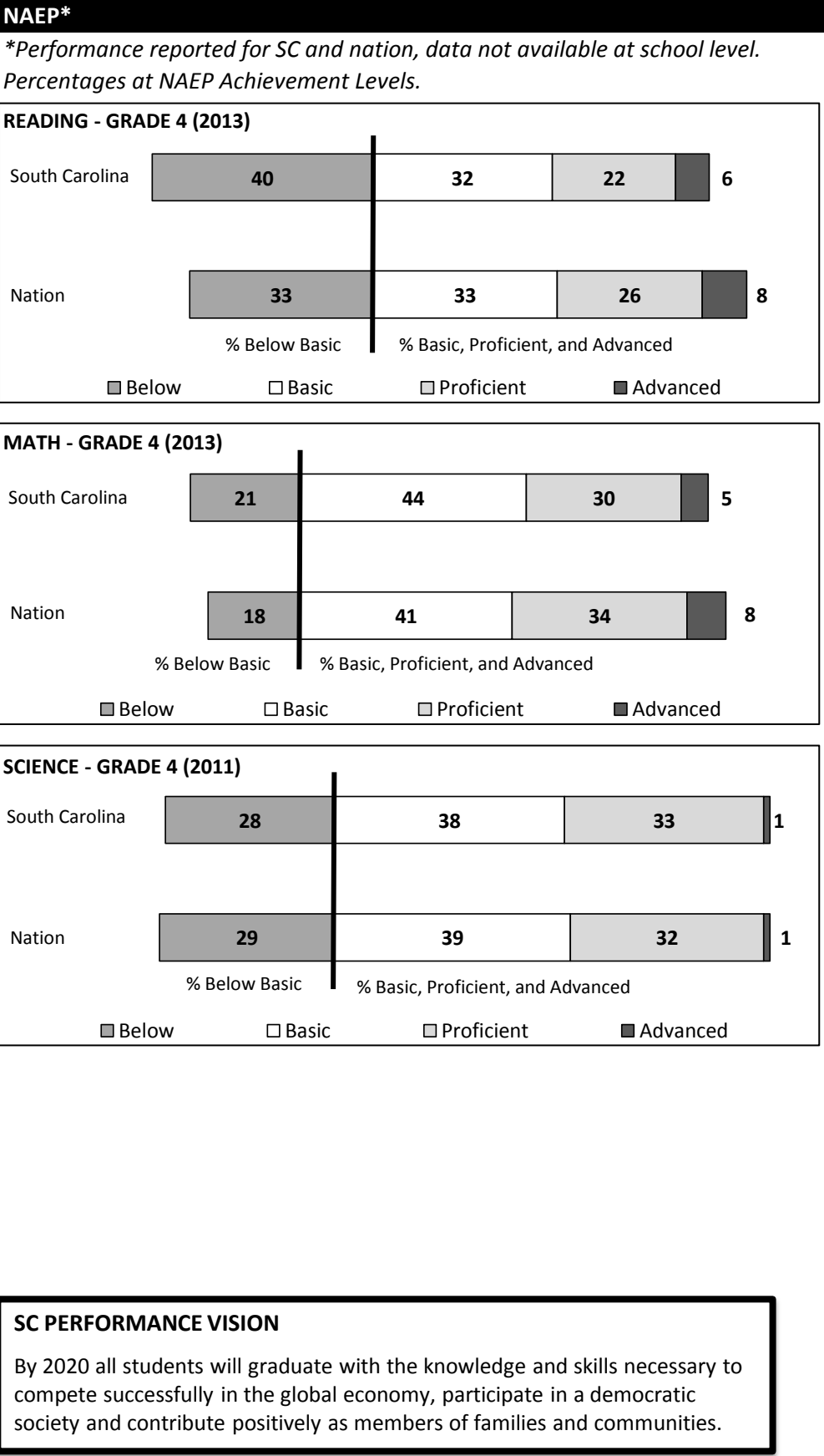
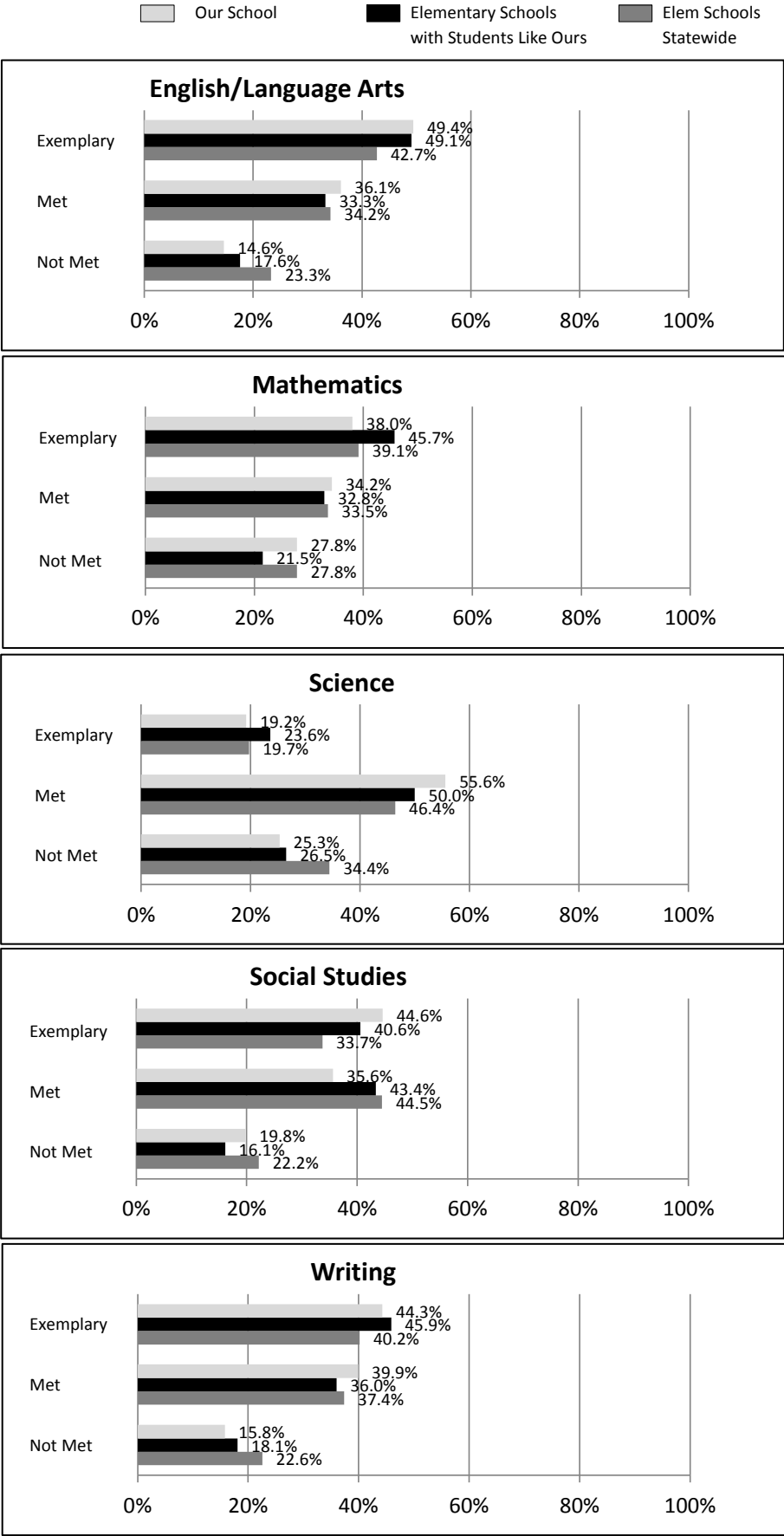

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The mission of Mayo Elementary School is to prepare our students for tomorrow’s world through challenging and innovative educational practices in a safe and supportive environment. Our vision is to create a safe and enriched learning environment that promotes “showing respect, owning one’s actions, achieving 21st century skills, and reaching one’s full potential in order to be college and career ready.” Our faculty, administration, and staff work in unison to foster each child’s academic and personal growth, community spirit, and enthusiasm toward learning. We focus on the South Carolina content standards and enrich the curriculum through depth, complexity, and differentiation to ensure each student reaches his or her full potential.

Our school utilizes technology to communicate with parents and community. Our school webpages, social media, School Messenger System, and Parent Portal facilitate the sharing of information with students and parents.

Parents provide strong support to our school through their involvement in programs and activities, such as Open House, School Improvement Council, PTO, Literacy Night, and Math and Science Fun Night. We welcome parent engagement as a way to strengthen home and school communications. Parents and teachers working together as a team is the surest way of ensuring that our students gain the most from their educational experiences.

Students are regularly recognized for demonstrating positive behavior in school as part of PBIS. Our students also participate in community outreach projects, such as collecting canned goods for local food pantries, raising money for St. Jude’s Research Hospital with a Math-a-thon, and the collection of can tabs and supplies for the Spartanburg Humane Society. Students are encouraged to participate in special activities to help them develop academically, socially, and emotionally, such as the Falcon Safety Patrol, Princi-Pals, Junior Beta Club, Terrific Kids, Spelling Bee, and Life-skill Leaders. Our goal is to help our students develop as independent thinkers, effective communicators, and lifelong learners with personal responsibility and good moral character.

Academically, Mayo students received recognition for their achievements throughout the year, including the National Beta Club School of Distinction Award and induction into the Greenville Drive Reading All-Stars Hall of Fame.
