
Our School Middle Schools with Students Like Ours Middle Schools Statewide






READING - GRADE 8 (2013)

The mission of River Oaks Middle School is to provide students with the knowledge, skills, and experiences that enable them to reach their fullest potential as independent thinkers as well as responsible and productive citizens. Nestled in a beautiful neighborhood along the Ashley River in southern Dorchester County, River Oaks Middle School was founded seven years ago on three guiding principles; Excellence, Innovation, and Relationships. The faculty and staff are dedicated to providing a safe environment in order to maximize the academic, creative, athletic, and emotional potential of each student. River Oaks Middle School offers a rigorous, relevant, and challenging curriculum that advances the learning of all students. Our students continue to progress in all academic areas as evidenced by our SCPASS data and District Benchmark data. River Oaks Middle School is the proud recipient of the 2012-2013 Palmetto Silver Award for student achievement and received an A rating on the 2012-2013 Federal Report Card.^[2]

For the 2013-2014 school year, River Oaks Middle School placed a great emphasis on health and wellness by participating in the School Health Initiative sponsored by MUSC and Boeing. A wellness committee made up of various stakeholders spearheaded our efforts to increase the overall well-being of our faculty, staff, and students. For example, we installed a walking track and volleyball court in our student recess area. We also encouraged students to drink more water and offered healthier choices during lunch and courtyard time.^[2]

Courses and after-school offerings at River Oaks are as plentiful and diverse as our student population. We offer classes in piano, guitar, dance, physical education, band, strings, steel drums, chorus, keyboarding, visual arts, and Spanish. Also, students have the opportunity to participate in National Junior Beta Club, QUEST, Robotics, Geography Bee, Dance Team, Step Team, Civil Air Patrol, and many other programs. The Bobcat honor Band and Chorus program performed at Walt Disney World. Our Robotics team had another successful year by qualifying for the state competition.^[2]

River Oaks Middle School also offers our students a chance to participate in football, volleyball, wrestling, basketball, baseball, and softball. All seven teams had a successful year with the football, volleyball, and boys' basketball teams winning district championships. The girls' basketball team finished the season as runner up in the district championship. River Oaks Middle School continues to be focused on the education of the whole child in order to prepare them for the challenges of the 21st century.^[2]
