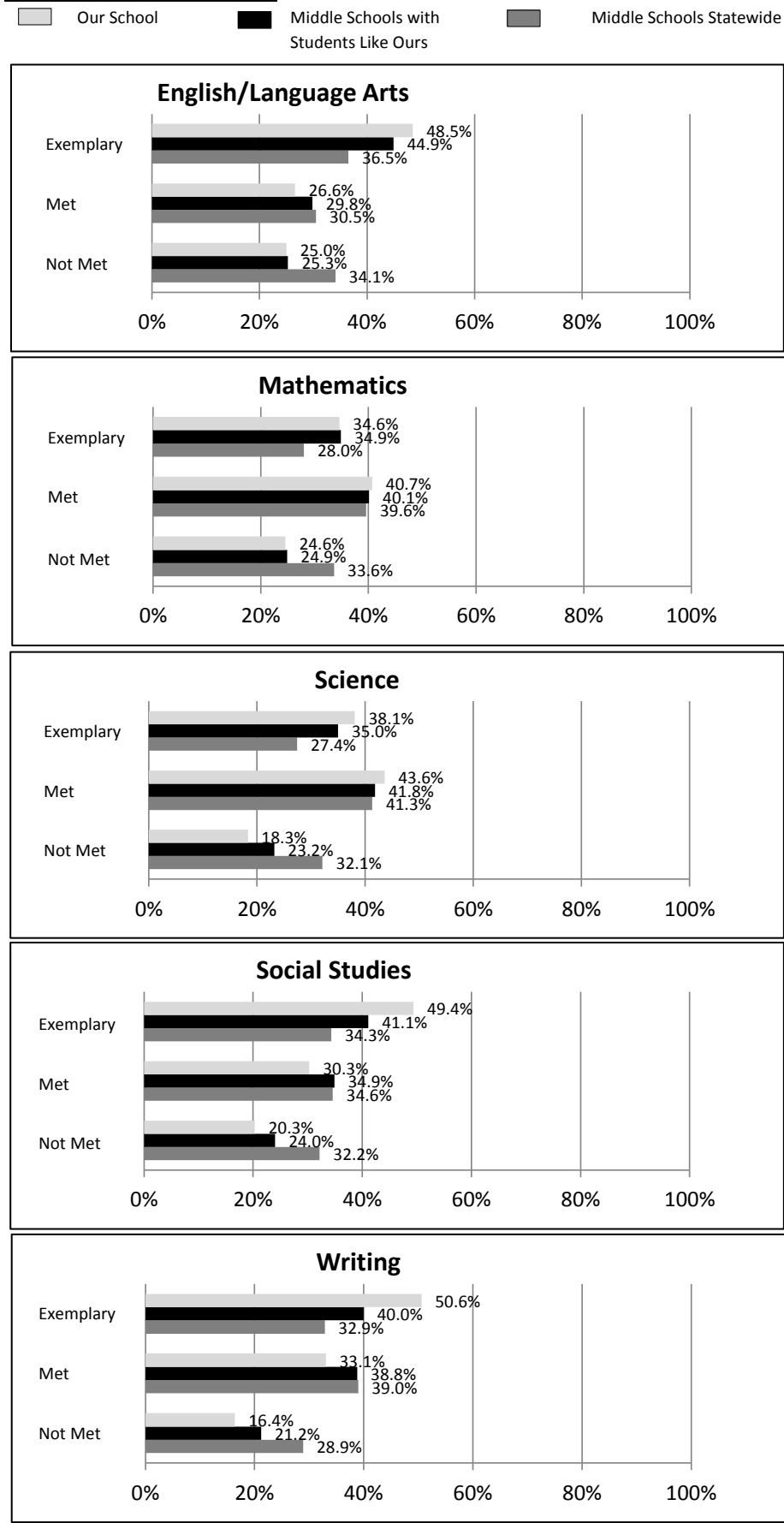

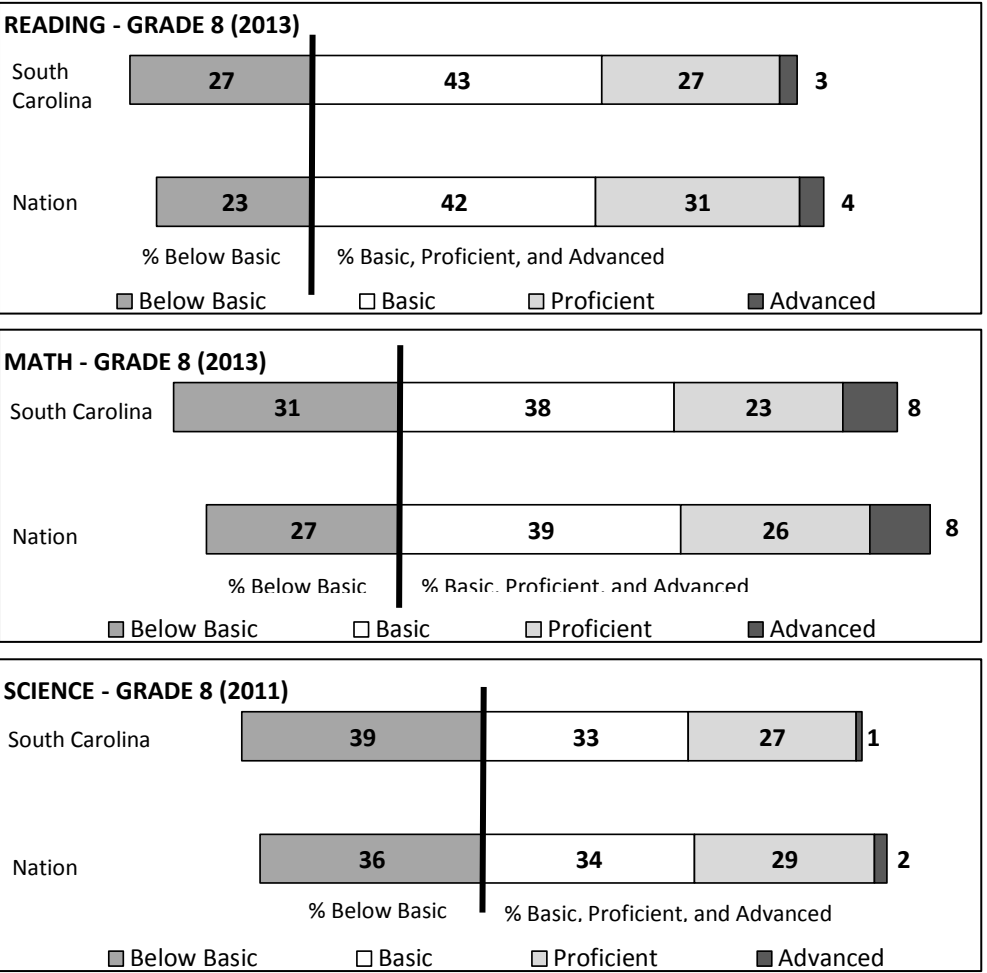

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

At the close of the 2013 -2014 school year, Glenview Middle School completed its third year as an institution of public education, serving over 680 students and their families. Glenview continues to establish its reputation in the community as an outstanding institution for student growth and excellence. Glenview received an “A” rating on the Federal Accountability Rating System, received an “Excellent” school report card rating from the South Carolina Department of Education, and was honored as a Palmetto Gold Incentive Award recipient. As a “School of Choice,” we accepted an additional 35 students to our program for the upcoming school year. Many are drawn to Glenview by our balance of excellence in academics, the arts and athletics. Glenview continues to be a leader in instructional technology by embracing “Bring Your Own Technology” in all classrooms. Teachers and students alike embraced the idea of harnessing the technology we hold in our hands to maximize our learning potential. Through collaboration, we enhance our abilities to provide the best possible 21st century education for our students. Glenview students are SOARING academically. Our students showed academic growth in Math and Reading in all grade levels on MAP testing. In addition our scores improved in Reading in all grade levels and 6th grade math above the national the national growth average. This year we had eight Duke TIP Scholars and 8 Junior Scholars. 193 students earned the Principal’s Academic Excellence Award for GPA of 4.125 or higher during a nine weeks grading period. Glenview students showcased a variety of artistic and athletic talent as well. Glenview had the only middle school student in Anderson District Five to be selected for the All-Region Band. The Glenview concert band and orchestra performed at the Carowinds music festival receiving a “Superior” rating. Band and orchestra students competed in the upstate solos and ensemble competitions and all students received either an “Excellent” or “Superior” rating. Visual Arts students displayed their work at the Anderson County Arts Center during Youth Art Month. Several students were recognized for their art work receiving an “Honorable Mention” award. Glenview Chorus students participated in the District Middle School Honors Chorus and Drama students demonstrated their theatrical talents in a production of “Alice in Wonderland.” Two of our student-athletes were selected to play in the Eastbay Youth All-American football game and our Boys Football and Basketball teams were both undefeated and conference champions. Glenview students have excellent opportunities in the arts, athletics and academics that challenge and inspire. Glenview teachers lead the district in professional development participation, each averaging 158 hours last school year. Our teachers’ participation in a professional learning community yields higher results in student achievement. In terms of professional learning, are foci have been: (1) research-based practices in instruction and assessment, (2) development of common assessments, (3) data analysis to drive student-centered instruction, and (4) the integration of technology to enhance learning experiences. Glenview educators understand how important it is to develop a partnership with families. Therefore, we have made strides to improve school to home communication including weekly phone blasts from the principal, weekly e-mails from each teacher, frequently updated websites and online gradebooks, as well as a positive communication log. Our PTO and Booster club have been instrumental in building a community culture and are integral parts of the infrastructure of Glenview Middle School. This year we cooperated with the Anderson Rotary Club to offer the “Early Act First Knight” character education program, and we teamed with Family Excellence, LLC to sponsor a community-building writing contest.
