Report of Principal and School

Hartsville High School (HHS) continued to provide outstanding educational opportunities to our students during the 2013-14 school year, maintaining focus on our mission of “Preparing for the Future by Learning Every Day.” The Red Fox Renaissance, now in its tenth year, continues to develop pride and support among our students, their parents, local business and industry, and our community.☐

Our school encourages students, faculty, and staff to serve the community in various capacities, as most school organizations have students complete annual service hours. Students also give back to community and school through participating in food drives, donating to the Prom Closet, assisting with Relay for Life, and packing Hunger Busters Bags for elementary students. In addition to these opportunities, HHS clubs and organizations work closely with local schools and businesses to help with field days, blood and clothing drives, seasonal carnivals, and recycling efforts. HHS is first among Pee Dee and Grand Strand area high schools for units of blood collected for the American Red Cross. Also, as a part of the International Baccalaureate (IB) curriculum, full IB diploma students complete Community Action Service (CAS) hours. ☐

Hartsville High School has been recognized by the SC Department of Education (SCDE) and the Education Oversight Committee (EOC) as a 2013-14 Palmetto Gold Award winner in both General Performance and Closing Achievement Gap. General Performance reflects Absolute and Growth ratings on the school report card, and Closing Achievement Gap reflects on-time high school graduation rates of students belonging to historically underachieving groups. Hartsville High School has 16 International Baccalaureate (IB) full diploma candidates and 23 IB certificate candidates in 2014. Our IB students exceeded International Average Scores in three areas, History of the Americas HL, Math Studies SL, and Music SL. The percentage of HHS students who passed IB Courses (80.1%) exceeded the percentage of IB students world-wide who passed IB Courses (78.54%). ☐

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Our students also continued to develop talents and achieve at high levels in a variety of extra-curricular activities. The HHS Red Regime marching band finished fifth in the AAA Lower State Marching Championship, the HHS Jazz Messengers earned a Superior Rating at the SC Band Director’s Association Jazz Band Festival, and the HHS Indoor Percussion won its second consecutive state championship in its division. Six chorus students earned Superior ratings at the SC Solo and Ensemble Competition, ten others achieved Excellent ratings, and one singer made All-State Chorus for the second consecutive year. 2013 Region 6-AAA championships were won by Red Fox baseball, softball, boys’ soccer, girls’ soccer, boys’ golf, volleyball, wrestling, and the football team was a region co-champion. Six HHS athletes were named to All-State teams.☐

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the Federal High and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
