Report of Principal and School

The mission of Seneca Senior High School focuses on excellence in academics, arts, and athletics. Our outstanding faculty, staff, and student body took many steps in moving our mission forward during the 2013-2014 school year. ¶

The Class of 2014 graduated 201 seniors who will represent SHS at more than forty colleges and universities with 85% of the senior class indicating they will attend college or enter the military. Fifteen seniors received the prestigious Palmetto Fellowship; 126 seniors qualified for LIFE Scholarships; 60 seniors received HOPE Scholarships; and 75% earned Platinum Honor Cords. The Class of 2014 received an impressive \$12.1 million in scholarship money, and boasted a National Merit Scholar as well as 8 students qualifying for State Academic Diploma Awards. Students participated in fourteen Advanced Placement courses, and we witnessed significant increases in EOCEP scores again this year, as well as maintaining gains in our HSAP scores. Our FFA program received the Gold Chapter Award for the second year in a row, an impressive honor indicating numerous quality, service-oriented activities. ¶

The Fine Arts Department continues to be recognized as one of the finest in the state. The Womens Honors Chorus and the Honors Chorale continues to rank in the top three choral programs in the State of South Carolina, while designating thirty-nine SHS vocalists to the SC All-State Chorus. Our Strings Program received all Superior ratings this year and our Band Program continues to enjoy growth in both numbers and in pride for its program. ¶

Seneca Bobcat athletics also continue to excel. Several of our athletic teams once again advanced to the State Play-Offs. The SHS Girls' Softball Team and our Boys' Soccer Team won the Western I-AAA Region Title for the second year in a row. Numerous Bobcat student-athletes were named to All-Conference Teams and also to All-State Teams. ¶

We are very proud of our students' many fine accomplishments in academics, arts, and athletics and we are equally eager and excited about upcoming Bobcat accomplishments in 2014-2015! ¶

This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
