
Our School Elementary Schools with Students Like Ours Elem Schools Statewide






READING - GRADE 4 (2013)

The 2013-2014 school year at River Springs Elementary School proved to be another outstanding year of learning and growing for our staff and students. While the focus of the school has always been "working together to build the future," this was truly the case this year as we joined together as a faculty to learn more about the area of writing. In the spring of 2013, the faculty came together to determine that the focus of the 2013-2014 school year would be on the writing process for all students in kindergarten through fifth grade. The staff chose a specific curriculum that would allow the teachers to grow as professionals as well as hold the students to high expectations with regard to academic writing. Each month, the faculty came together for professional study around a specific genre of writing. Teachers studied how to teach students specific elements of writing such as elaboration and craft, while weaving writing into all academic areas. Through intentional planning of writing lessons combined with authentic writing practice and assessment, our students have improved in writing in all content areas. Our students have practiced writing in many forms this year, and we are excited to see how their growth in writing continues to flourish in the years to come. [¶](#)

This year also brought the third year of our PTO's focus on health and wellness for our students. In the past three years, our PTO has donated in excess of \$100,000 to improve our playground facilities and has started a school running club. Both of these have made a tremendous impact on our students, and we look forward to seeing the impact this will have on our students in the future.
