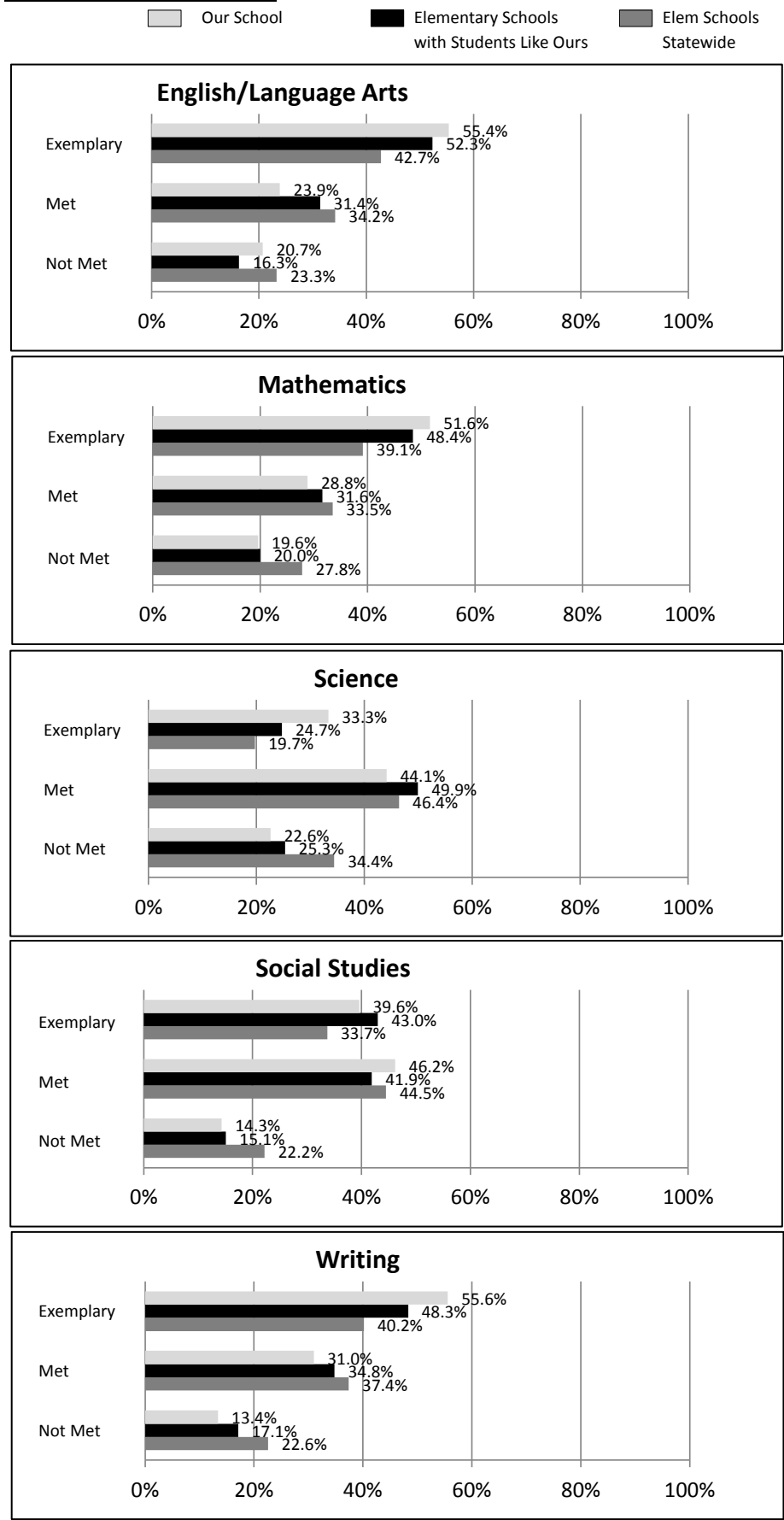

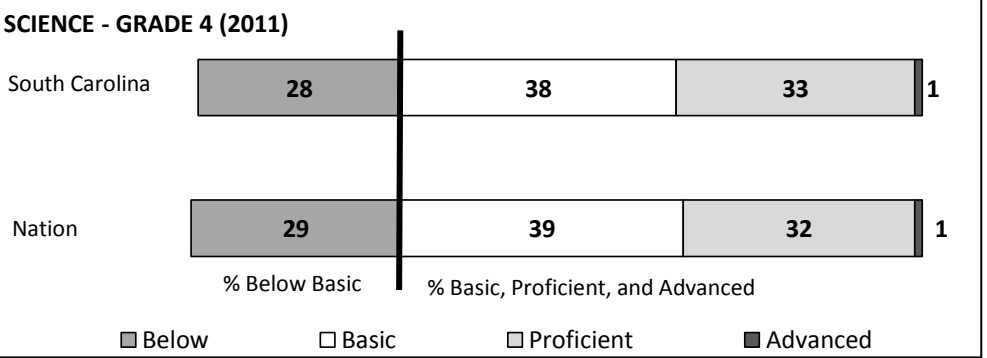

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Boiling Springs Elementary has had another fantastic year. We have many accomplishments to celebrate for the 2013-2014 school year. We are proud to announce that BSES earned an "Excellent" rating for the second year in a row. We were also awarded the Palmetto Gold for academic performance.

Several students received individual recognitions, during the year, for their accomplishments. Students were recognized through our BSES spelling bee, one student received the "I Am Achiever" Award, eight of our third grade students placed in the Regional Science Fair, five students were recognized as Red Ribbon Contest winners, and each nine weeks students were recognized through our Terrific Kid program. BSES students also raised money for community service projects such as Jump Rope for Heart and Relay for Life. This year we raised over \$7,500 for Relay for Life alone.

Boiling Springs Elementary School faculty members also received recognition this year. Matt Johnson, 3rd grade teacher, was named Boiling Springs Elementary Teacher of the Year and Spartanburg District Two Teacher of the Year. The McDonald’s McCreative Arts Grant was awarded to our fine arts department again this year. Ten of our teachers received Donor's Choose grants to enhance hands on instruction in the classroom. These grants accounted for over \$12,000 in extra money. Katie Farr, a kindergarten teacher, received the Target Field trip grant which assisted in funding an extra field trip for our K5 students.

School events including Parent University, Doughnuts for Dads, Muffins for Moms, Family Fun Night, Goodies for Grandparents, our Fall Carnival, and grade level music programs provided opportunities for families to visit our school. An awareness of health and fitness was strengthened through a Family Health and Fitness Night. Boiling Springs Elementary is going to continue our partnership with The First Tee of Spartanburg in providing a program focusing on character education through golf.

Parents and our school community are essential in our continued success. We are very fortunate to have such an involved group of PTA members and dedicated volunteers to provide support in many ways. The students, staff, parents, and community of Boiling Springs Elementary continue to fulfill our motto of Building Student Excellence and Success.
