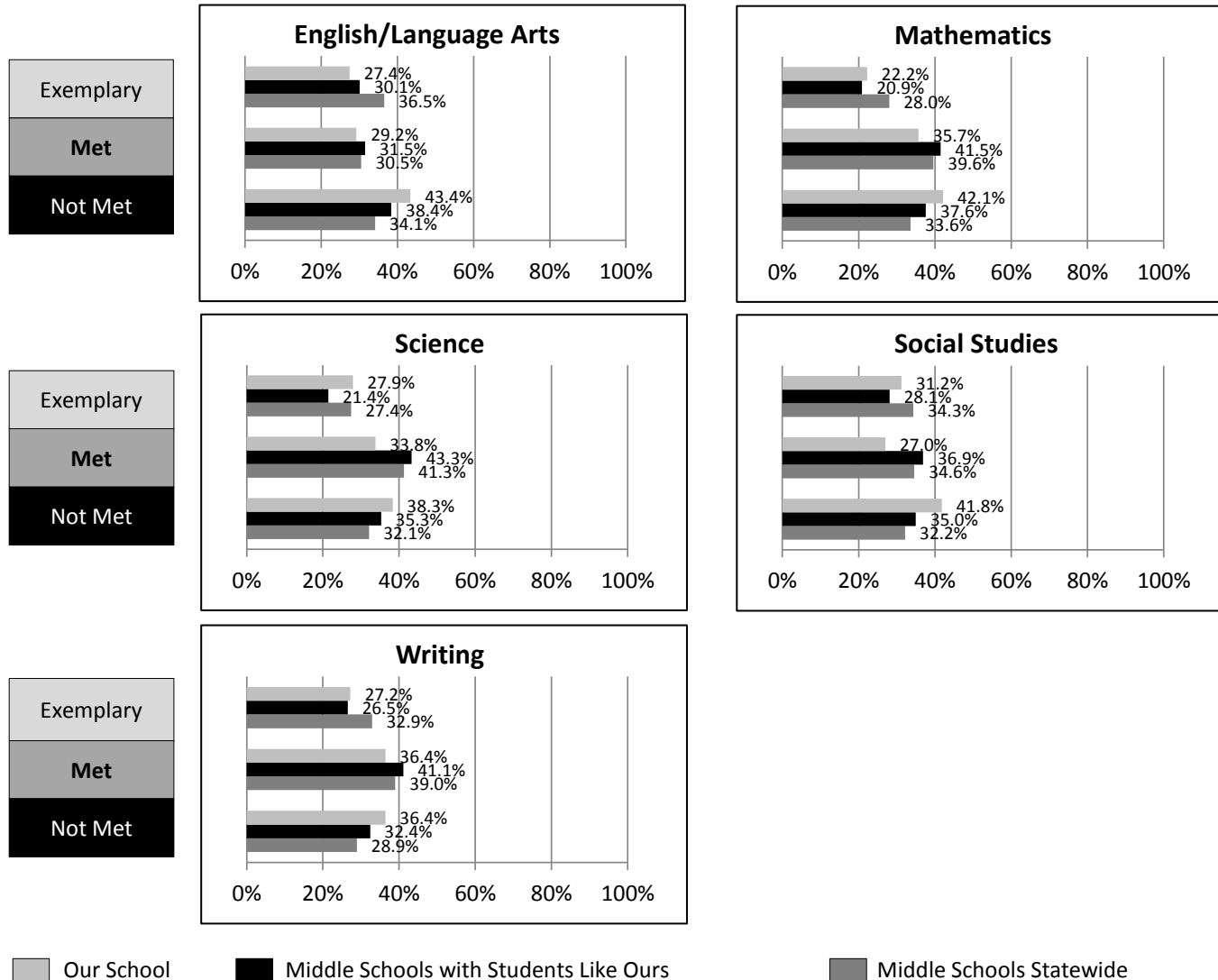

At GBMS, we recognize that middle level students experience great changes intellectually, socially, emotionally, and physically during the years between elementary and high school. We have dedicated and caring staff members who are committed to helping students successfully transition through these years. Besides the core-curriculum, we offer programs to meet the unique needs of young adolescent learners, such as computer/keyboarding, art, music, band, and physical education. There are multiple extra-curricular and co-curricular offerings for students, as well. ☐

GBMS is proud of the following accomplishments during the 2013-2014 school year: Four students were named Junior Scholars while two were honored as Duke Scholars. Our Algebra I class served 21 eighth grade students while our English I class served 26 students. The Junior Beta Club activities and service learning projects included: attending the Jr. Beta Club convention in Myrtle Beach, SC and inducting 60 new members for a total of 98 members. One of our eighth grade students placed second in a math competition held at the Junior Beta Club Convention. Student Council activities and projects included: 1) Honoring teachers during Teacher Appreciation Week and American Education Week 2) Participating in the Homecoming parade 3) Sponsoring the Mister and Miss GBMS Pageant 4) Service Learning Projects included: holding Thanksgiving and Christmas celebrations at Barnwell County Nursing Home as well as assisting students with Special Olympics 5) Coordinating Red Ribbon Week, Spirit Week, and SCPASS Prep Rally 6) Student Council officers conducted daily announcements and recited the school pledge. SIC and PTSO members sponsored a Parent Bingo Night that correlated with the school dance. Students, faculty, and staff participated in Relay for Life fundraising event. The school enjoyed excellent athletic seasons in which many students participated in middle school and high school level sports. GBMS girls' basketball team won the region tournament championship. The band program served 59 students which feeds into the high school program. A school-wide Spelling Bee was held and the school winner participated in the Regional Spelling Bee in Allendale, SC. Seventh and eighth grade students participated in the Science Fair. School winners participated in the regional Science Fair in Aiken, SC. All students participated in the Science Day program. Presenters worked in science, technology, engineering, and math related fields, such as engineers from SRS and Kimberly-Clark.) Students created, implemented, and integrated "Thinking Maps" into their daily instruction. Seventh grade students went on a field study to Washington, DC and presented a PowerPoint presentation of the study to the school board. The GBMS drama club presented two performances titled "A Christmas Carol" performed in the winter and "What Happened After Once Upon A Time", which was performed in the spring. War Pony prizes were given to students who exhibited good behavior, good/improved grades, and good citizenship. Pride Pass incentives were given each nine weeks to students who demonstrated outstanding character and citizenship. A school dance was held to celebrate students who passed the nine weeks benchmark examination. Partnership established with B& B Ford of Barnwell to recognize GBMS "Students of the Month." Partnerships established with Hagood Baptist Church and local United Way to support GBMS beautification. Anti-Bullying Seminar held for seventh and eighth grade students during the school year. The faculty, staff, and students at GBMS will work vigorously to ensure an environment that is respectful, safe, clean, and conducive to learning on a daily basis.☐

### Reading - Grade 4 (2013)



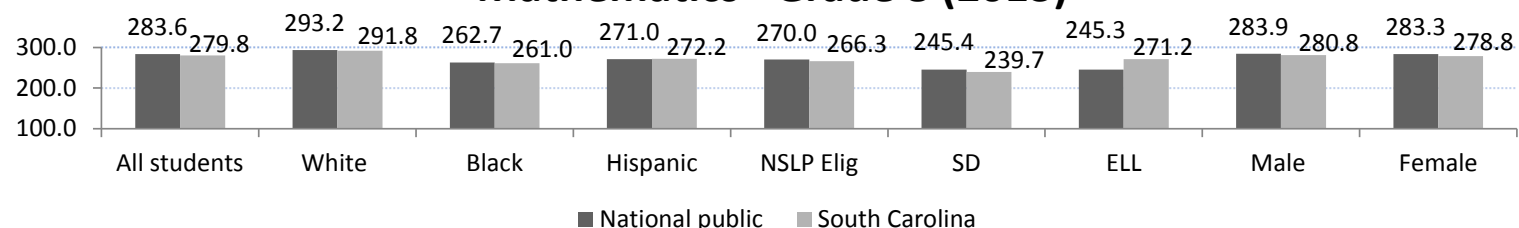
### Mathematics - Grade 4 (2013)
