

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## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Wallace Elementary/Middle School (WEMS) continued to provide a positive learning experience for its students. During the 2013 – 2014 school year, the school received several awards for student performance. The South Carolina Department of Education awarded the Palmetto Silver in academic growth and the Palmetto Silver for closing the achievement gap to WEMS. This is the fourth year in a row that the school has received a Palmetto Gold or Silver Award. Twelve WEMS students participated in the Sandhills Regional Science Fair and one of those students received second place honors. Three of the teachers received DonorsChoose grants and one of our teachers received an Adopt a Classroom grant. These grants provided books, musical instruments, technology, and art equipment for our students.

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Early-release Tuesdays continued to ensure a focused approach to our staff's professional development. The Wallace Elementary Middle School Teacher of the Year was chosen as a positive representative of the highly qualified teachers employed at the school.

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Our athletic program continued to compete in all areas including, basketball (boys and girls), softball (girls), baseball (boys), football (boys) and cheerleading (girls). The softball team won the Marlboro County Tournament and Regular Season Championship. The Academy for Physical Fitness and Healthy Living began its fourth year, offering physical fitness classes daily to all sixth grade students. Approximately 24 students in each of the seventh and eighth grade participated in a Fit4Life class on a daily basis.

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Service to the community continues to be an important part of WEMS. The Beta Club participated in several philanthropic activities including care packages to soldiers in Afghanistan; collecting and donating items to Pee Dee Coalition and raising money for Pennies for Patients. We also look forward to being in a new school in the fall of 2015.②

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the Federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years. 
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


### Reading - Grade 4 (2013)




### Mathematics - Grade 4 (2013)
