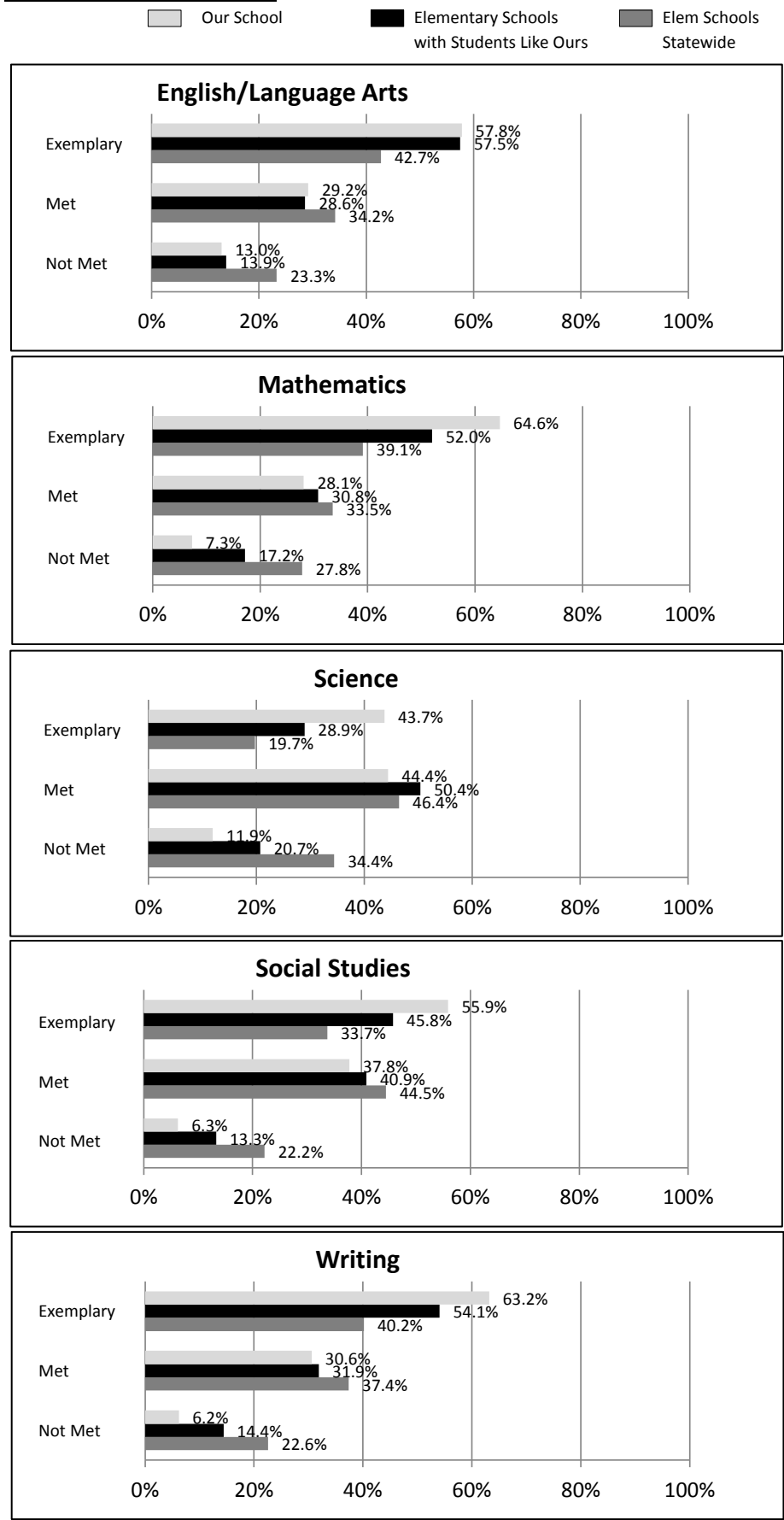

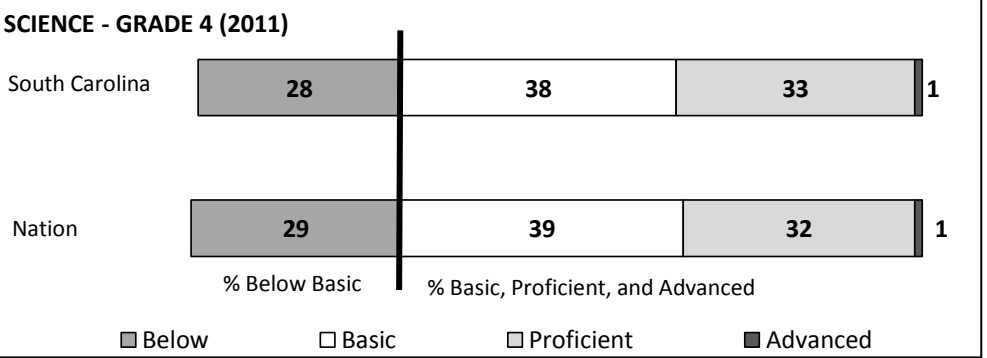

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Little Mountain Elementary, an historical community school strongly supported by parental and community involvement, is the educational setting for 411 “Winning Wildcats.” Our school was recognized for receiving the Palmetto Gold Award for general performance and the Palmetto Silver for closing the achievement gap. LME’s South Carolina Elementary and Secondary Education Act Waiver score is a 99.9 out of 100. Our leadership and data analysis team uses data results from PASS, MAP, Dominie, and other formative classroom assessments to carefully make strategic decisions such as offering small group intensive reading intervention for at-risk students in grades K-5, integrating a balanced literacy program, and offering hands-on experiences in math and science. Exemplary character and high academic expectations for students are maintained through Positive Behavioral Intervention and Supports (PBIS) program. The consistency of this program is seen throughout the school with school-wide expectations in the classrooms, hallways, cafeteria, auditorium, and on the bus. ☒

At LME we put our best “PAWS” forward: Personal Best, Act Responsibly, Work and Play Safely, Show Respect. School-wide events are offered through the collaboration of school personnel, PTO, and SIC members. Some of those events offered this year were Lemonade on the Lawn; focusing on community support, The Rowdie Run, and our 1st Annual Wildcat Run 5k, each event highlighting staying healthy; focusing on fitness, leadership, and character; a family math night, featuring: This is ‘Nacho’ Average Family Math Night, and a family skate night. LME offers various after school clubs for our upper grade levels which include the Running Club, the Geography Club, the Book Club, and an Archery Team. LME hosted its 1st Annual National Geographic Bee. Our students are encouraged to participate and learn about various community services which include: collecting non-perishable food for The Pomaria Food Bank, Relay for Life, and Pennies for Patients. Our school family was directly impacted with the deployment involving three of our fathers, our student body collected items and created care packages for our personal soldiers and for soldiers unknown. We had twenty students that were invited and participated in the Math Olympiad program several mathletes won national awards for excellence with Division E for grades 4 through 6. LME had two students recognized for perfect PASS scores in math. ☒

Our Veteran’s Day Program, Goodies for Grands, Muffins for Moms, and Doughnuts for Dads are some of the events that took place at LME to thank our supporting community. Our school has one teacher that serves on the CERRA’s advisory board.☒
