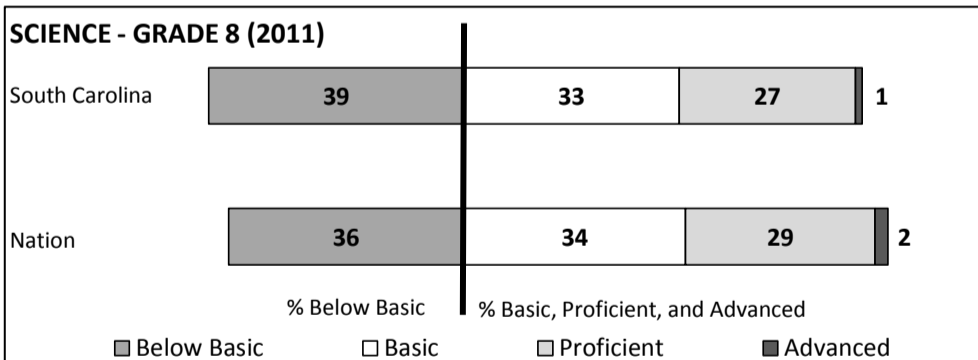
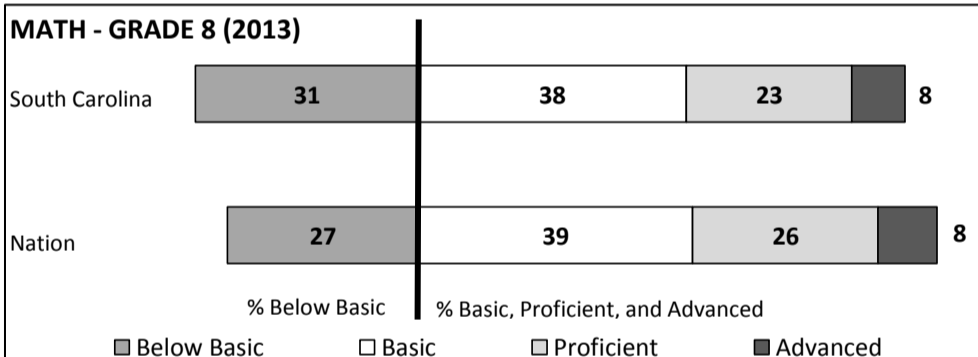
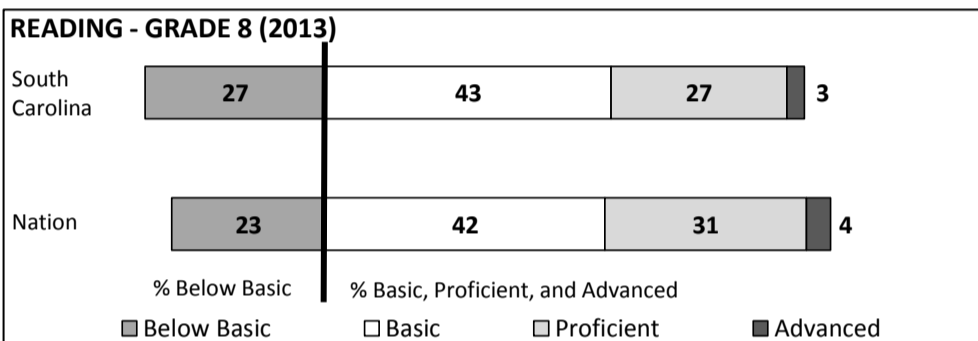

The extracurricular programs at Lamar High School add the finishing touch needed to provide a well rounded educational experience for our students.☒

Among the numerous academic accomplishments of the Lamar High Silver Foxes, during the 2013-14 school year were the following: 36% of our students made the honor roll each quarter, 47% received awards at the annual academic ceremony, 21% of the graduating class were vocational completers, 23% of the graduating class met the grade point average and class rank requirements for the Life Scholarship, and over \$1,132,000.00 in scholarship money was offered to members of the class of 2014. Our expected graduation rate in 2013 was 93.8%. ☒
