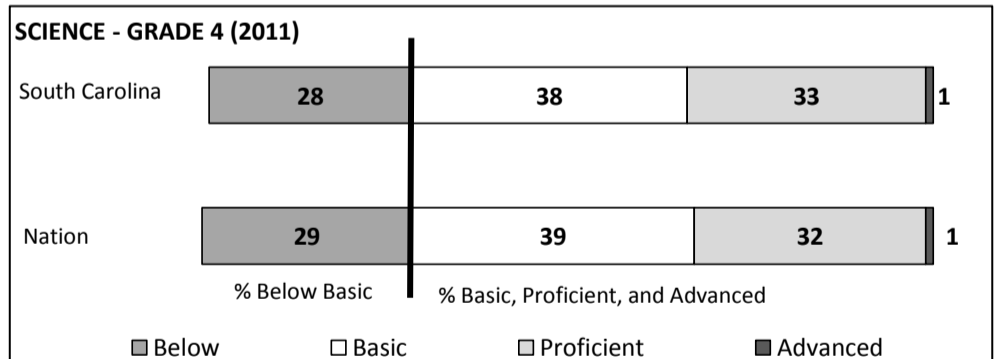
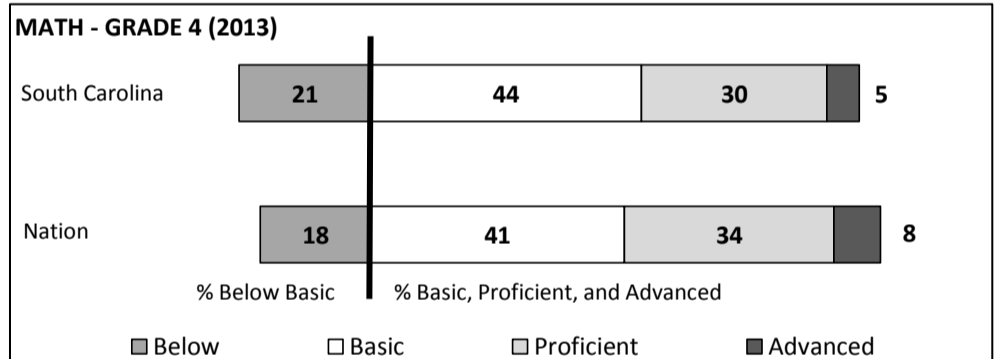
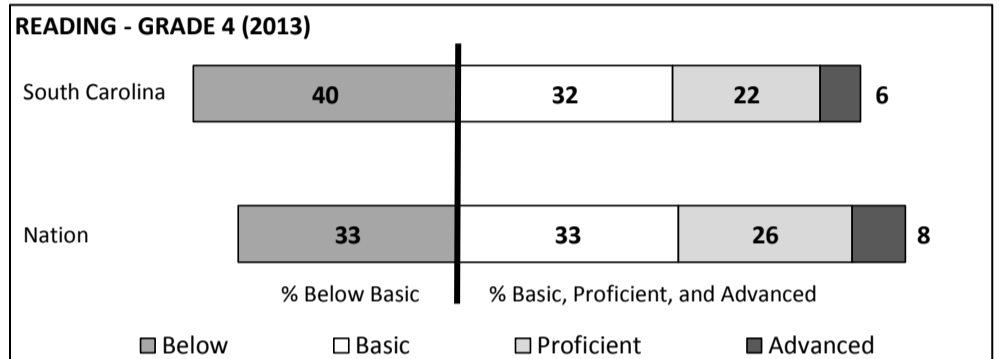
SC PASS PERFORMANCE
