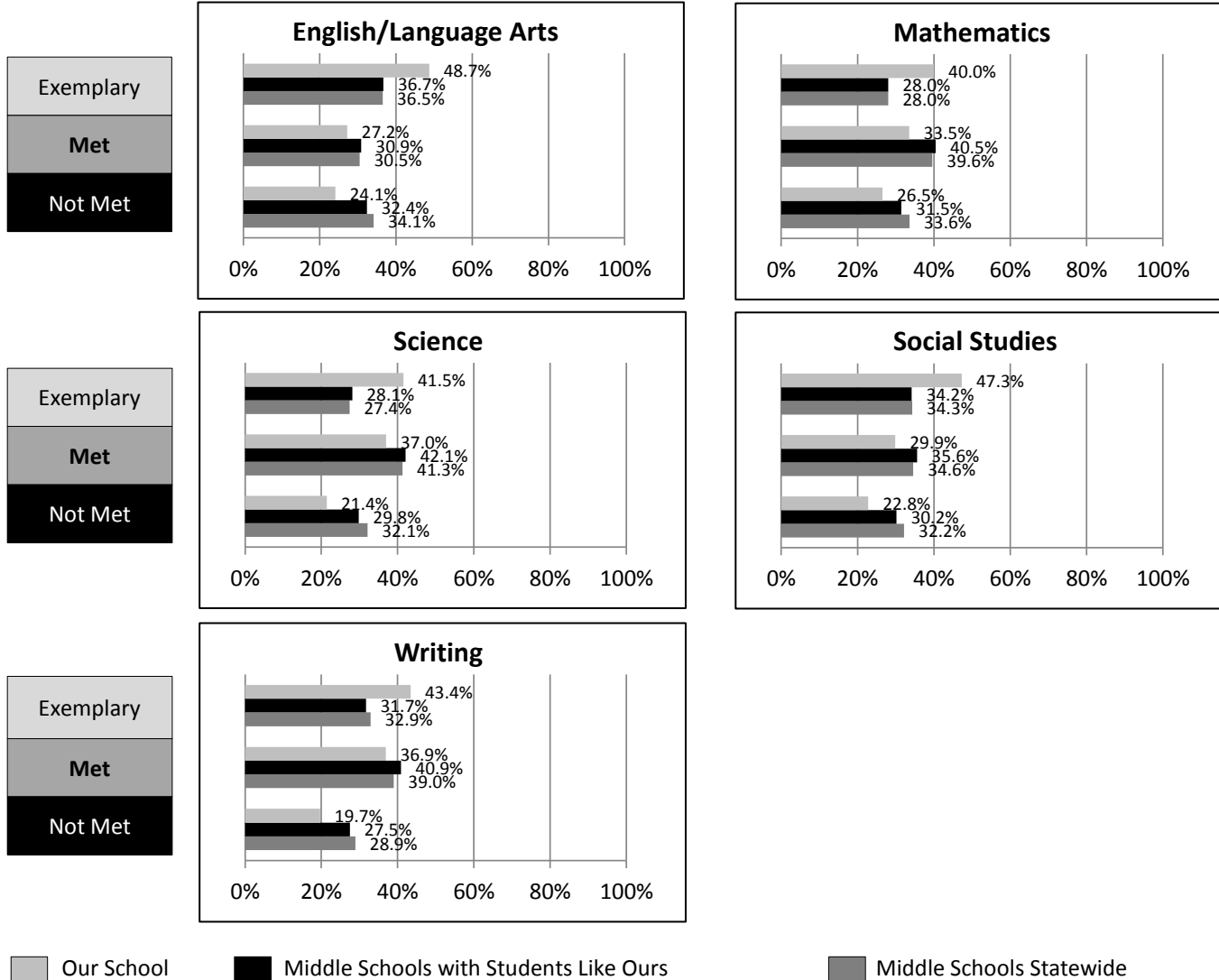

North Myrtle Beach Middle School’s students and staff are proud of the accomplishments they have made during the 2013–2014 school year.

☐

Forty-six students have been designated as South Carolina Junior Scholars based on their performance on the PSAT. Sixty-one students have been designated as Explore Scholars based on Explore testing, and two seventh grade students have qualified as Duke Tip Scholars based on their performance on the SAT. The school inducted 165 students into Junior Beta Club based on their academic achievement.

☐

The school had 39 students in the Fine Arts area who qualified for All-County events. Five students were selected for All-County Band, 11 students were selected for All-County Orchestra, and 23 students were selected for All-County Chorus.

☐

The school continues to offer a strong academic program. Qualifying students are offered the opportunity to earn high school credit in Algebra I, Geometry, English I, Keyboarding, and Computer Applications. Our End-of-Course (EOC) testing results for 2013 show that our students had a 100% passing rate in English I and a 99% passing rate in Algebra I.

NMB Middle continues a school-wide focus on literacy across the curriculum. The “Language!” program serves students in English Language Arts classes who need an intensive language arts program, and the “Read 180” program serves students who need some additional support in the area of language arts. The school began two new initiatives this year: Personalized Digital Learning and Blended Learning. The Personalized Digital Learning (PDL) initiative has provided each student with an iPad and the Blended Learning initiative has provided training for teachers on designing classrooms that facilitate students working in small groups or independently with the goal of tailoring instruction to meet their needs and engage students in their learning.

We continue to have a strong transition program for our eighth grade students as they prepare for high school. Cluster area meetings were held in the fall to inform parents of the program choices available for rising 9th grade students. This early information assisted our guidance counselors, parents, and students in the development of students’ individualized graduation plans (IGPs) based on their ninth grade program choices.

North Myrtle Beach Middle has received an “All Clear” accreditation status from the South Carolina State Department of Education for the 2013-2014 school year and continues to be accredited through the Southern Association of Schools and Colleges.

This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
