Dear Parents/Guardians and Supporters of Petersburg Primary,

For the 2013-2014 school year, Petersburg Primary School embarked on an exciting journey under the leadership of a new principal with the empowering theme, "TOGETHER WE CAN!" Teachers, staff, parents, the community, and of course, our students came together to envision and work toward having a school where children's social/emotional, physical, and educational needs are met daily. We believe that our children not only CAN learn, but that they WANT to learn, and that they WILL learn when these conditions are present in a safe, loving environment.

Due to a strong literacy focus this year, our kindergarten students finished the year with only 7% reading significantly below grade level. In first grade, only 13% were at this level at the end of the year. On the Measures of Academic Progress assessment (MAP), our second grade students showed tremendous improvement from Fall to Spring testing, which indicates a greater likelihood of success on the state assessment next year.

48 of our second grade students were recognized as having earned all A's and B's for the year at a very special banquet in their honor. 22 students were also presented with Presidential Awards for Outstanding Academic Excellence or Achievement. Students were honored each nine-weeks for good citizenship, tremendous effort, honor roll, and MAP proficiency. 14 second grade students were selected by their teachers as having exceptionally notable citizenship for the year. From these nominations, three students were voted by teachers as deserving of the recognition of Citizens of the Year.

Emalee Bryant, our newly elected 2014-2015 Teacher of the Year, was selected by our school district as the Chesterfield County Teacher of the Year. We believe this is a testament as to the quality of teachers who work at Petersburg Primary.

Petersburg Primary School was a proud recipient of a Lowe's Toolbox for Education Grant this school year. With the \$5,000 we were awarded, we were able to transform the outside entrance of the school with some beautiful landscaping. This project, as much as any other this school year, was a true picture of our working together; staff, parents, community volunteers, local businesses, and students all had a part in seeing the project to completion.

Our school is also proud of our charity fundraising efforts. We feel that these initiatives help create a sense of civic responsibility in our students. This year Team Petersburg raised \$1747.40 for March of Dimes and \$6393.43 for Relay for Life. We thank all of our parents and students for helping us surpass our goals.
