meetings, etc...Our PTO and school improvement council support our efforts to help move Johnston Elementary forward. Our efforts to improve the school's environment, student achievement, and teacher quality were evident throughout the year and we will continue to monitor and adjust to make Johnston Elementary successful.
