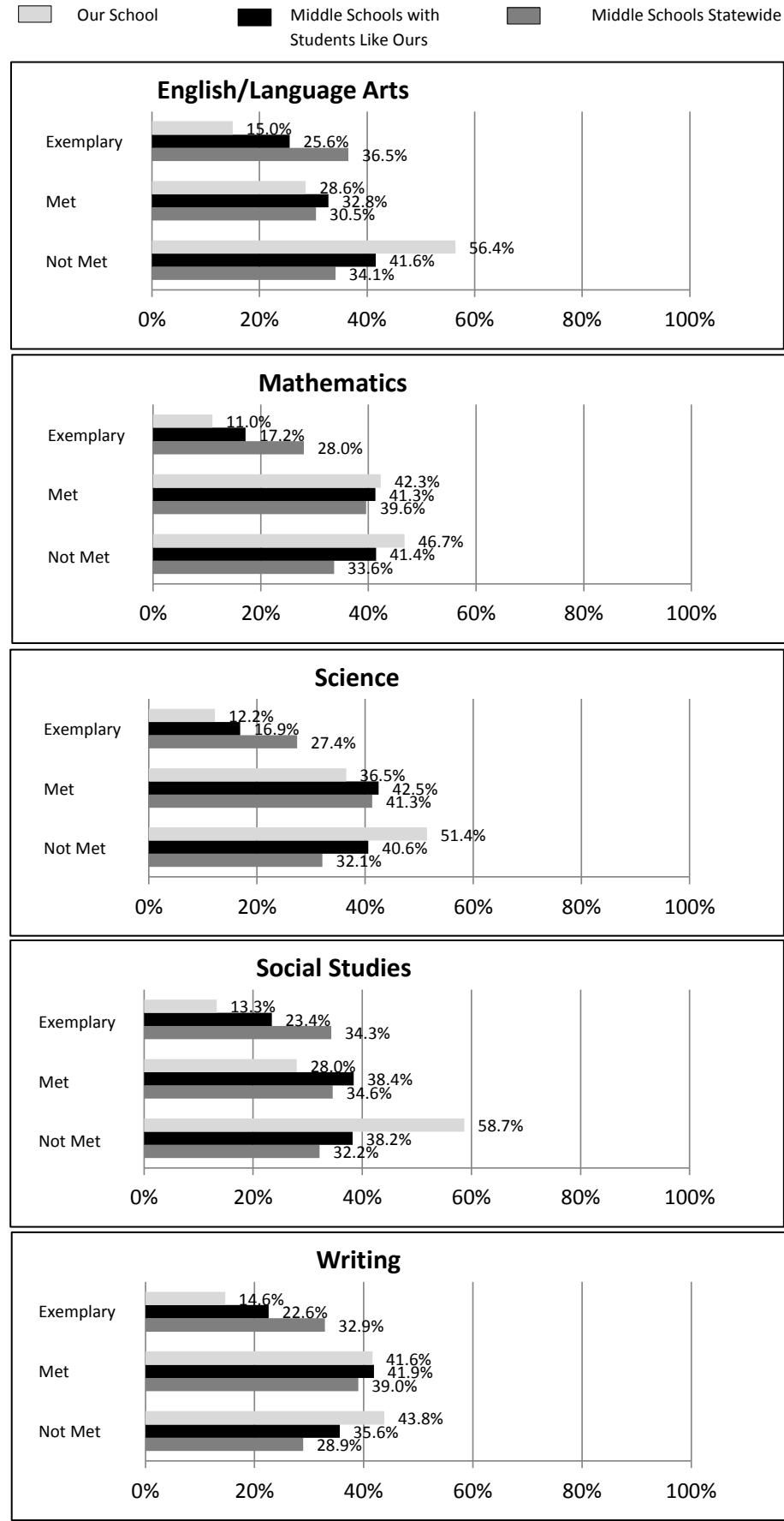

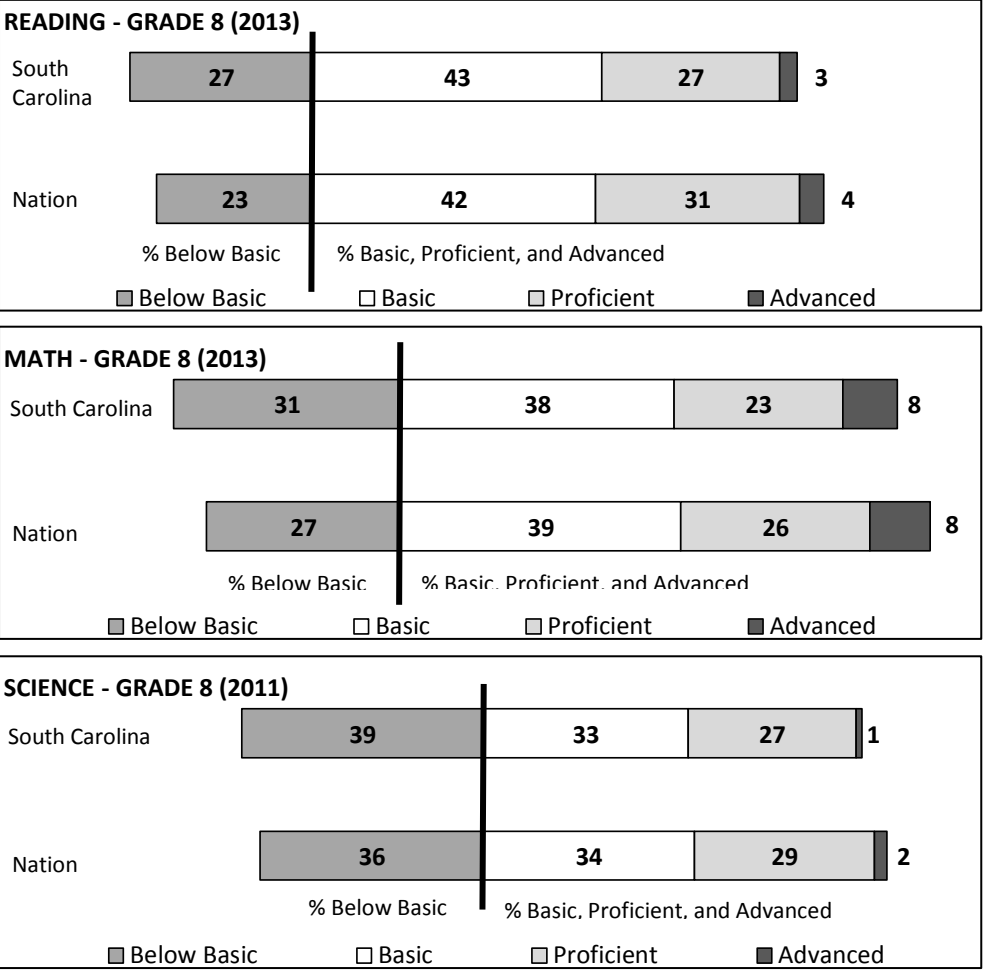

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The mission of McColl Elementary/Middle School is to educate and enable all students to achieve their highest potential. Our vision is to partner with families, businesses, and communities to develop the next generation of responsible citizens, lifelong learners, and global leaders. We are guided by seven beliefs: 1. All children can learn given opportunities that maximize their learning potential. 2. All students, parents, and staff will treat each other with respect. 3. Continuous, high-quality professional development is essential to teaching and learning. 4. A rigorous curriculum is vital to effectively develop students with critical thinking, problem solving, and real word skills. 5. A safe and orderly environment will provide diverse learning opportunities for all students. 6. A highly skilled and dedicated staff will produce responsible citizens and life-long learners. 7. All stake holders are important for the success of all students.

McColl School serves through an extended school year calendar, approximately 771 students in grades Pre-K through eight, with a certified staff of 56 and 31 support personnel. Instruction is the focus of McColl School. Through a data driven program, emphasis on Common Core curriculum, best practices, interventions, after school programs, 21st century technology, and engaged students, everyone has the opportunity to succeed.

McColl School continues to improve instructional practices through new initiatives and programs. This school year all grades were taught utilizing the Common Core and State Standards, which provided more rigorous instruction. The Read 180 program, for struggling students in grades 5 – 8, was fully implemented with significant gains recorded. The school began a new math adoption this year. Digits is the first computer based course in a core subject area. Students at risk of retention are also provided a summer school program in kindergarten and grades 6 – 8 for promotion.

Student involvement is a priority. Students were recognized in several areas of academic performance. One student was recognized as a Duke Scholar through its Talented Identification Program (TIP). Two students were recognized as Junior Scholars. Students also won awards in essay, art, and spelling and reading contests and science fairs.

A strong Parent Involvement Program provides a support for the community and the school. Parents are welcome and programs provide parenting skills to help their children succeed.

McColl School is accredited by AdvanceEd. All instructional standards are met and have received an “all clear” rating for 2013 – 14. The school was awarded the Palmetto Gold Award for General Improvement and the Palmetto Silver Award for Closing the Achievement Gap.
