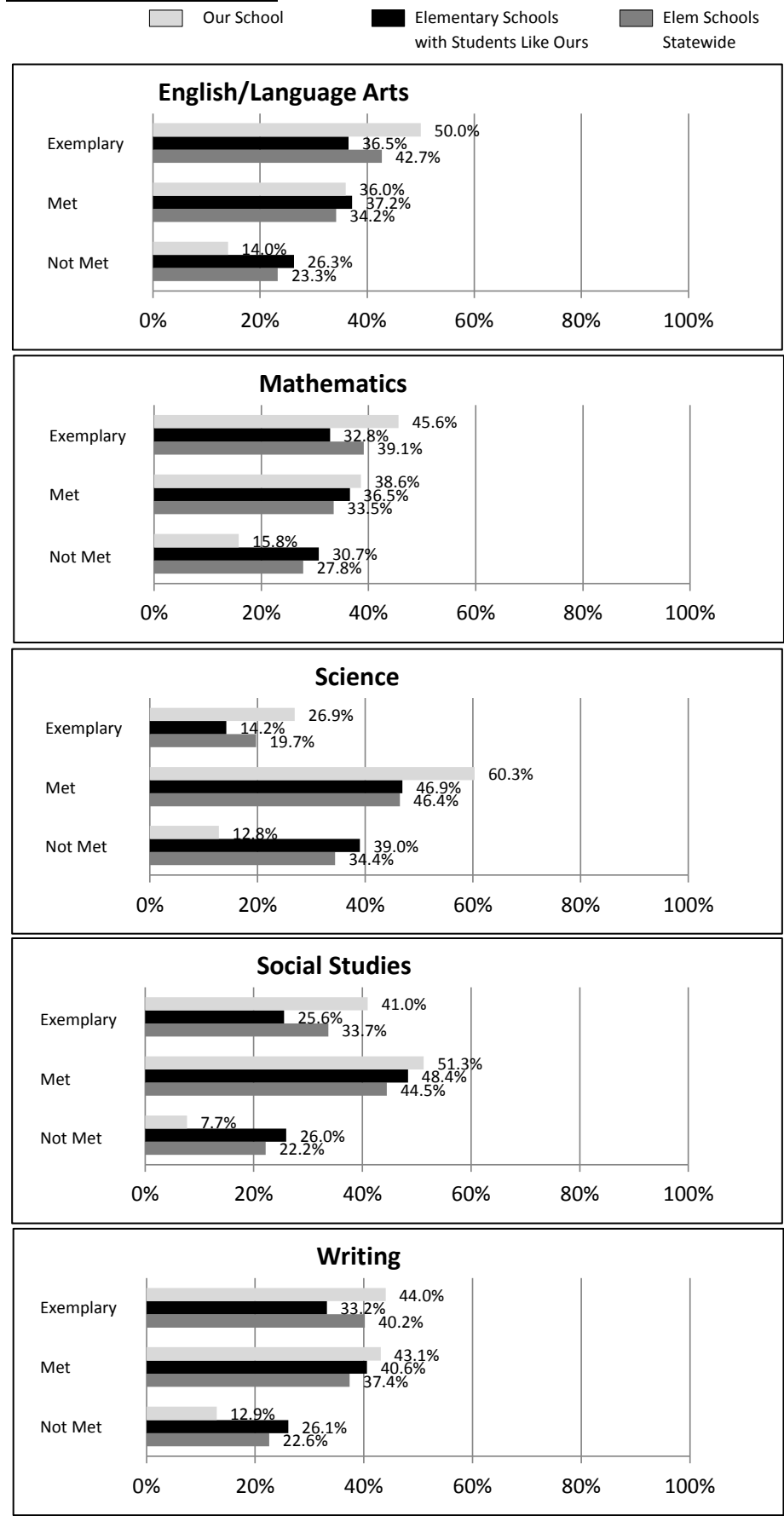

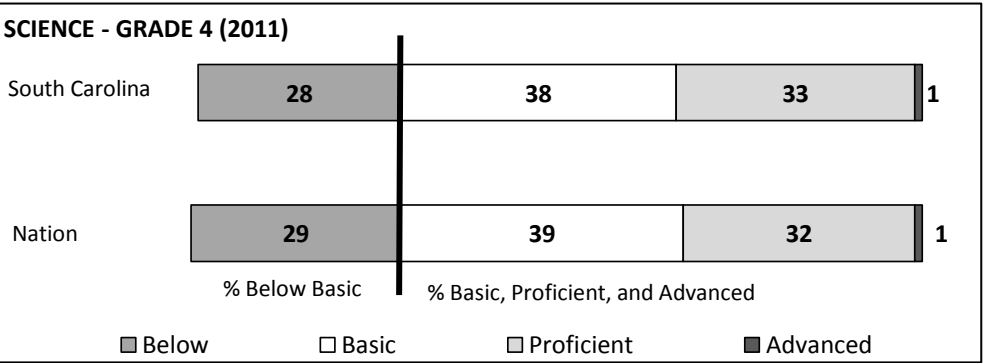

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Waterloo Elementary is a Title I school in Laurens School District 55 that is located approximately seven miles from downtown Laurens. The learning community at Waterloo is committed to providing all students with the education they need to be successful in life.

Student learning and success are the foundation for all activities and programs at Waterloo Elementary. Students are exposed to rich, interesting lessons on a daily basis. Students have the opportunity to participate in Math/Science Night, Literacy Night, Family Fun Night, Fall Festival, Career Expo, Student Success Night, a spring dance, and archery competitions at the local and state levels. Students are celebrated for their achievements frequently through MAP growth/achievement parties, a PASS pep rally, and our annual Awards Day program. Due to this focus on achievement, Waterloo has had the privilege of receiving Palmetto Gold and Silver Awards for Closing the Gap and Student Achievement. Waterloo was also designated as a grade A school for both the 2012 and 2013 school years. During the 2013-2014 school year, Waterloo was recognized as the Title I Distinguished School in South Carolina.

Waterloo Elementary is committed to serving the whole child. Therefore, students attend computer, media center, art, music, physical education, and guidance classes. Providing these classes for students allow them the opportunity to obtain the skills they will need to compete in the 21st century.

The faculty and staff believe that school is a place for not only student learning, but also adult learning. Teachers engage in collaborative planning sessions weekly with our instructional coach and administrative staff to ensure they are delivering age appropriate, standards-based lessons. In addition, teachers attend numerous professional development sessions after school as well as early release days during the school year to enhance their instructional knowledge and skills across content areas.

Building a strong home/school connection is essential to the growth of our young learners. Therefore, we invite parents to visit and participate in our school activities. Monthly activities are provided at varying times throughout year to ensure that parents have the opportunity to involve themselves in their child’s education.
