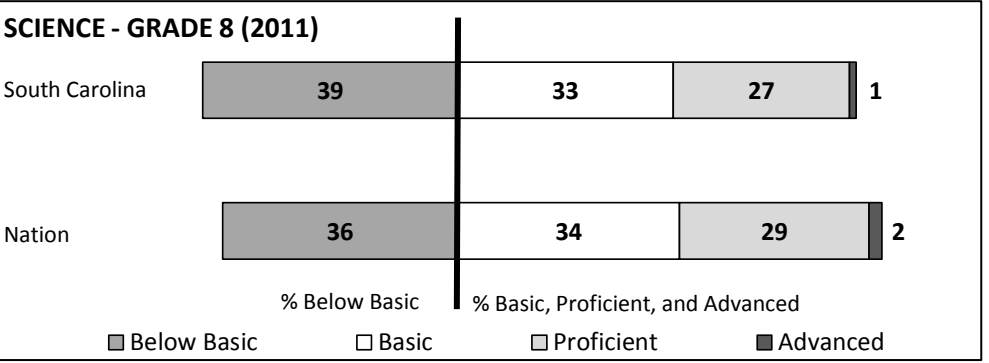
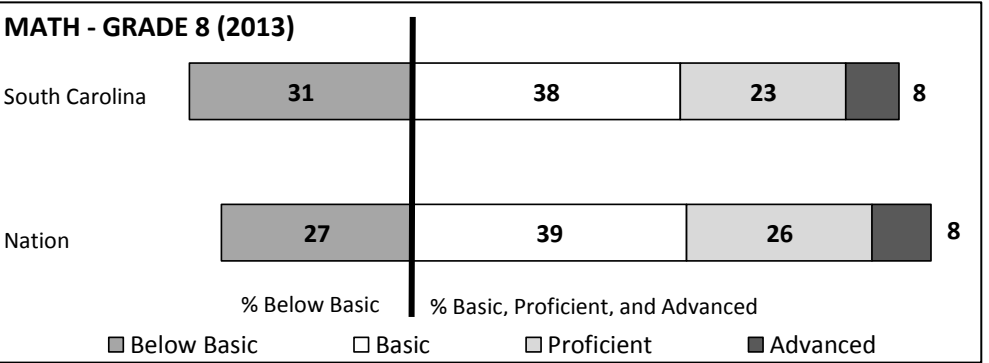
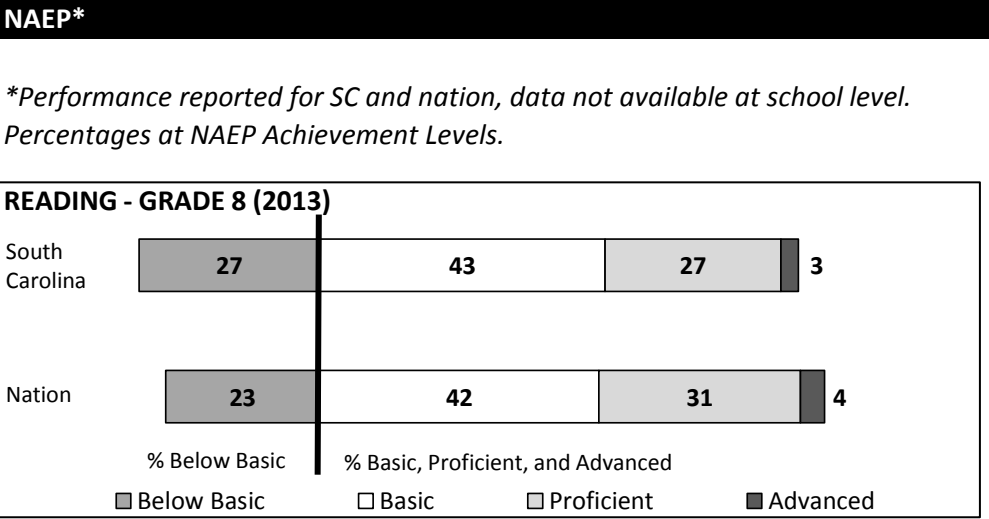

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The Boiling Springs High School 2013-2014 school year was a time of technology integration into the curriculum and innovative teaching strategies to ensure that the children of our school community continued to receive a world class education. Teachers and administrators continued working closely with the Spartanburg County School District Two Instructional Office to sharpen our skills in the areas of New State Standards and curriculum delivery methods. Parents continued to be involved in the school in a very positive way. Most importantly, students came to school ready-to-learn and thus discovered a new world of opportunity each and every day!

Our teachers continued participating in staff development activities which enabled them to implement strategies in their classrooms that would allow students to use technology to enhance their achievement. Teachers also continued working on the implementation of the New State Standards to ensure that our students are college and career ready when they graduate. Continuous analysis of our data allowed teachers to make data driven instructional and curriculum decisions that would lead to the academic growth of our students. It is our belief that these staff development activities will reap major benefits for our students for years to come.

Our student achievements in various areas were extremely exciting for us! The 2014 Senior Class garnered 12.3 million dollars toward their postsecondary educational endeavors. This was a tremendous amount of scholarship dollars to be received by our graduating class at Boiling Springs High School. We had five students who won the prestigious South Carolina Teaching Fellows Award, which was the second most in our school's history. Our Advanced Placement scores were outstanding; 88.4% of our students who challenged the AP tests scored a 3 or above. Our 2013-2014 Bulldog Marching Band finished the season ranked at 26th in national competition. Most excitingly, Our Boys Golf Team finished the season as the 2014 South Carolina 4A Boys Golf Champions. Additionally, the Boys Golf Coach was honored as the 2014 4A Boys Golf Coach of the Year. For the second time in 3 years, we had a weightlifter to secure a state championship. Twenty-two student athletes received athletic scholarships to their chosen colleges. We are very excited about our students' accomplishments and achievements at Boiling Springs High School.🏆

We are truly fortunate to have tremendous support from our parents and our extended educational community. It is our intent to continue to evolve in a positive way so that we may be the BEST school in the State of South Carolina for the children of our community. With a well-intended and coordinated effort, we will continue to “Strive to be the BEST” we can be for our children.
