Report of Principal and School

Dear Branchville High School Students, Parents, Teachers, Concerned Citizens and School Board Members,

Branchville High School (BHS) serves the Branchville area of Orangeburg County as a 7-12 school with an approximately 284 student body located in a rural setting. The faculty and staff of BHS is made up of dedicated individuals who have high expectations for all students to learn and grow in a positive, safe and warm educational environment. We believe all students can learn and that parents should be involved in the education of their children. Our goal is to educate students who will be prepared to either excel in post-secondary education, be productive in the workforce, and become lifelong learners.

Branchville High School has had many academic successes this year. During the 2012-2013 school year BHS was rated EXCELLENT in the absolute score on the SC State report card. We saw gains in our 2012-2013 HSAP scores and an increase of over 20% in our 2013-2014 End of Course test scores in English 1, Algebra 1, Biology, and United States History. Branchville High School had 83% of the 2013-2014 senior class accepted into post-secondary education with 67% of the class eligible for the Life Scholarship. During the 2013-2014 school year, we introduced a new virtual software program for our students called Edgenuity. In the 2013-2014 school year BHS also added to the staff a mental health counselor through a partnership with Orangeburg County Mental Health. The high school students, had an outstanding performance of The Ransom of Red Chief, under the direction of Mrs. Toni Ott. Branchville Middle School had an absolute rating of Average for the 2012-2013 school year, but did see some gains made on the MAP Math and ELA scores from the previous year. This year(2013-2014) Branchville Middle School has seen a gain in the growth rating and an increase in the PASS math and writing scores.

The Varsity Volleyball team, under the coaching of Ron Nester, won the lower state championship for the 4th year in a row and the Varsity Soccer team, under the coaching of Craig Porter, made the semifinals of the lower state for the second year in a row. In 2013-2014 BHS was ranked 9th in athletics for the South Carolina 1A region. Branchville High School had 5 seniors who signed letters of intent to play college athletics in a variety of sports. At the end of the 2013-2014 school year the staff selected Lori Williams as BHS Support Staff Person of the Year and Lillie Dunning as BHS Teacher of the Year.

The two mottos that we, at Branchville, believe in is "Only the Best at BHS" and "Branchville is a Rayl Rode School (RRS) Respect, Responsibility, and Safety". BHS must provide students with academic rigor, relevance, relationships, and fun to be successful for the future. Through the combined efforts of students, parents and teachers, Branchville High School strives to help all students reach their full potential. We encourage all students to build positive memories while preparing to be productive citizens for the future.

This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years. 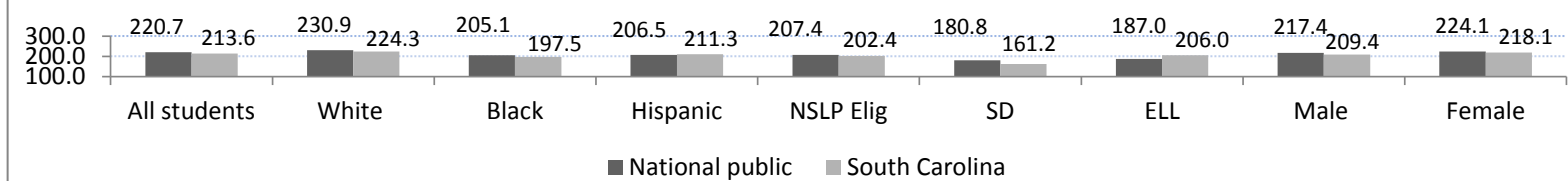

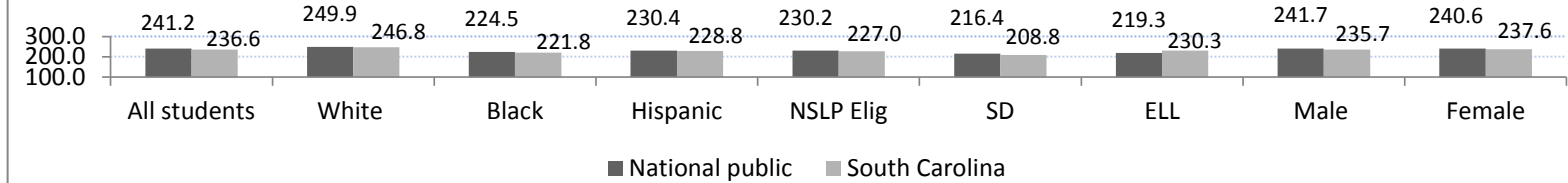

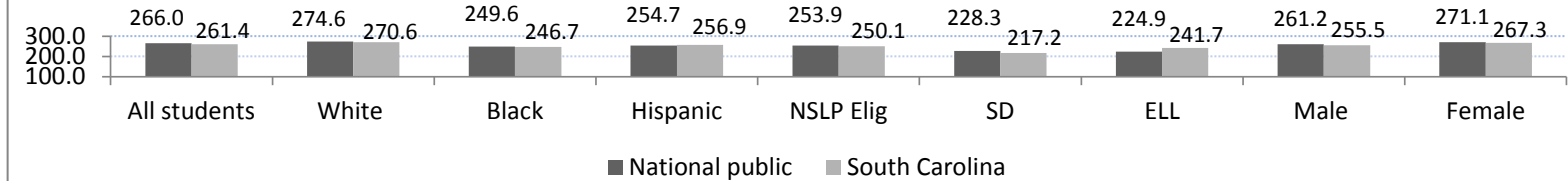
Reading - Grade 4 (2013)



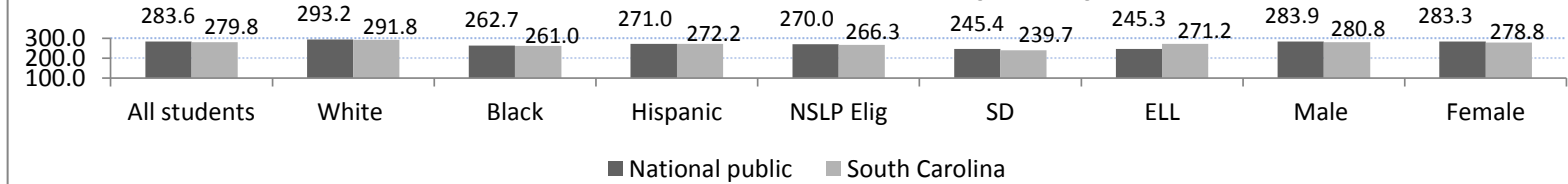
Mathematics - Grade 4 (2013)
